Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of August, the TANF caseload had decreased by 2,055 cases, from 12,795 in August 2018 to 10,740 in August 2019, a decrease of 16.1%.

- The county with caseloads that increased the most since July 2018 was Ocean (0.3%).

- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since July 2018 were Hunterdon (-23.5%), Atlantic (-28.2%) and Sussex (-34.8%).

- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 3,723 or 34.7% were child-only in August 2019.

- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (614), Essex (452) and Passaic (396).

- Essex (4,367), Camden (3,495), Hudson (3,471), Passaic (2,893) and Atlantic (1,663) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in August 2019.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In August 2019, there were 346,954 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 20,130 or 5.5%, since August 2018.

- There were 686,263 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of July 2019, a decrease of 45,040 or 6.2% since August 2018.

- The counties having the highest caseload decrease since August 2018 are Cumberland (-7.2%), Hudson (-7.2%), Atlantic (9.8%) and Somerset (-11.7%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 1,673 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in August 2019, an increase of 50 or 3.1% since August 2018.

- In August 2019, EA payments were made for 571 SSI recipients.

- There were 2,095 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in August 2019, an increase of 91 or 4.5% since August 2018.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Hunterdon (96.2%), Cumberland (137.5%) and Monmouth (250.0%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Essex (-18.9%), Atlantic (-21.4%) and Cape May (-22.1%).

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 12,194 to 10,609 since August 2018, a decrease of 13.0%.
- There were 4,348 Employable GA and 6,261 Unemployable GA cases in August 2019.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Sussex (12.9%), Warren (13.4%) and Hunterdon (51.2%) since August 2018.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since August 2018 were Salem (-24.4%), Cape May (-26.3%) and Hudson (-33.6%).
- In August 2019, GA cases showed a 4.8% increase since July 2019.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$322 million from April 2019 to June 2019, a decrease of 0.6 percent over the same period for FFY 2018.
- Total distributions decreased 1.5% from June 2018.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of August 2019, there were 966 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 146 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (246), Camden (124) and Hudson (99).
- There were 1,019 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.



AUGUST 2017 THROUGH AUGUST 2019**








Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period





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

AUGUST 2019 by County








ACRONYMS

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
