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DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS APRIL 2017

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of April, the TANF caseload had decreased by 5,659 cases, from 22,605 in April 2016 to 16,946 in April 2017, a decrease of 25.0%.
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since April 2016 were Ocean (-35.5%), Cape May (-44.7%) and Hunterdon (-47.4%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 5,416 or 32.0% were child-only in April 2017.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (787), Camden (771) and Passaic (553).
- Essex (7,413), Passaic (5,567), Camden (5,376), Hudson (4,666) and Atlantic (3,268) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in April 2017.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In April 2017, there were 401,296 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 36,273 or 8.3%, since April 2016.
- There were 801,478 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of April 2017, a decrease of 68,084 or 7.8% since April 2016.
- The counties having the highest caseload decrease since April 2016 are Burlington (-14.3%), Cape May (-11.3%) and Cumberland (-10.5%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 2,078 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in April 2017, a decrease of 1,023 or 33.0% since April 2016.
- In April 2017, EA payments were made for 440 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 2,411 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in April 2017, a decrease of 828 or 25.6% since April 2016.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in emergency assistance payments were Hudson (5.1%), Middlesex (21.6%) and Somerset (38.3%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in emergency assistance payments were Mercer (-54.9%), Cumberland (-57.1%) and Monmouth (-66.7%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 19,597 to 14,756 since April 2016, a decrease of 24.7%.
- There were 6,273 Employable GA and 8,483 Unemployable GA cases in April 2017.
- The county that showed a percent increase for GA cases since April 2016 was Somerset (12.4%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since April 2016 were Atlantic (-29.1%), Bergen (-29.9%) and Passaic (-35.6%).
- In April 2017, GA cases showed a 2.6 percent decrease since March 2017.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$332 million from January 2017 to March 2017, a decrease of 1.0 percent over the same period for FFY 2016.
- Total distributions decreased 0.1% from March 2016.


WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of April 2017, there were 1,675 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 316 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (413), Camden (245) and Passaic (180).
- There were 2,790 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period Ending With APRIL 2017








ACRONYMS

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
