

## DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS DECEMBER 2007

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, Food Stamps, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance (GA) and Child Support and Paternity. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider.

#### WFNJ/TANF

- At the end of December, the TANF caseload decreased by 1,766 cases, from 40,381 in December 2006 to 38,615 in December 2007, a 4.4% decline.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since December 2007 include Ocean (5.4%), Bergen (4.4%), and Cape May (4.2%).
- The counties that decreased the most since December 2006 were Burlington (-8.9%), Hunterdon (-13.6%) and Warren (-16.4%)
- Of the WFNJ/TANF families, 10,188 or 26.4% were child-only cases in December 2007
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,869), Hudson (1,493), and Camden (1,260).
- Essex (23,092), Hudson (13,274), and Camden (10,508) counties have the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in December 2007.

#### **FOOD STAMP PROGRAM**

- December 2007 there are 204,799 households receiving food stamps. Food Stamp households increased by 7,626, or 3.9%, since December 2006.
- There were 422,951 persons receiving food stamps as of December 2007, an increase of 14,262 or 3.5 % since December 2006.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since December 2006 are Hunterdon (15.9%), Morris (13.7%), and Cape May (13.4%)

#### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 4,837 families receiving emergency assistance (EA) in December 2007, a decrease of 226 or -4.5% since December 2006.
- In December 2007, EA payments were made for 1,486 SSI recipients

## DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS DECEMBER 2007

#### **GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

#### GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 6,962 emergency assistance payments made to GA recipients in December 2007, an increase of 495 or 7.7% since December 2006.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Salem (101.5%), Hunterdon (64.7%), and Morris (39.8%).

#### **GA Program**

- The total numbers of persons for GA has increased from 36,535 to 38,880 since December 2006, an increase of 6.4%.
- There were 22,371 Employable GA and 16,509 Unemployable GA recipients in December 2007.
- Morris (28.0%), Ocean (24.3%), and Cumberland (18.3%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA persons since December 2006.

#### CHILD SUPPORT AND PATERNITY (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support and Paternity Program was about 270 million dollars from October 2007 to December 2007, an increase of 4.3 percent over the same period for FFY 2007.
- Total distributions increased over 4 percent from December 2006, and a slight decrease in the percent of collections distributed from 97.6% in December 2006 to 97.1% in December 2007.


#### **WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of December 2007, there were 4,892 families where at least one member is employed and an additional 660 families where WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active recipients were: Essex (1,152), Hudson (629), and Camden (545).
- There were 4,460 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





Note: TANF Work Participation Rates (WPRs) for Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2008 (beginning October 2007) are not yet available for publication. Owing to early implementation issues with the eTimesheet application now used to track nearly all activity other than paid employment, the WPR figures currently available do not accurately reflect actual participation levels achieved in the initial months of FFY 2008. As can be expected with the introduction of a new system component such as the eTimesheet, numerous end-users have encountered some initial difficulties in adjusting to the new applications. Accordingly, publication of TABLES 3 and 4 is being temporarily deferred. Future editions of the Current Program Statistics will include the updated WPR figures for all completed months within FFY 2008.





## Total Food Stamp Recipients DECEMBER 2007 By County




#### **ACRONYMS**

ACSES: Automated Child Support Enforcement System

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if the eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**FOOD STAMP PROGRAM (FS)** - Authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA establishes Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. The emphasis is on achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.
