Fiscal Year 2023 Budget

- The New Jersey Fiscal Year 2023 (FY23) budget has been signed.
- Compared to FY22, the FY23 budget adds over \$110M to the Division's budget. Some areas this provides funding for are:
 - January 1, 2023 DSP and Supervisor Wage Increase.
 - Annualization of FY22 Employment/Day Rate Increases.
 - Increase to Individual Supports (Used for residential services).



Individual Supports Rate Increase

- Increase to Individual Supports (Used for residential services).
- Notice of rate increase was published on the <u>Public</u> <u>Notices</u> section of the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services website.
 - This represents a 1% increase to the following rates:
 - Base (Hourly Rate)
 - Base with Acuity (Hourly Rate)

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Individual Supports Rate Increase

- Increase to Individual Supports (Used for residential services).
 - Updated <u>rates</u> were posted on July 15, effective July 16, 2022.
 - Medicaid and IT systems were updated July 23, 2022 to reflect the new rate.
 - Adjusted prior authorizations were issued retroactive to July 16, 2022.
 - If a provider submitted a claim for services rendered after July 16th but before July 23rd it will need to recycle claims for that time period using the new prior authorizations.
 - See FY23 Individual Supports Rate Increase for detail.



Day Services Rate Increase

- On October 1, 2021, Day Services Rates were increased due to one-time funding.
- The amount of the increase was calculated using projections that did not meet actual utilization of services.
- To address this, effective July 1, 2022, the Division increased day service rates by an additional 3%.
- Notice of rate increase was published on the <u>Public</u> <u>Notices</u> section of the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services website.

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Settings Rule

- The Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services (DMAHS) is requesting Public Comment on Heightened Scrutiny Review as part of the <u>Centers for</u> <u>Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) Settings Rule</u>.
- This rule applies to settings that receive HCBS funding and requires it to provide beneficiaries full access to the benefits of integrated community living and person-centered care.
- Public comment is being sought for the sites that require Heightened Scrutiny, the tools that will be used, and the process by which the Department of Human Services is conducting this review.

Provider Ready Directory

- The Division utilized a Request for Letters of Interest ("RLI") process to develop a Provider Ready Directory (PRD) in 2020/2021.
- The PRD includes Division/Medicaid providers who are readily available to assume service delivery for residential and/or day agencies in the event that a provider is no longer able to do so.
- The Division is reminding eligible providers that a provider can be added to the PRD at any time through the RLI process. Please see the below links for more information and apply if interested.

988 National Suicide Prevention Lifeline

- <u>988</u> is now available for call, text, or chat to those experiencing a mental health-related or suicidal crisis, or those looking to help a loved one through a crisis.
- The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline continues to be available to persons of all abilities, including those with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) and traumatic brain injury (TBI).
- The Division of Developmental Disabilities, and other governmental Departments, have worked with 988 to provide disability specific service information and other available resources.
- This will equip 988 to meet the presenting need of the caller and, as appropriate, connect them with other appropriate resources depending on their unique needs.



988 National Suicide Prevention Lifeline

- Providers rendering services to persons with IDD and/or TBI are reminded that 988 is distinct from 911.
- Under <u>Danielle's Law P.L. 2003, c.191</u>, 911 must continue to be called in any situation where a prudent person could reasonably believe a life threatening emergency exists. More information can be found <u>here</u>.
