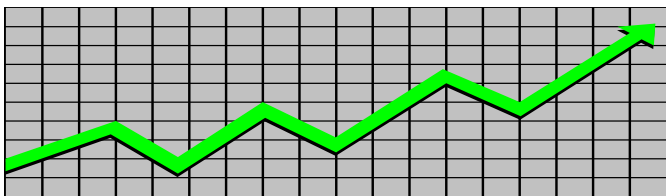

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## **DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS FEBRUARY 2017**

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

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### **WFNJ/TANF**

- As of the end of February, the TANF caseload had decreased by 5,557 cases, from 23,513 in February 2016 to 17,956 in February 2017, a decrease of 23.6%.
- The county where the family caseload percentage increased since February 2016 was Warren (11.3%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since February 2016 were Ocean (-36.0%), Cape May (-36.4%) and Hunterdon (-38.5%) .
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 5,591 or 31.1% were child-only in February 2017.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (830), Camden (783) and Passaic (585).
- Essex (7,889), Passaic (5,950), Camden (5,672), Hudson (4,931) and Atlantic (3,425) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in February 2017.

### **NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In February 2017, there were 405,529 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 32,393 or 7.4%, since February 2016.
- There were 809,587 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of February 2017, a decrease of 58,261 or 6.7% since February 2016.
- The counties having the highest caseload decrease since February 2016 are Burlington (-13.3%), Atlantic (-11.3%) and Salem (-11.3%).

### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 2,212 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in February 2017, a decrease of 1,194 or 35.1% since February 2016.
- In February 2017, EA payments were made for 423 SSI recipients.

**GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

**GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 2,373 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in February 2017, a decrease of 953 or 28.7% since February 2016.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in emergency assistance payments were Middlesex (15.1%), Salem (18.2%) and Somerset (24.6%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in emergency assistance payments were Burlington (-56.0%), Ocean (-57.9%) and Monmouth (-73.6%).

**GA Program**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 20,328 to 15,102 since February 2016, a decrease of 25.7%.
- There were 6,433 Employable GA and 8,669 Unemployable GA cases in February 2017.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since February 2016 were Burlington (-32.9%), Atlantic (-35.4%) and Passaic (-43.5%).
- In February 2017, GA cases showed a 1.4 percent decrease since January 2017.

**CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)**

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$312 million from October 2016 to December 2016, a decrease of 2.5 percent over the same period for FFY 2016.
- Total distributions decreased 1.9% from December 2015.

**WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

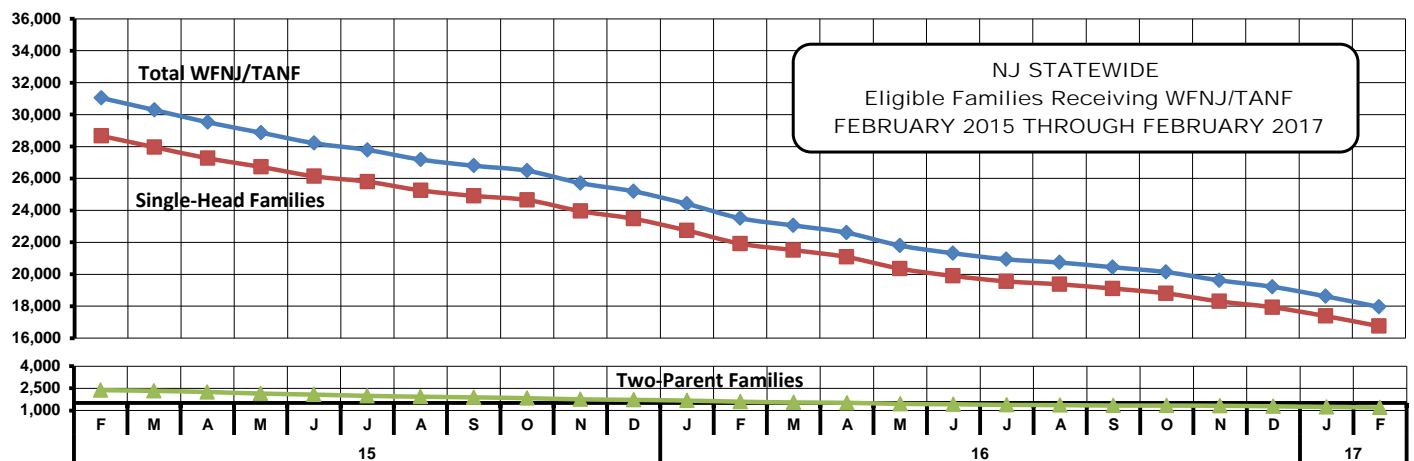
- During the report month of February 2017, there were 1,714 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 345 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (427), Camden (256) and Passaic (199).
- There were 3,329 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

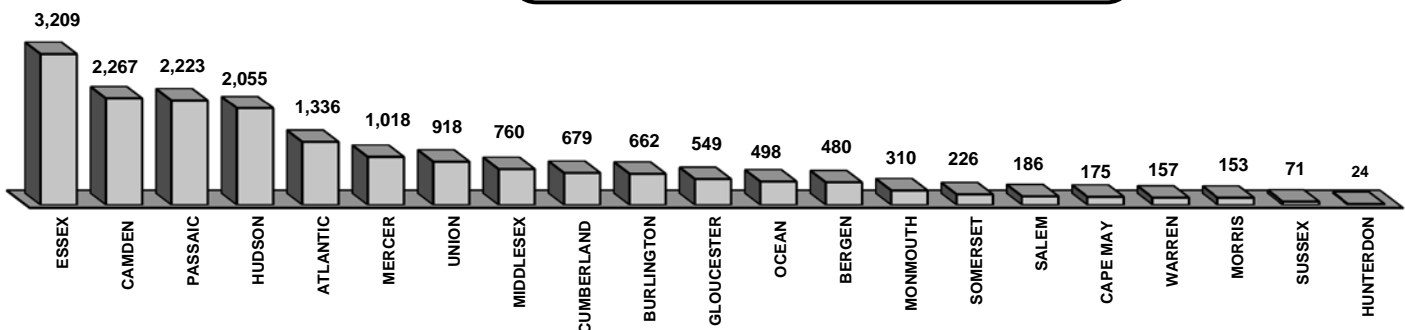

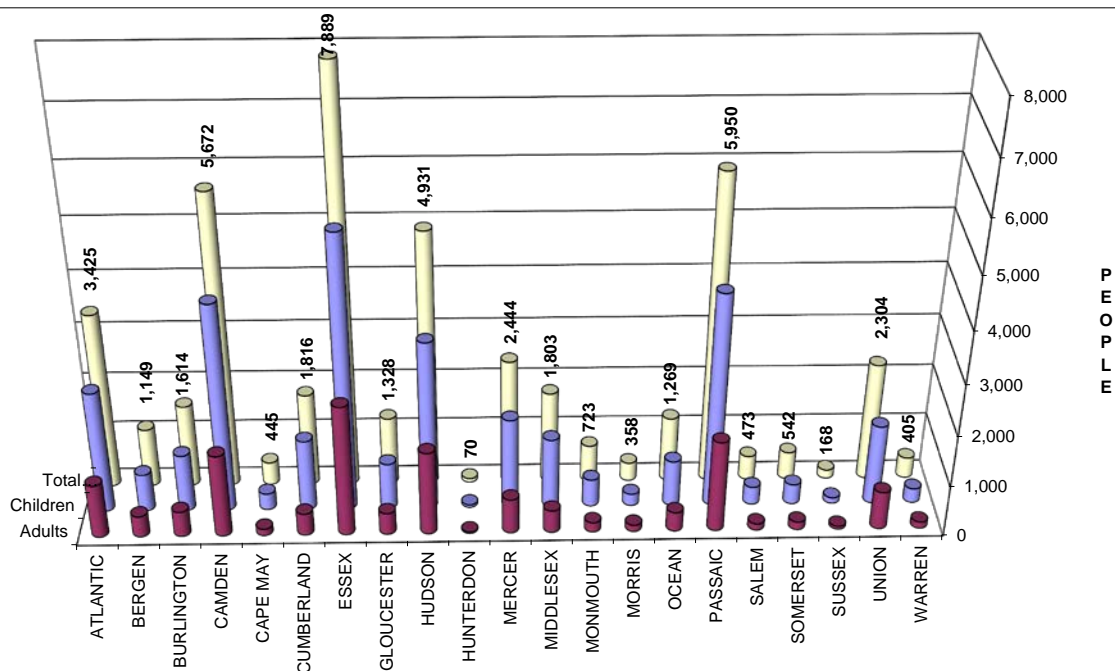

Ending With FEBRUARY 2017**

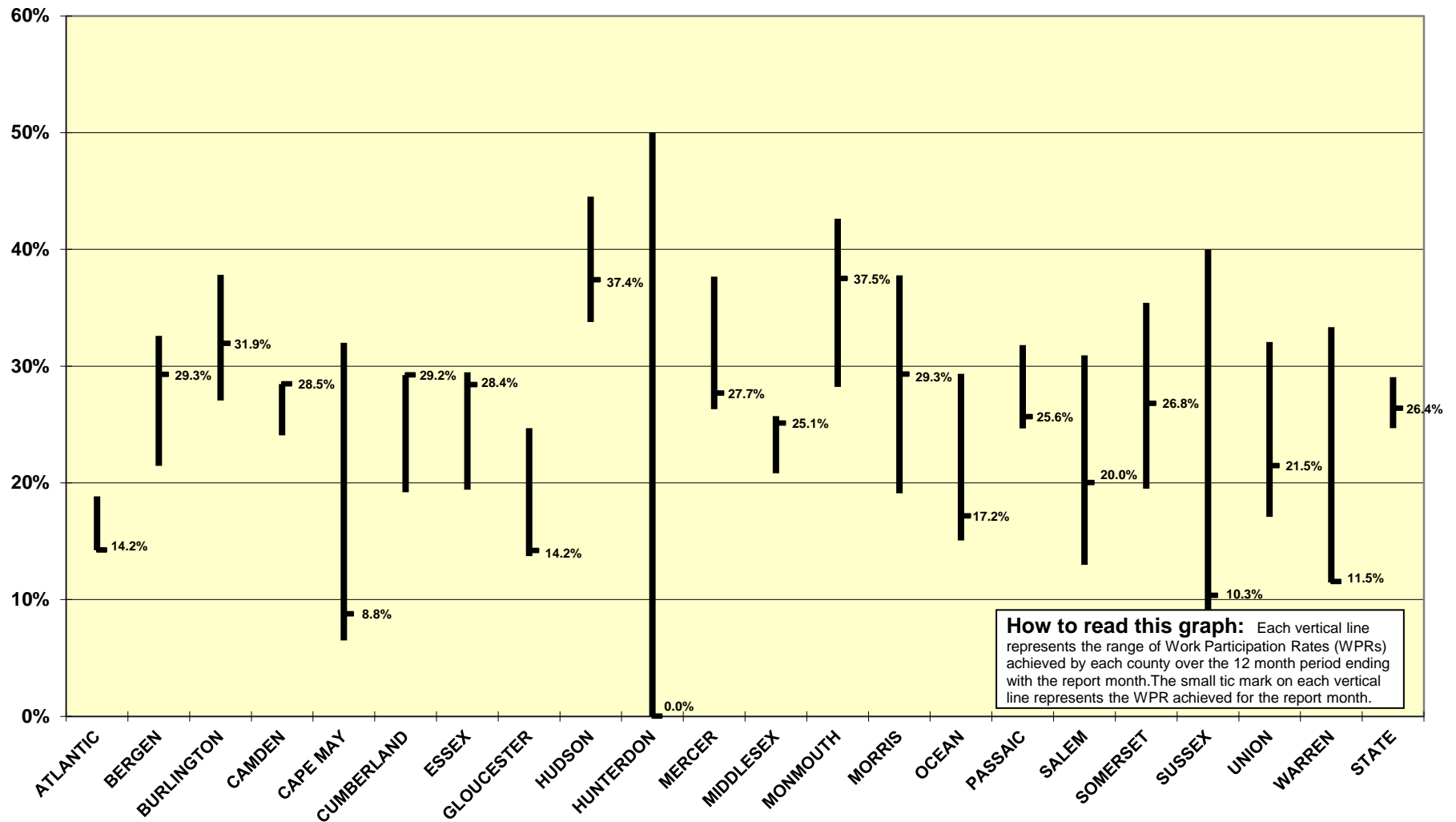
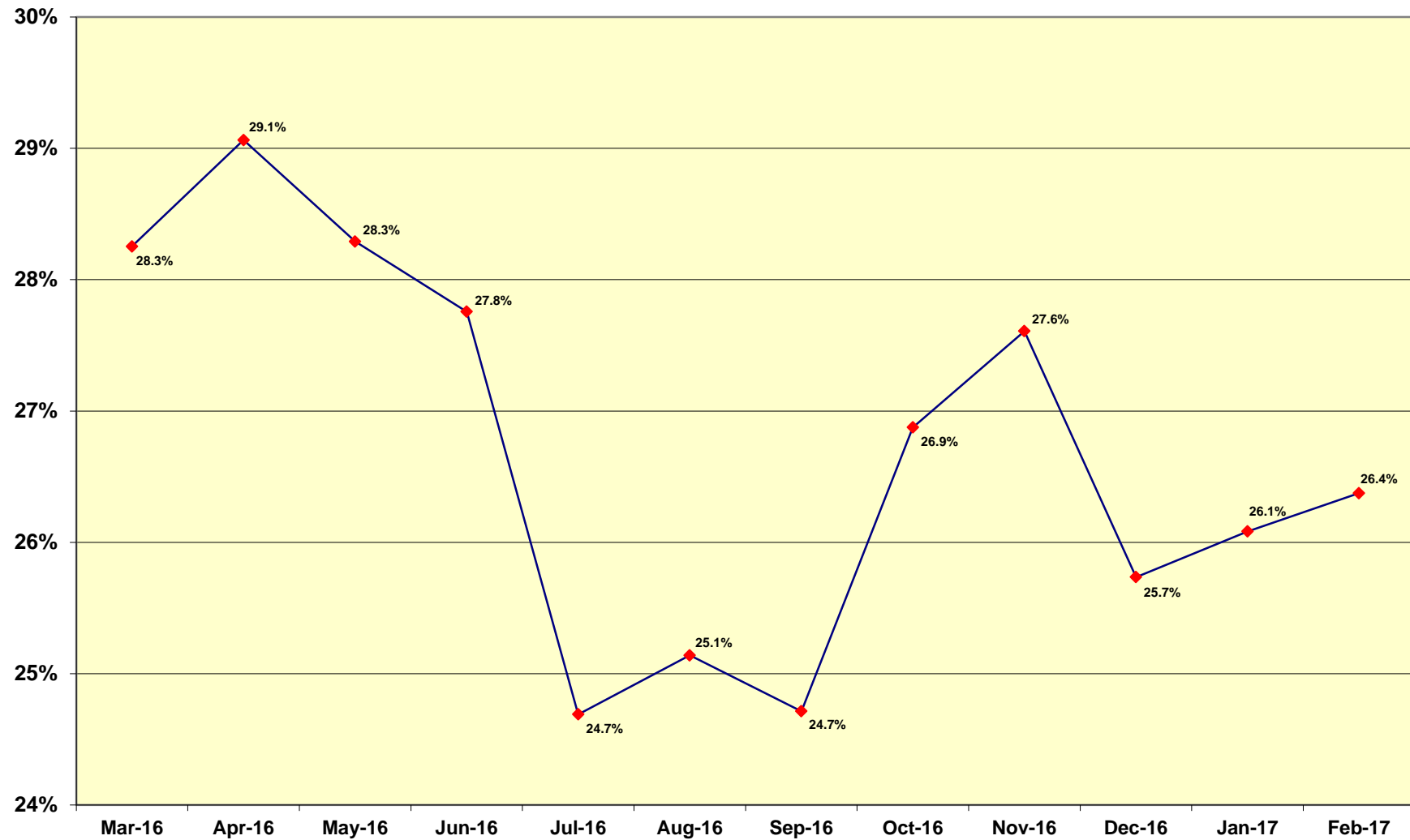

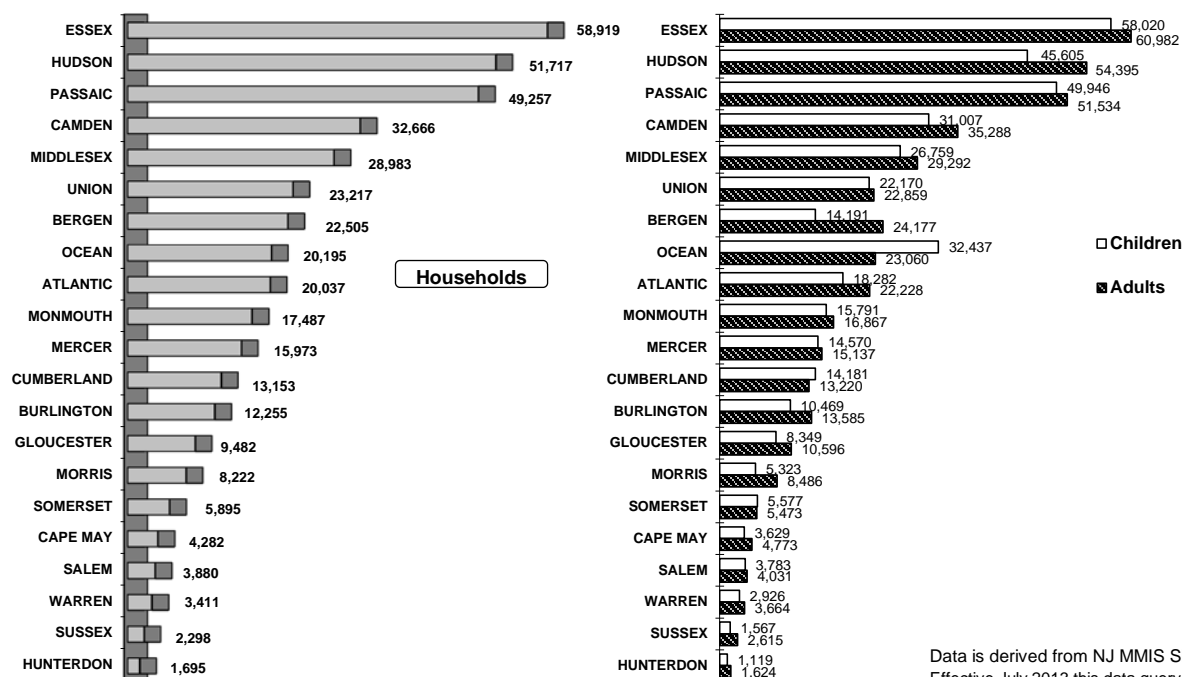

## **ACRONYMS**

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**NJKIDS:** New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE:** The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA:** Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
