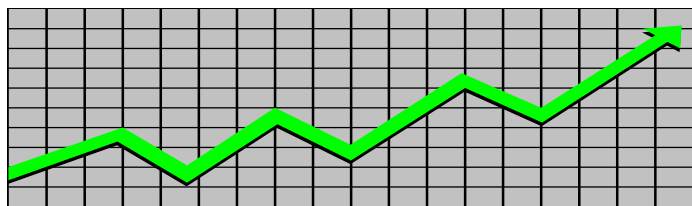

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DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS FEBRUARY 2020

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of February, the TANF caseload had decreased by 348 cases, from 11,166 in February 2019 to 10,818 in February 2020, a decrease of -3.1%.
- The counties with caseloads that increased the most since February 2019 were Somerset (12.4%), Ocean (14.9%) and Hunterdon (35.7%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since February 2019 were Warren (-9.9%), Passaic (-13.6%) and Sussex (-14.9%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 3,669 or 33.9% were child-only in February 2020.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (605), Essex (436) and Hudson (371).
- Essex (4,538), Camden (3,669), Hudson (3,332), Passaic (2,859) and Atlantic (1,855) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in February 2020.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In February 2020, there were 336,713 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 1,253 or 0.4%, since February 2019.
- There were 661,194 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of February 2020, an increase of 3,361 or 0.5% since February 2019.
- The counties having the highest caseload increase since February 2019 are Camden (10.7%), Cumberland (10.8%) and Mercer (13.5%).
- The counties having the highest caseload decrease since February 2019 are Passaic (-2.7%), Monmouth (-3.3%) and Hudson (-3.7%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 1,600 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in February 2020, an increase of 210 or 15.1% since February 2019.
- In February 2020, EA payments were made for 571 SSI recipients.

FEBRUARY 2020**

- There were 2,007 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in February 2020, an increase of 108 or 5.7% since February 2019.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Hunterdon (82.4%), Monmouth (82.9%) and Salem (300.0%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Bergen (-13.5%), Morris (-18.5%) and Cumberland (-38.5%).

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 10,510 to 10,134 since February 2019, a decrease of -3.6%.
- There were 4,206 Employable GA and 5,928 Unemployable GA cases in February 2020.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Somerset (35.3%), Cape May (44.4%) and Sussex (46.7%) since February 2019.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since February 2019 were Salem (-12.1%), Morris (-18.0%) and Bergen (-22.3%).
- In February 2020, GA cases showed a 1.1% increase since January 2020.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$304 million from October 2019 to December 2019, a decrease of -1.2 percent over the same period for FFY 2019.
- Total distributions decreased -1.6% from December 2018.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

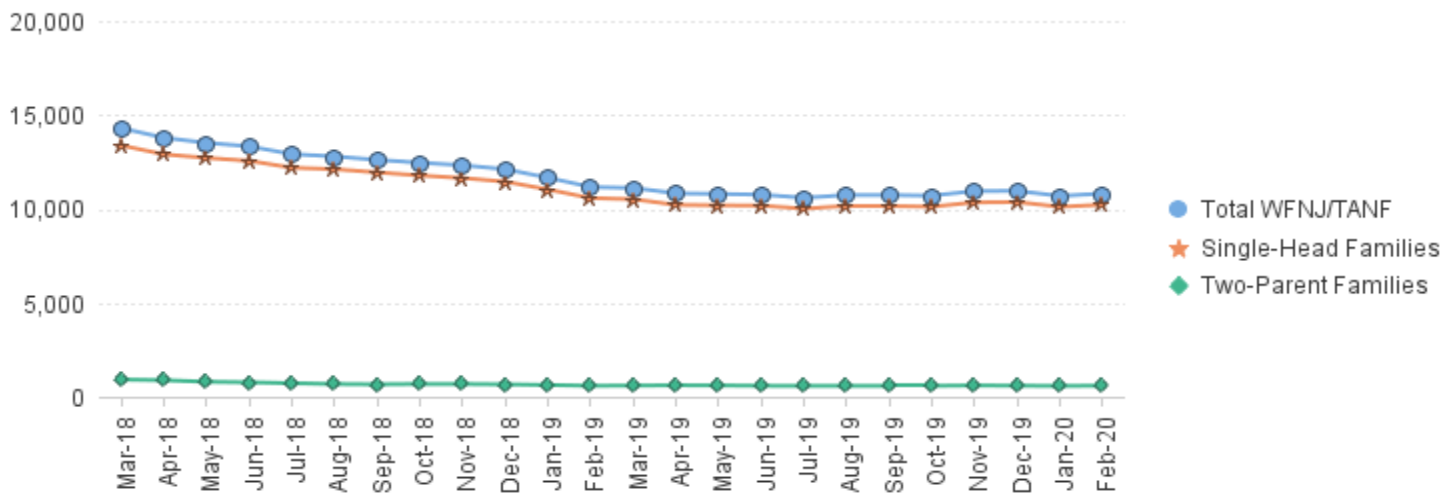
- During the report month of February 2020, there were 1,004 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 137 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (218), Camden (131) and Hudson (115).
- There were 885 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

MARCH 2018 THROUGH FEBRUARY 2020



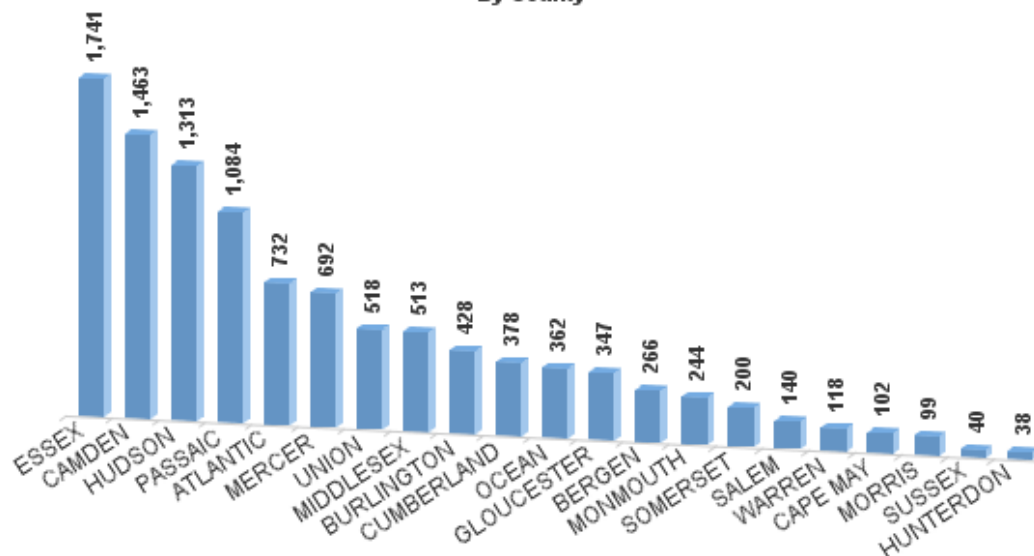

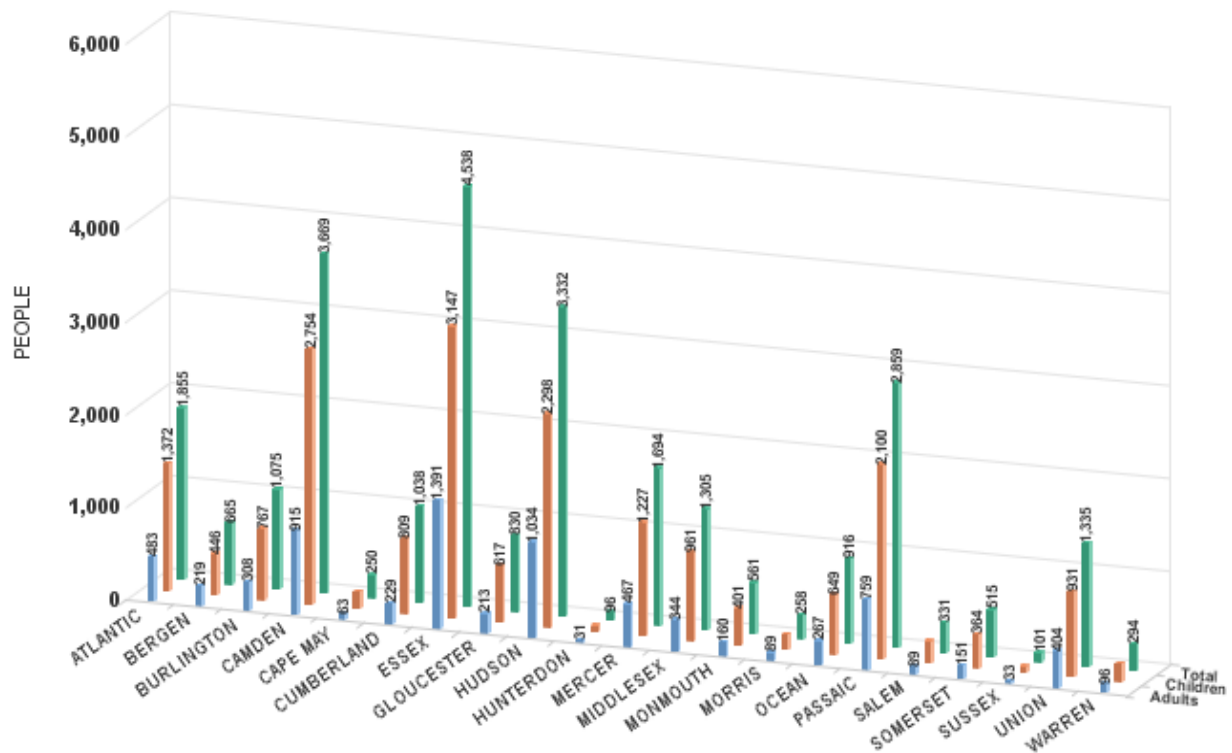

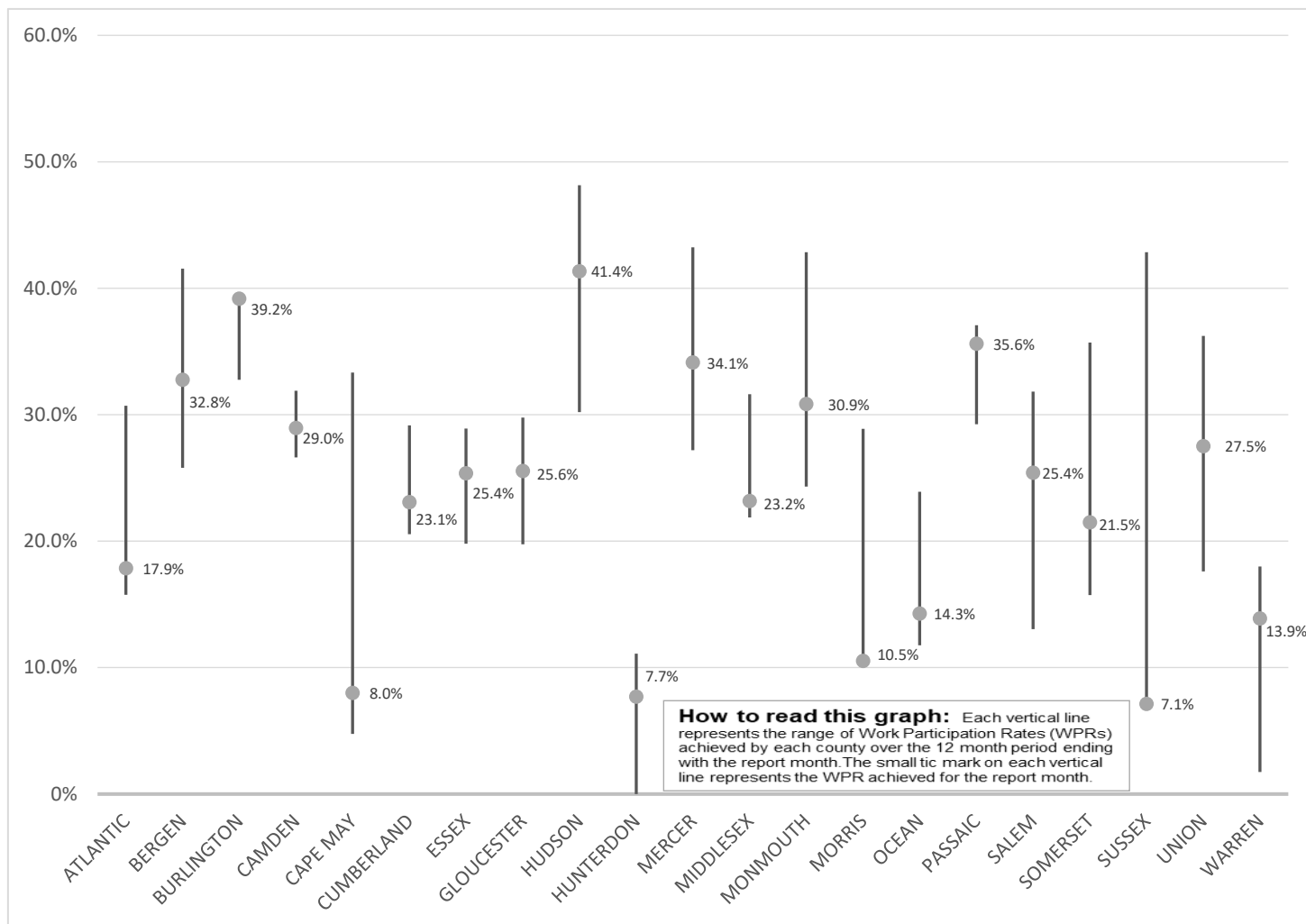

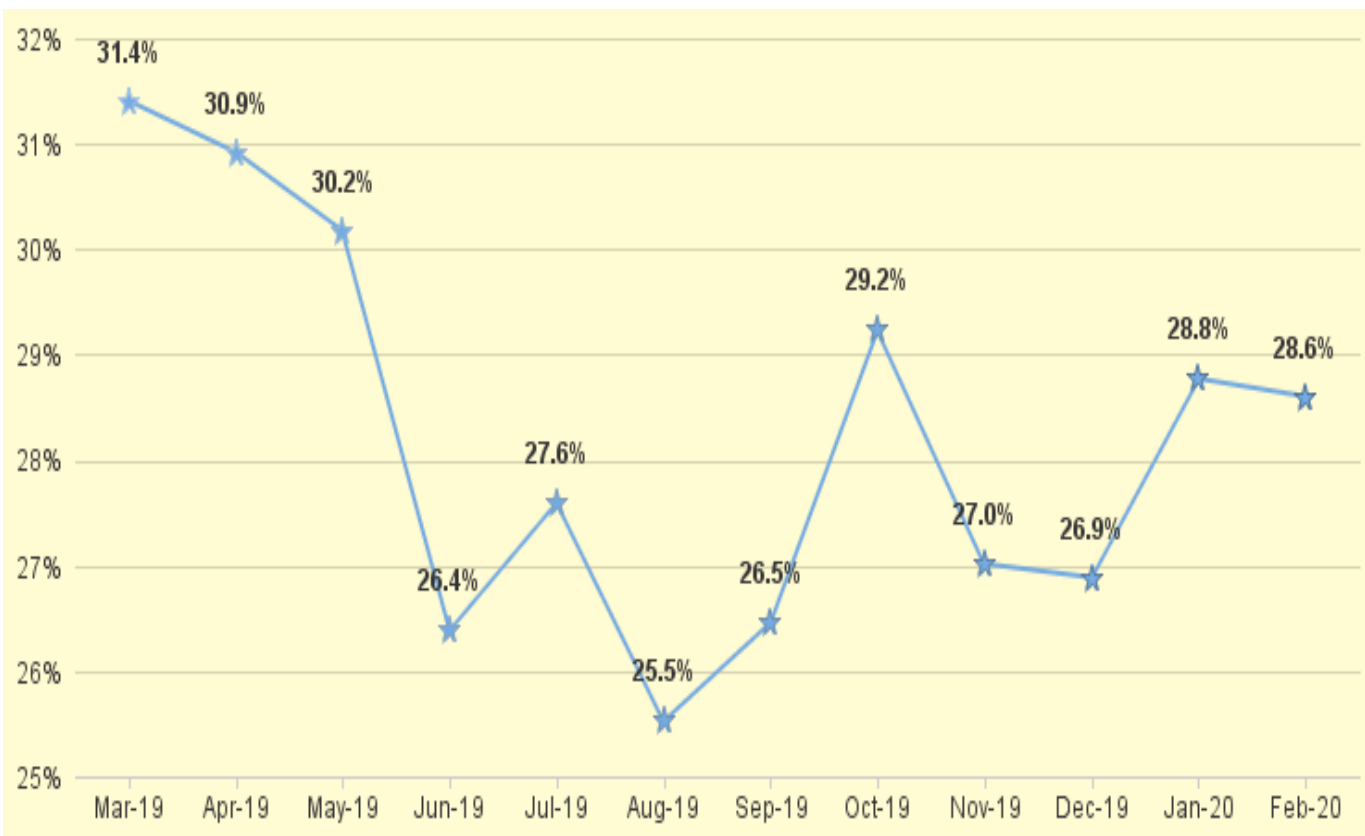
**Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period

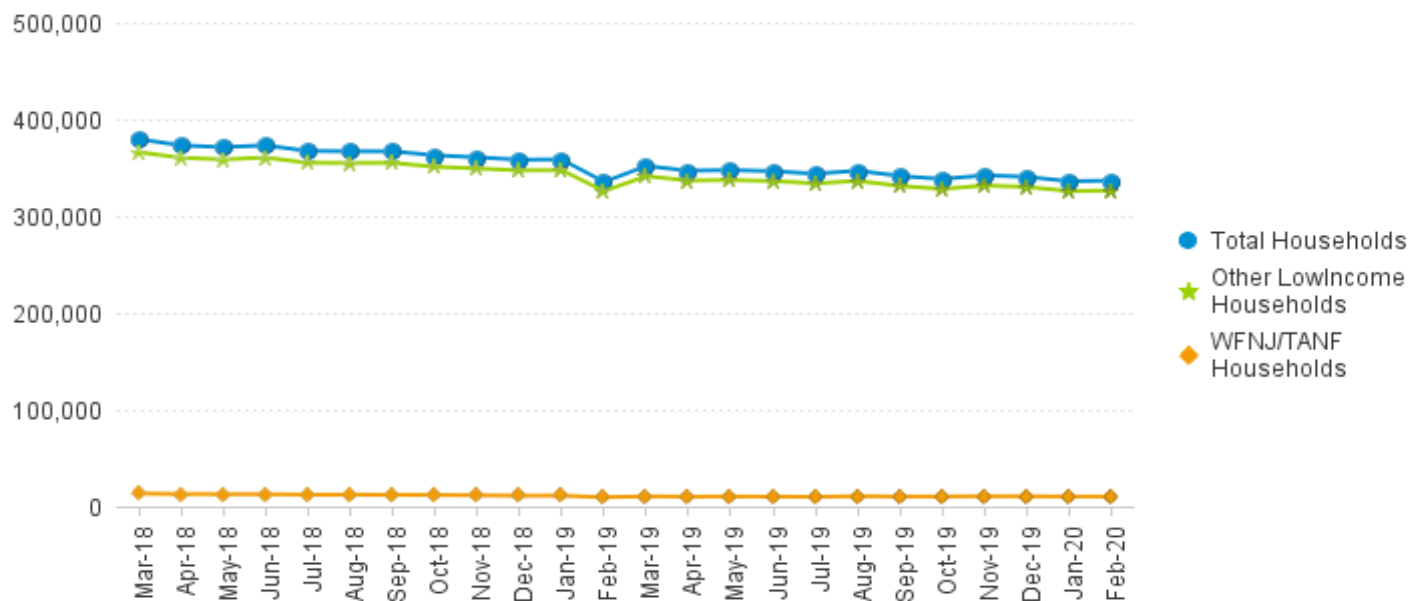
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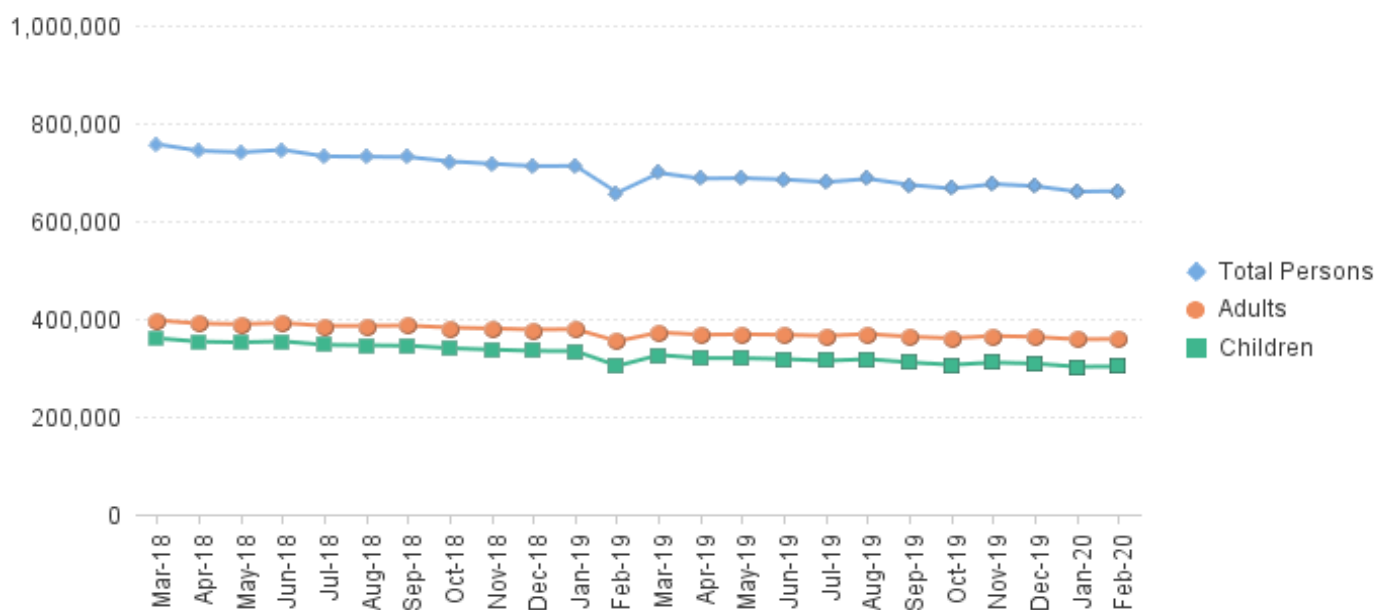

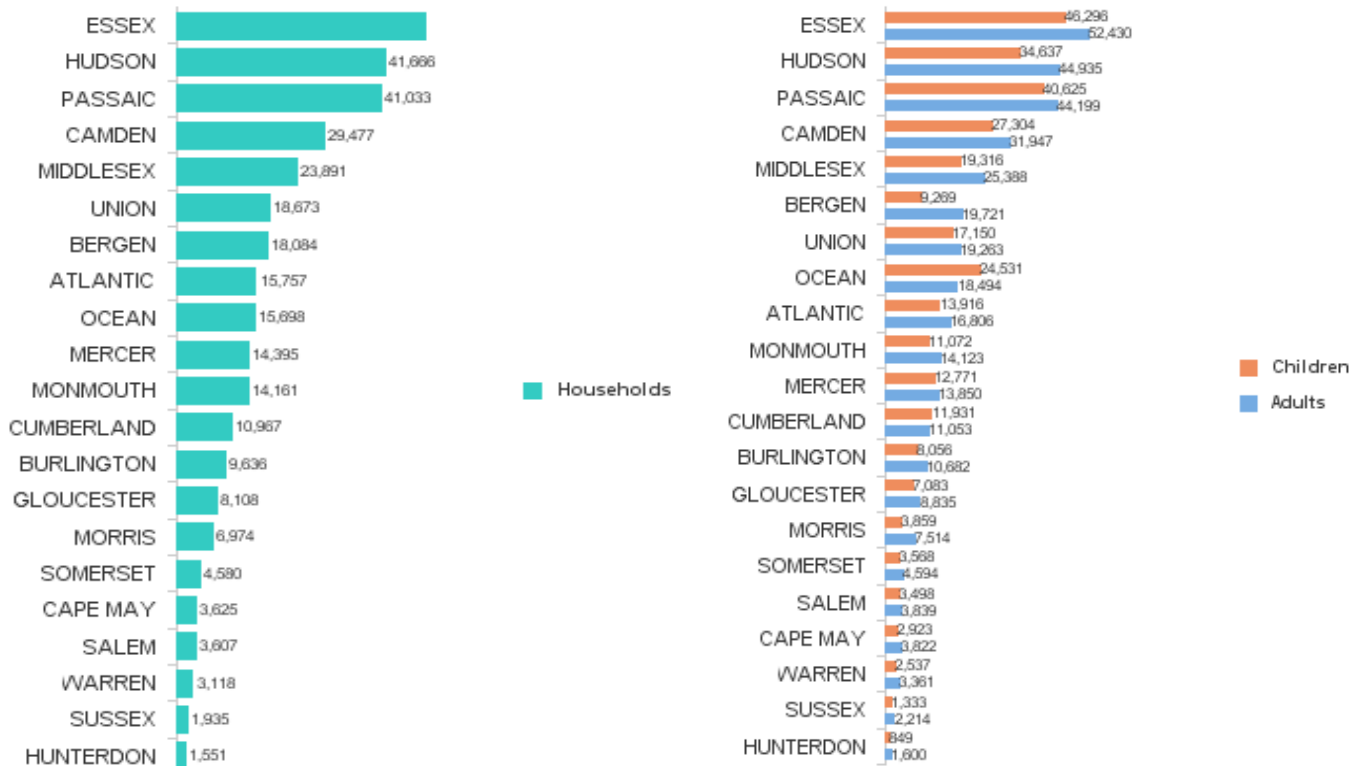

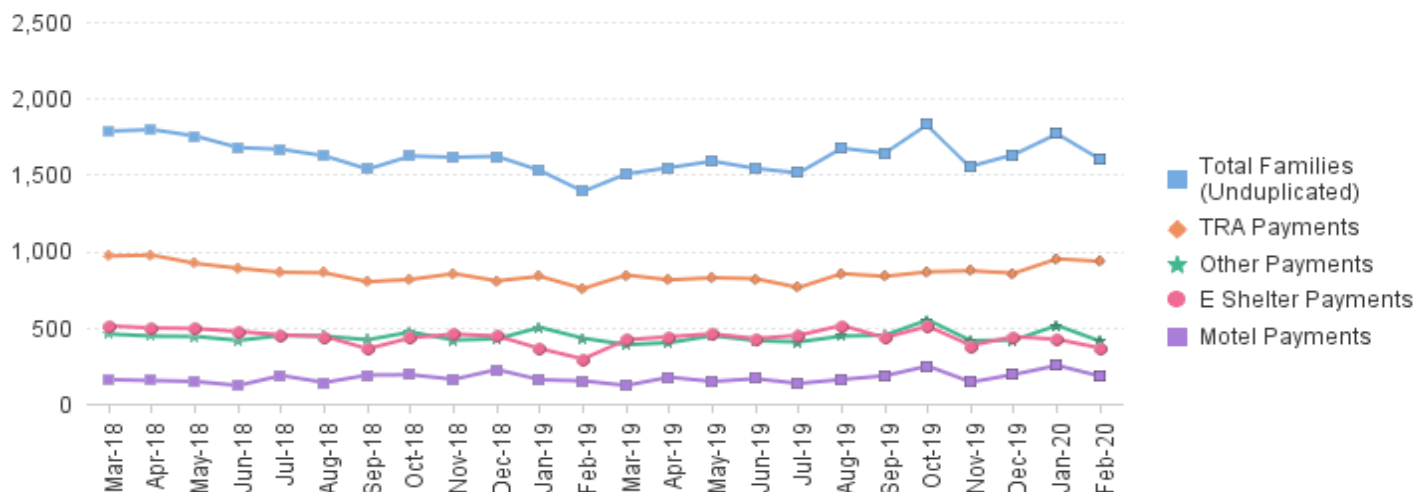

ACRONYMS

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKIDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
