

## iRecord Tile - Residential Address: Type-of-Residence Definitions

Support Coordinators (SC) must keep residential addresses up to date in iRecord. Below is a list of residence types and their definitions to help SCs select the correct **Type of Residence** on the iRecord **Residential Address** tile.

Support Coordinators can click the three lines on the Residential Address tile to enter, view, and edit the individual's address.

- **Current address**  
Enter the individual's current address here.
- **Prospective address**  
When planning a residential move, enter the prospective address here. Both current and prospective addresses will be visible. If plans change, you can edit or delete the prospective address. If the individual moves to the prospective address, check the "Make Current" box to update the current address.
- **Historical addresses**  
When you update an address, the old address is saved in the Residential Address History. If you find mistakes in the history, you may be able to edit and correct them.

Type of Residence	Definition
Acute Behavioral Health Stabilization Unit	Specialized unit within a Developmental Center or Intermediate Care Facility that provides short-term behavioral-stabilization services
Assisted Living Residence	Facility licensed by the Department of Health to provide apartment-style housing, dining, and assisted-living services ( <i>Licensed in accordance with N.J.A.C. 8:36</i> )
Behavioral Health Stabilization Home	Group home that provides a specialized, short-term residential setting and behavioral health stabilization ( <i>Licensed under N.J.A.C. 10:44A</i> )
Boarding Home	Rooming house, boarding house, or residential health-care facility licensed by the Department of Community Affairs ( <i>Licensed in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:27</i> )
Community Care Residence	Private residence where the licensee resides and provides care, services, and supports to individuals with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities ( <i>Licensed by the Department of Human Services, Office of Licensing under N.J.A.C. 10:44B</i> )
Developmental Center	Intermediate Care Facility operated by the Division of Developmental Disabilities where 24/7 care is provided to meet complex medical and behavioral needs of residents with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities
Department of Corrections	Correctional facility overseen by the NJ Department of Corrections
Department of Children and Families (DCF) Resource Family Home	Private residence where a Resource Family Parent provides temporary placement, and 24/7 support and care ( <i>Licensed through the Department of Children and Families</i> )
Emergency Capacity Services Home	Temporary housing for DDD-eligible individuals with an emergent housing need ( <i>Licensed group homes under N.J.A.C. 10:44A</i> )
Group Home	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provider-managed living arrangement where individuals with developmental disabilities live together in a home</li> <li>• Staff provides supervision, training, and/or assistance in a variety of forms and intensity, assisting residents toward independence. (<i>Licensed by the Department of Human Services, Office of Licensing in accordance with N.J.A.C. 10:44A</i>) (<i>Group Homes supporting individuals with traumatic brain injury are licensed under N.J.A.C. 10:44C.</i>)</li> </ul>

Type of Residence	Definition
Homeless Shelter	Emergency shelter for the homeless ( <i>Licensed by the Department of Community Affairs under N.J.A.C. 5:15</i> )
Hospital	Healthcare setting ( <i>Licensed by the New Jersey Department of Health</i> )
Nursing Home	Healthcare facility that provides care under medical supervision to patients who do not require the degree of care and treatment a hospital provides and who, because of their physical or mental condition, require continuous nursing care and services above the level of room and board
Own Home	Residential dwelling owned, rented, leased, or occupied by an individual, living with or without family members or other unpaid caregiver(s). This setting is not provider-managed and is not licensed.
Provider-Managed Setting - Unlicensed	<p>Provider-managed living arrangement where one or more individuals reside, whose planning team(s) determined that they do not require personal guidance, which is defined as follows:</p> <p><i>“Personal guidance is the assistance provided to an individual with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities on a daily basis in activities of daily living because he or she requires help completing such activities of daily living and/or cannot direct someone to complete such activities when physical disabilities prevent self-completion; or there is a documented health or mental health problem requiring supervision of the person for the protection of the individual or others. In the absence of a court determination, the planning team determines the need for personal guidance for each individual, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 10:44A-4.3(c).”</i></p>
Psychiatric Facility	Inpatient healthcare setting where patients with a primary psychiatric diagnosis receive comprehensive specialized care, treatment, and rehabilitation
Purchase of Care	Residential facility, typically out of state, where care is purchased through Division contract ( <i>Services and supports are provided in accordance with laws/standards of the state where the residence is located.</i> )
Respite Group Home	Provider-managed group home that provides a short-term residence for the relief of a caregiver ( <i>Licensed under N.J.A.C. 10:44A</i> )
Supervised Apartment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provider-managed living arrangement where individuals with developmental disabilities live together in an apartment</li> <li>• Staff provides supervision, guidance, and training in activities of daily living as defined by the individual's needs and goals. (<i>Licensed by the Department of Human Services, Office of Licensing in accordance with N.J.A.C. 10:44A</i>) (<i>Supervised apartments supporting individuals with traumatic brain injury are licensed under N.J.A.C. 10:44C.</i>)</li> </ul>
Unhoused	Lacking physical shelter or accommodation
