Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of April, the TANF caseload had increased by 405 cases, from 10,830 in April 2019 to 11,235 in April 2020, an increase of 3.7%.

- The counties with caseloads that increased the most since April 2019 were Middlesex (21.2%), Somerset (34.5%) and Hunterdon (87.5%).

- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since April 2019 were Sussex (-7.5%), Passaic (-9.5%) and Essex (-9.7%).

- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 3,621 or 32.2% were child-only in April 2020.

- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (580), Essex (419) and Hudson (393).

- Essex (4,329), Hudson (4,111), Camden (3,730), Passaic (2,782) and Atlantic (1,857) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in April 2020.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In April 2020, there were 348,149 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 1,194 or 0.3%, since April 2019.

- There were 682,839 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of April 2020, a decrease of 3,889 or -0.6% since April 2019.

- The counties having the highest caseload increase since April 2019 are Warren (8.9%), Somerset (9.1%) and Sussex (10.8%).

- The counties having the highest caseload decrease since April 2019 are Essex (-1.8%), Warren (-2.9%) and Burlington (-3.6%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 1,455 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in April 2020, a decrease of 91 or -5.9% since April 2019.

- In April 2020, EA payments were made for 390 SSI recipients.

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- There were 1,768 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in April 2020, a decrease of 397 or -18.3% since April 2019.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Somerset (20.5%), Ocean 25.5%) and Monmouth (120.7%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Gloucester (-41.9%), Cumberland (-43.8%) and Middlesex (-58.6%).

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has increased from 10,475 to 11,449 since April 2019, an increase of 9.3%.
- There were 5,587 Employable GA and 5,862 Unemployable GA cases in April 2020.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Sussex (45.7%), Somerset (46.1%) and Salem (51.9%) since April 2019.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since April 2019 were Middlesex (-4.3%), Morris (-8.9%) and Bergen (-10.1%).
- In April 2020, GA cases showed a 5.4% increase since March 2020.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$308 million from January 2020 to March 2020, a decrease of -1.1 percent over the same period for FFY 2019.
- Total distributions decreased -1.5% from March 2019.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)


- During the report month of April 2020, there were 680 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 108 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (123), Camden (100) and Hudson (76).
- There were 800 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

APRIL 2018 THROUGH APRIL 2020








Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period










ACRONYMS

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
