# CURRENT PROGRAM Statistics

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Statistics.

### WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of January, the TANF caseload had increased by 2 cases, from 40,934 in January 2011 to 40,936 in January 2012.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since January 2011 include Passaic (17.4%), Hunterdon (10.7%), and Ocean (8.0%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased since January 2011 were Monmouth (-8.0%), Union (-8.3%), and Cumberland (-10.7%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 8,980 or 21.9% were child-only in January 2012.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,463), Hudson (1,143), and Camden (1,136).
- Essex (21,587), Passaic (12,516), and Camden (12,106) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in January 2012.

### NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In January 2012, there were 392,541 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 40,518, or 11.5%, since January 2011.
- There were 793,102 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of January 2012, an increase of 76,391 or 10.7% since January 2011.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since January 2011 are Passaic (18.1%), Sussex(17.7%), and Camden (16.6%).

### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 6,994 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in January 2012, an increase of 707 or 11.2% since January 2011.
- In January 2012, EA payments were made for 1,529 SSI recipients.

### **GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

### **GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 7,007 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in January 2012, a decrease of 979 or 12.3% since January 2011.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Passaic (36.1%), Mercer (18.0%), and Somerset (7.4%).

### **GA Program**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 54,659 to 44,248 since January 2011, a decrease of 19.0%.
- There were 31,039 Employable GA and 13,209 Unemployable GA cases in January 2012.
- In January 2012, GA cases showed a 1.4 percent decrease since December 2011.

### CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$308 million from October 2011 to December 2011, an increase of 2.4 percent over the same period for FFY 2011.
- Total distributions increased over 1.8% from December 2010.

### WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of January 2012, there were 4,369 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 641 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (1,059), Hudson (567), and Camden (500).
- There were 2,704 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.



### WFNJ/TANF Work Participation Rates for 12-Month Period Ending with JANUARY 2012 Statewide








### ACRONYMS

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE**: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**SSI-EA**: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ**: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.
