CURRENT PROGRAM Statistics

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of August, the TANF caseload had increased by 1,098 cases, from 10,740 in August 2019 to 11,838 in August 2020, an inecrease of 10.2%.
- The counties with caseloads that increased the most since August 2019 were Somerset (31.6%), Hudson (44.4%) and Hunterdon (100.0%).
- •The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since August 2019 were Gloucester (-3.6%), Salem (-3.6%), Cumberland (-5.5%) and Morris (-14.6%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 3,665 or 31.0% were child-only in August 2020.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (585), Hudson (454) and Essex (422).
- Hudson (5,160), Essex (4,531), Camden (3,791), Passaic (3,001) and Atlantic (1,893) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in August 2020.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In August 2020, there were 384,337 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 37,383 or 10.8%, since August 2019.
- There were 748,349 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of August 2020, an increase of 62,086 or 9.0% since August 2019.
- The counties having the highest caseload increase since August 2019 are Somerset (18.2%), Warren (19.9%) and Hudson (25.3%).
- The county having the highest caseload decrease since August 2019 was Gloucester (-1.0%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 1,623 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in August 2020, a decrease of 50 or -3.0% since August 2019.
- In August 2020, EA payments were made for 550 SSI recipients.

- There were 2,063 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in August 2020, a decrease of 32 or -1.5% since August 2019.
 - The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Middlesex (31.8%), Somerset (45.1%) and Camden (49.3%).
 - The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Sussex (-50.0%), Gloucester (-65.2%) and Monmouth (-76.2%).

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has increased from 10,609 to 13,380 since August 2019, an increase of 26.1%.
- There were 8,119 Employable GA and 5,261 Unemployable GA cases in August 2020.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Cape May (55.9%), Hudson (98.8%) and Salem (105.6%) since August 2019.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since August 2019 were Bergen (-3.1%), Morris (-11.0%) Hunterdon (-23.1%).
- In August 2020, GA cases showed a -1.0% decrease since July 2020.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$359 million from April 2020 to June 2020, an increase of 11.6 percent over the same period for FFY 2019.
- Total distributions increased 10.9% from June 2019.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of August 2020, there were 350 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 70 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Hudson (60), Essex (46) and Camden (40).
- There were 750 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.













ACRONYMS

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.
