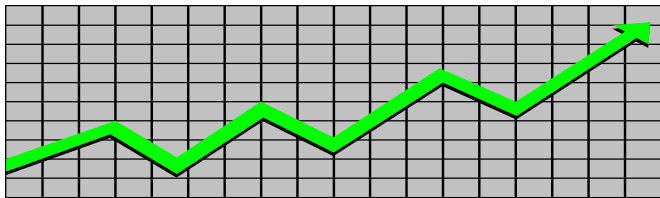

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DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS JANUARY 2016

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of January, the TANF caseload had decreased by 7,360 cases, from 31,774 in January 2015 to 24,414 in January 2016, a decrease of 23.2%.
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since January 2015 were Warren (-38.2%), Monmouth (-34.2%), and Sussex (-33.8%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 6,569 or 26.9% were child-only in January 2016.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (955), Camden (908), and Hudson (706).
- Essex (11,830), Passaic (7,763), Camden (7,155), Hudson (6,894), and Atlantic (4,367) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in January 2016.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In January 2016, there were 443,303 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 10,943, or 2.4%, since January 2015.
- There were 880,826 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of January 2016, a decrease of 23,592 or 2.6% since January 2015.
- The two counties having the highest caseload increase since January 2015 are Bergen (2.7%) and Middlesex (0.9%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 3,485 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in January 2016, a decrease of 2,403 or 40.8% since January 2015.
- In January 2016, EA payments were made for 925 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 3,323 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in January 2016, a decrease of 1,854 or 35.8% since January 2015.
- The counties that show the highest percent decrease in emergency assistance payments were Atlantic (55.5%), Salem (64.9%) and Gloucester (65.2%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 28,499 to 20,734 since January 2015, a decrease of 27.2%.
- There were 11,130 Employable GA and 9,604 Unemployable GA cases in January 2016.
- The counties that show the highest percent decrease for GA cases since January 2015 were Somerset (43.9%), Cumberland (52.7%) and Monmouth (54.7%) .
- In January 2016, GA cases showed a 4.8 percent decrease since December 2015.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$320 million from October 2015 to December 2015, an increase of 0.9 percent over the same period for FFY 2015.
- Total distributions decreased 3.9% from December 2014.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

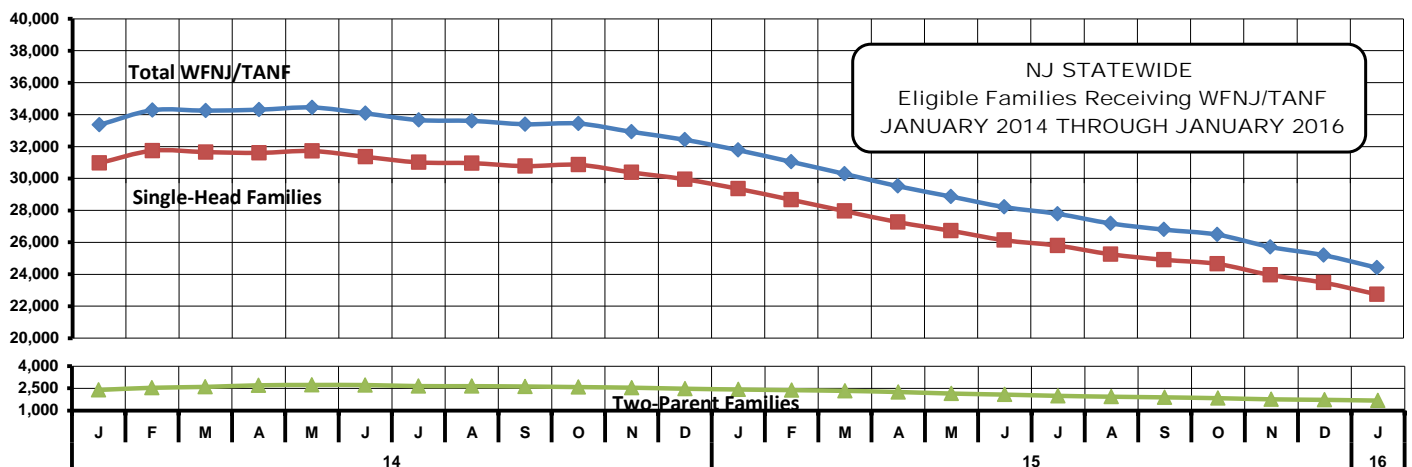
- During the report month of January 2016, there were 2,873 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 534 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (778), Camden (354), and Passaic (289).
- There were 3,330 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

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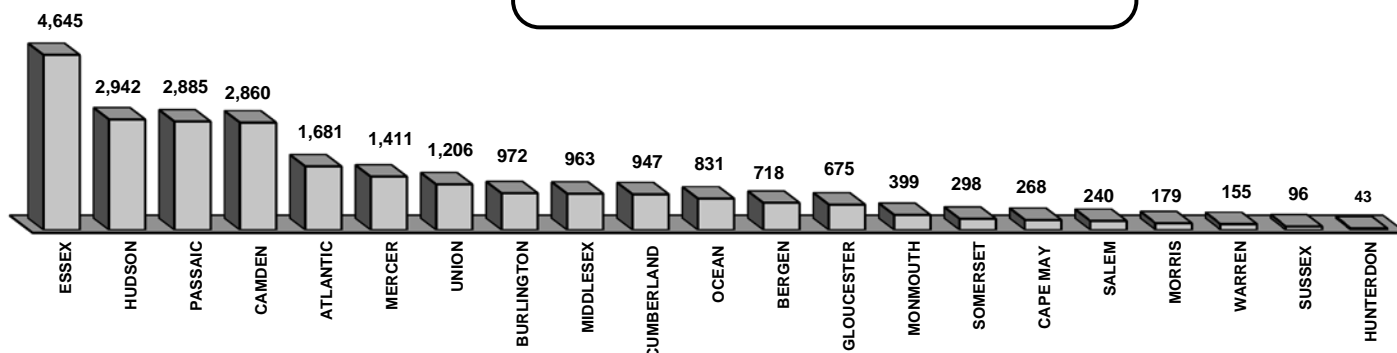

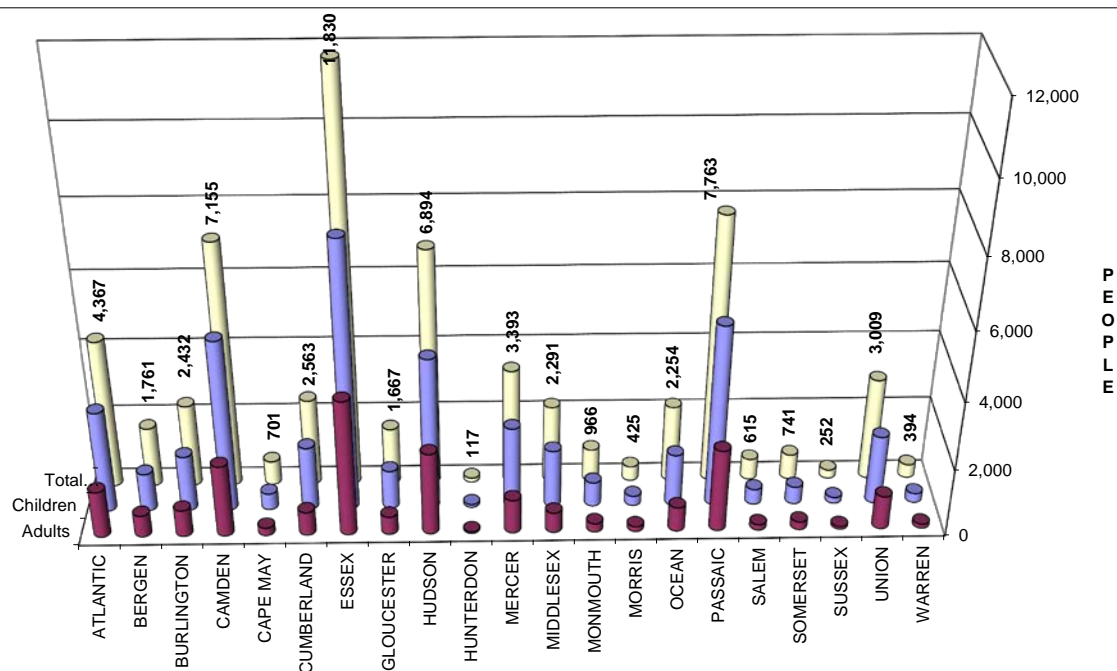

Ending With JANUARY 2016**

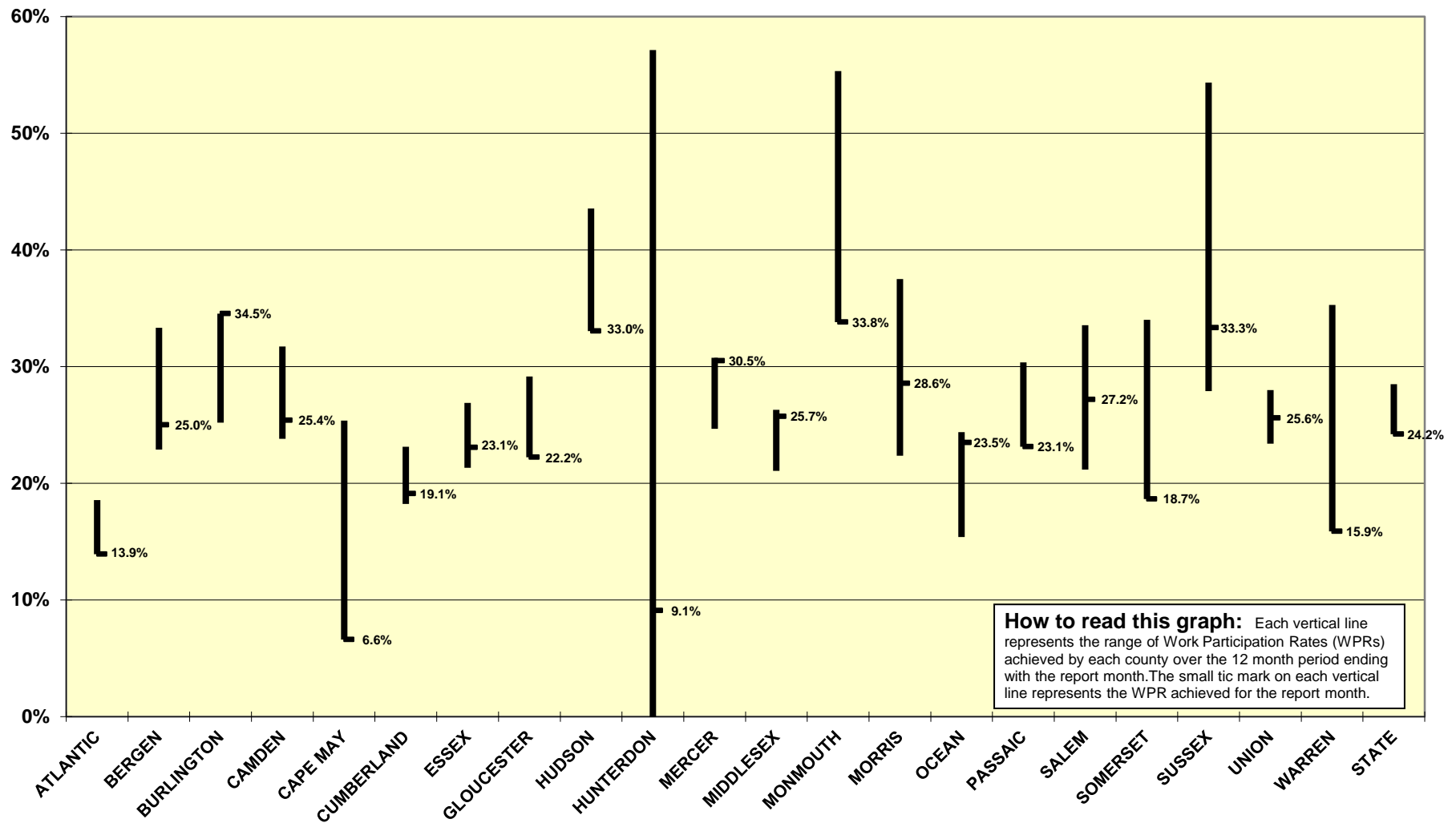
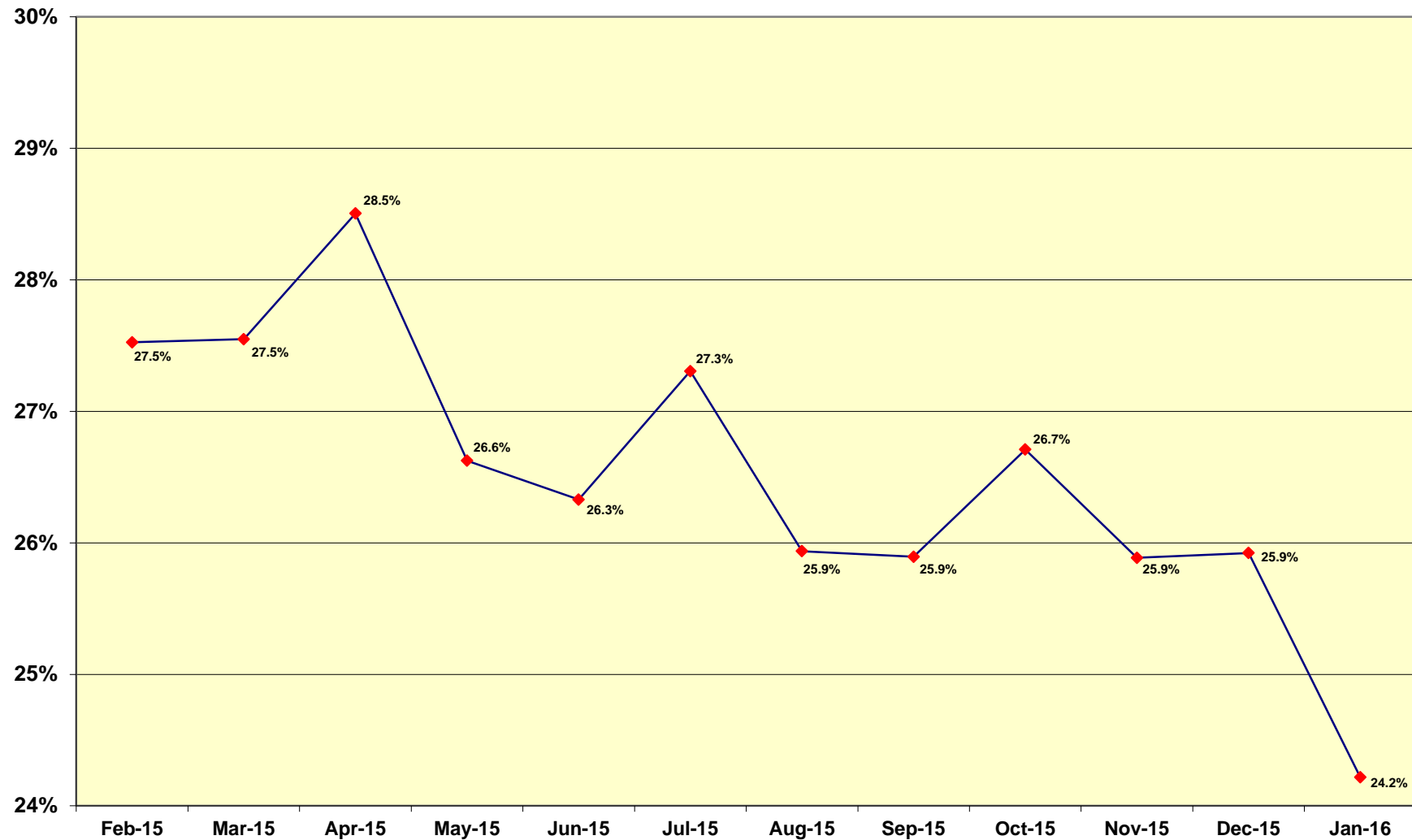

JANUARY 2014 THROUGH JANUARY 2016 (STATEWIDE)**

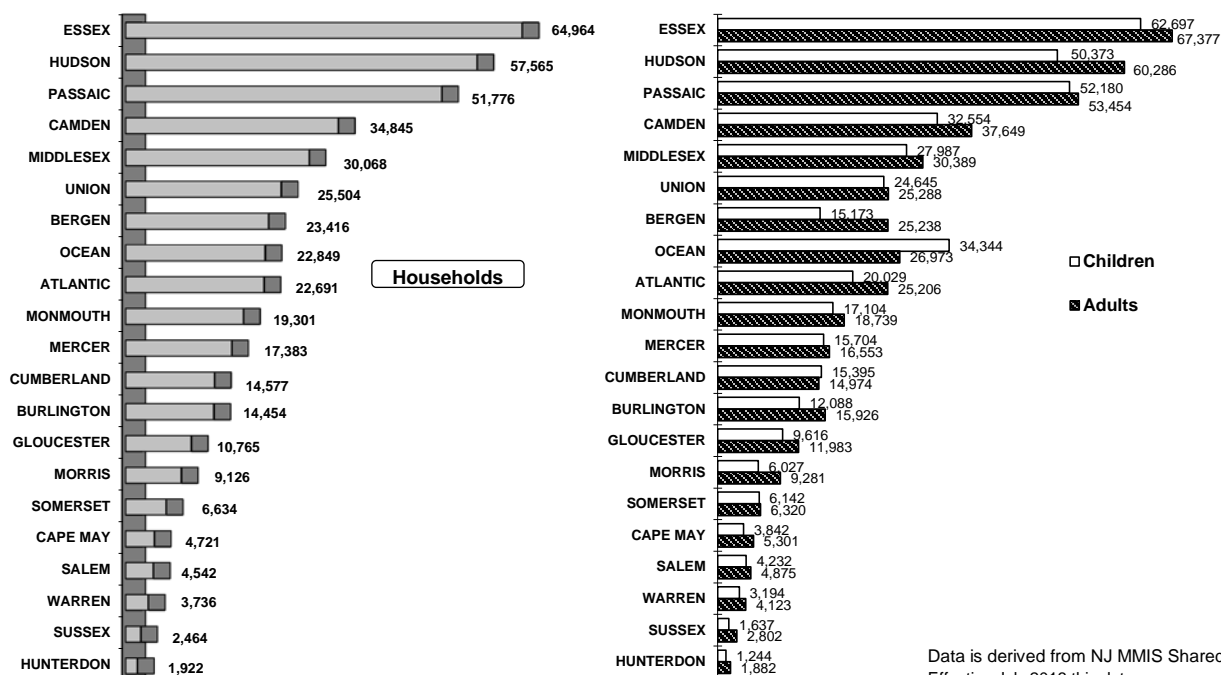

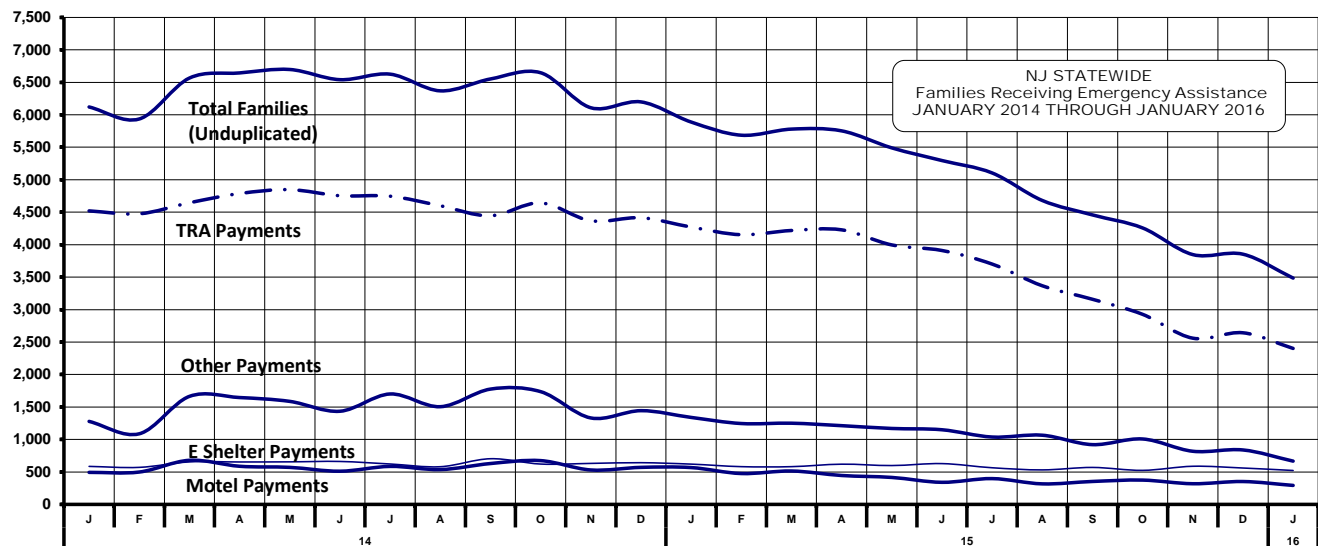

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
