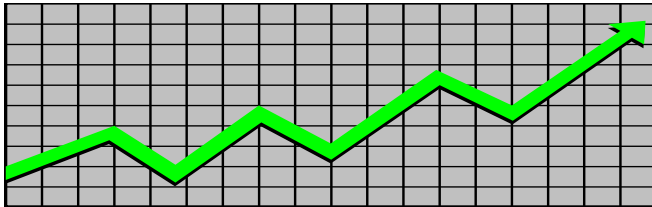

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DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS

JANUARY 2021

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- At the end of January, the TANF caseload had decreased by 177 cases, from 10,689 in January 2020 to 10,512 in January 2021; a decrease of -1.7%.
- The counties with caseloads that increased the most since January 2020 were Hudson (22.5%), Hunterdon (22.2%), and Warren (20.2%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since January 2020 were Sussex (-34.1%), Burlington (-24.4%), and Morris (-20.8%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 3,379 or 32.1% were child-only in January 2021.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (546), Essex (423), and Hudson (403).
- Essex (4,541), Hudson (4,007), and Camden (3,453) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in January 2021.

NJ SNAP (Formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In January 2021, there were 419,264 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 83,197 or 24.8%, since January 2020.
- There were 815,400 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of January 2021; an increase of 155,471 or 23.6% since January 2020.
- The counties having the highest caseload increase since January 2020 were Hudson (42.5%), Warren (37.2%), and Union (31.1%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 1,359 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in January 2021; a decrease of 408 or -23.1% since January 2020.
- In January 2021, EA payments were made for 615 SSI recipients.

DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS JANUARY 2021

- There were 2,088 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in January 2021; a decrease of 38 or -1.8% since January 2020.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Sussex (52.9%), Hudson (50.3%), and Union (41.5%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Cumberland (-92.9%), Salem (-83.3%), and Gloucester (-59.1%).

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has increased from 10,028 to 13,531 since January 2020; an increase of 34.9%.
- There were 8,978 Employable GA and 4,553 Unemployable GA cases in January 2021.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Hudson (128.2%), Salem (95.7%), and Camden (66.2%) since January 2020.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since January 2020 were Hunterdon (-22.8%), Cape May (-5.3%), and Morris (-4.8%).
- In January 2021, GA cases showed a 2.3% increase since December 2020.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (QUARTERLY REPORT)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$295 million from October 2020 to December 2020; a decrease of -3.1% over the same period from FFY 2020.
- Total distributions decreased -0.2% from December 2019.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

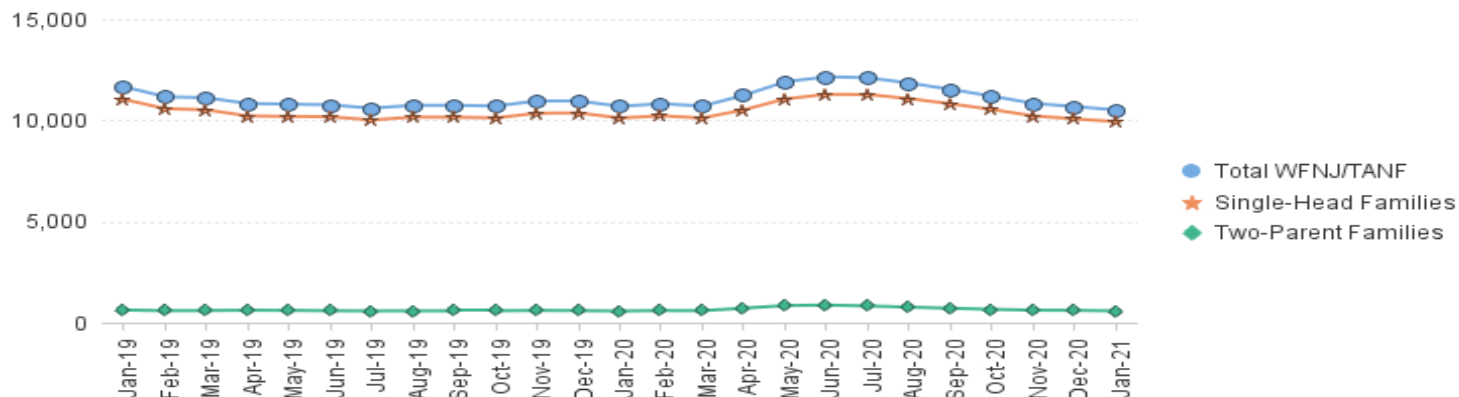
- During the report month of January 2021, there were 226 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 52 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (38), Mercer (26), and Hudson (25).
- There were 350 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

JANUARY 2019 THROUGH JANUARY 2021

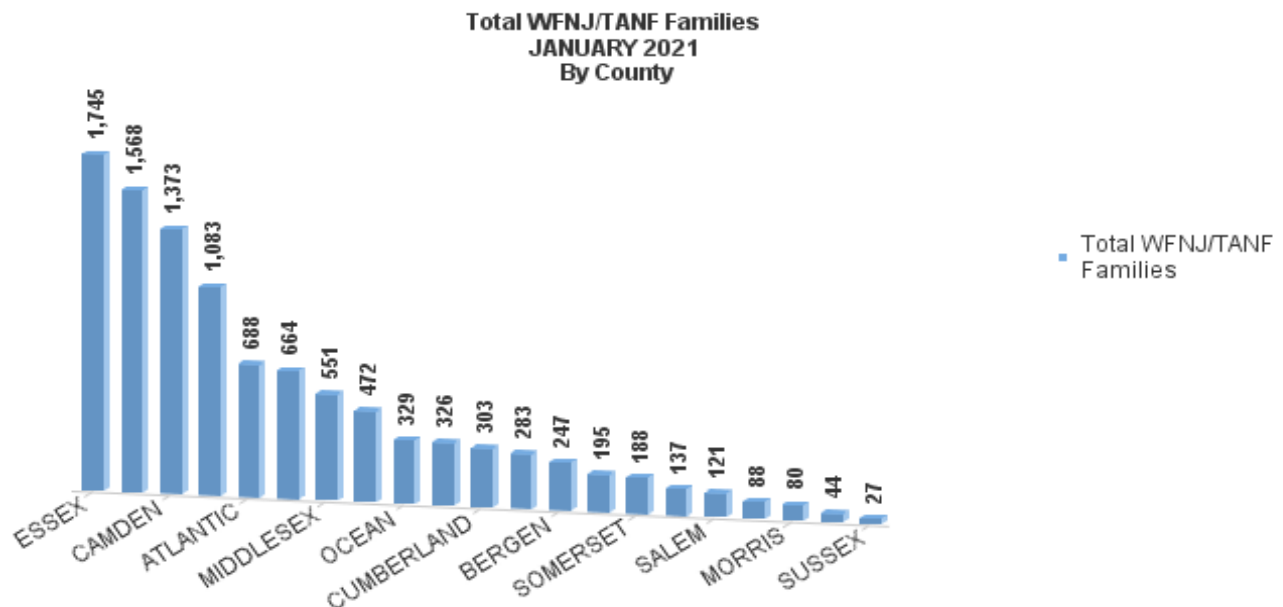

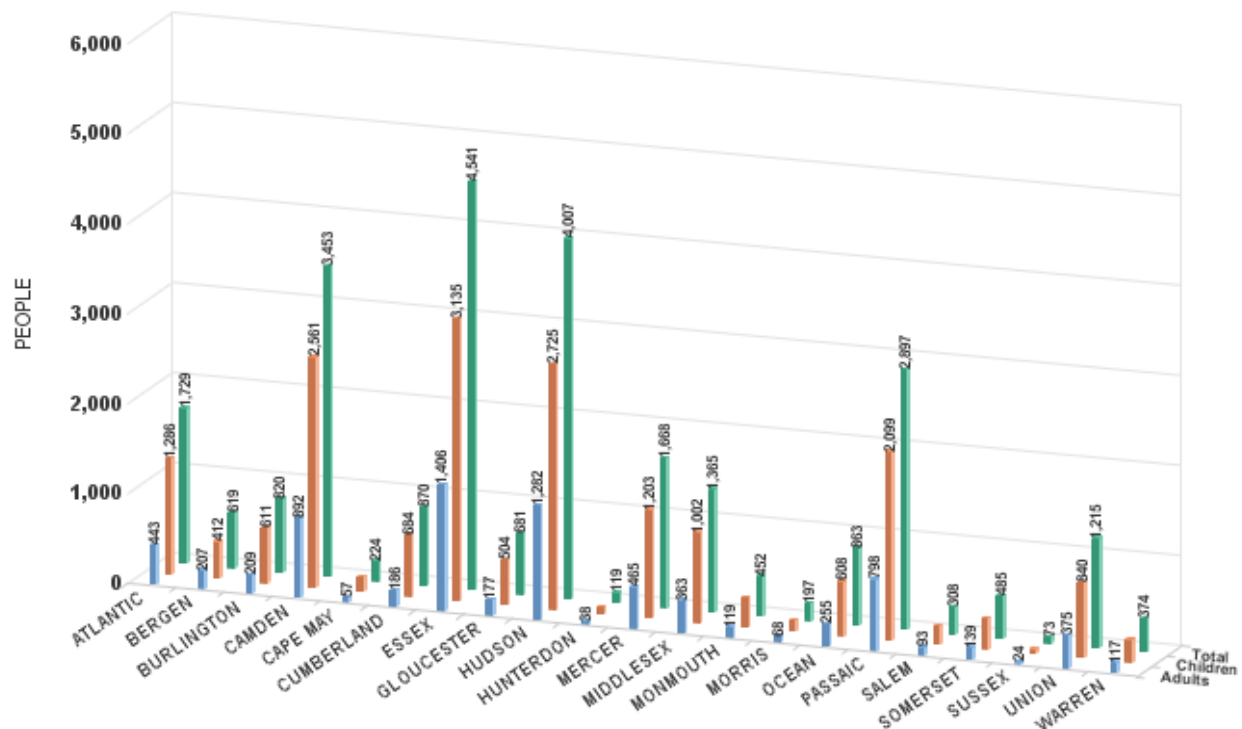

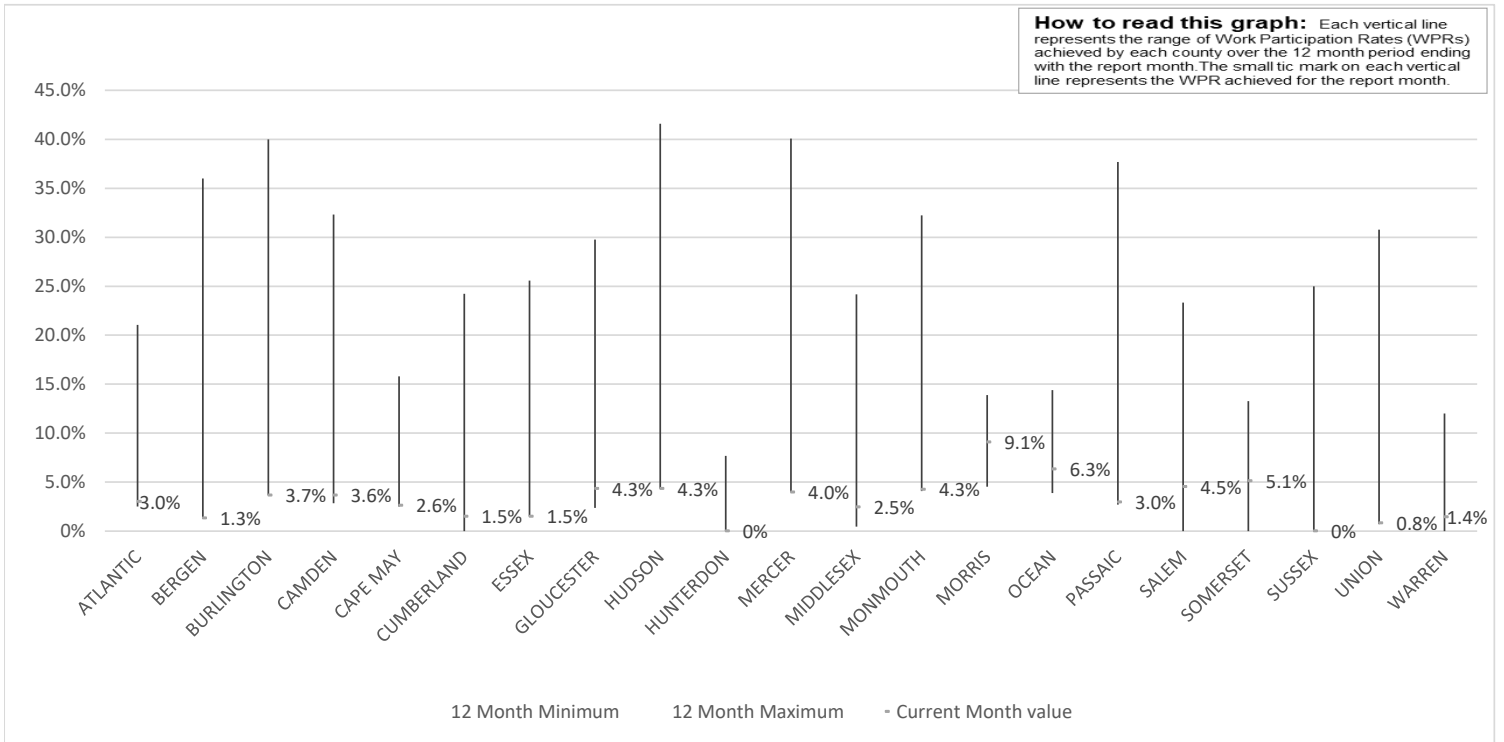

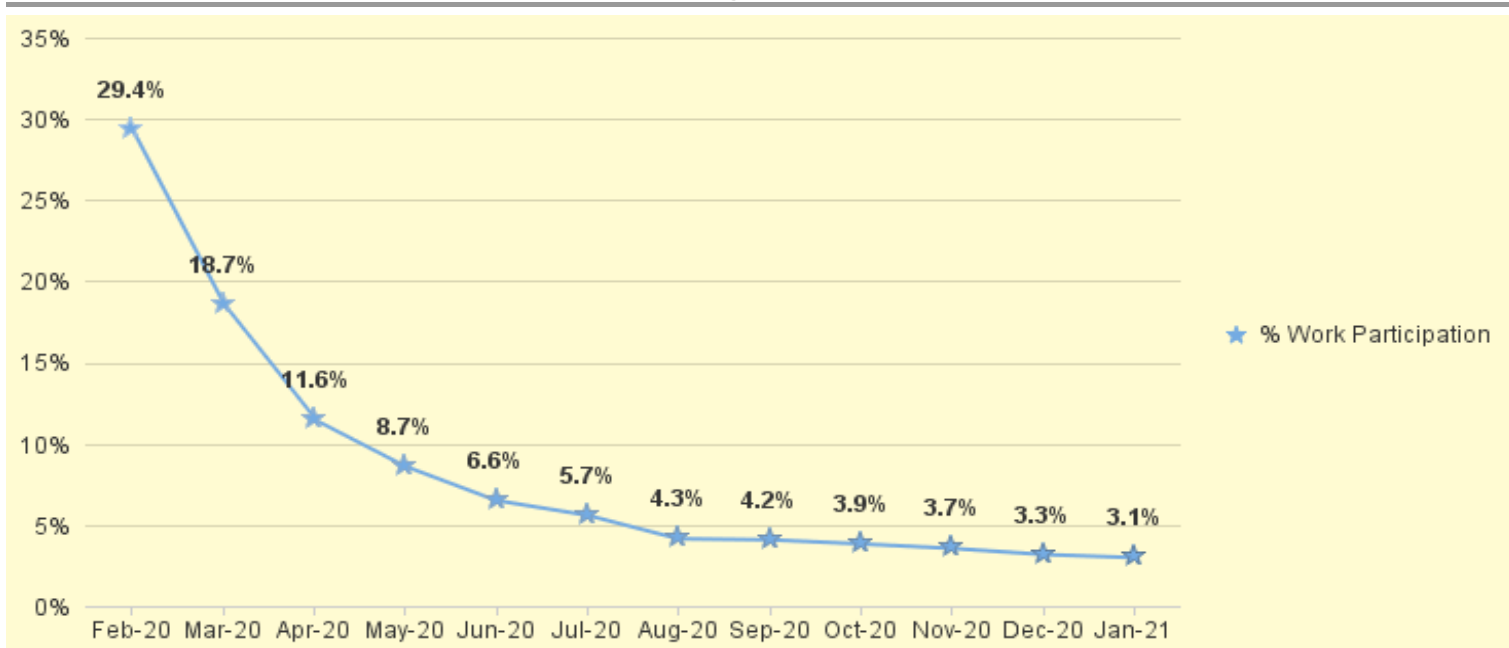
**Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period

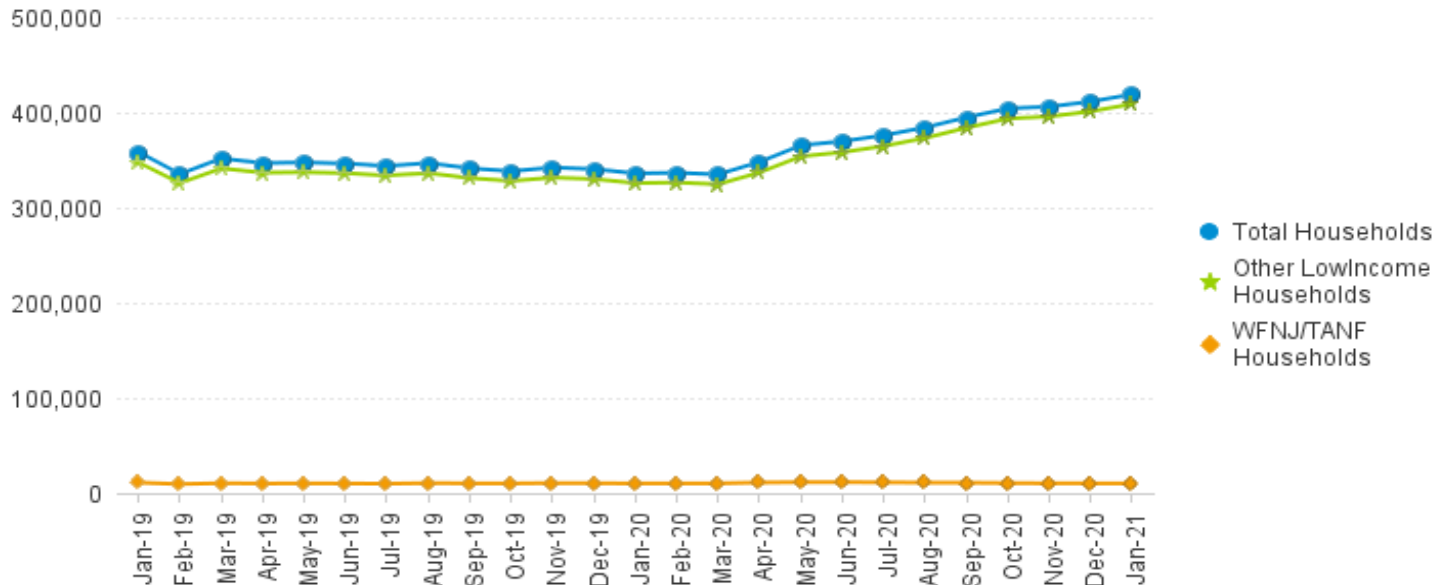
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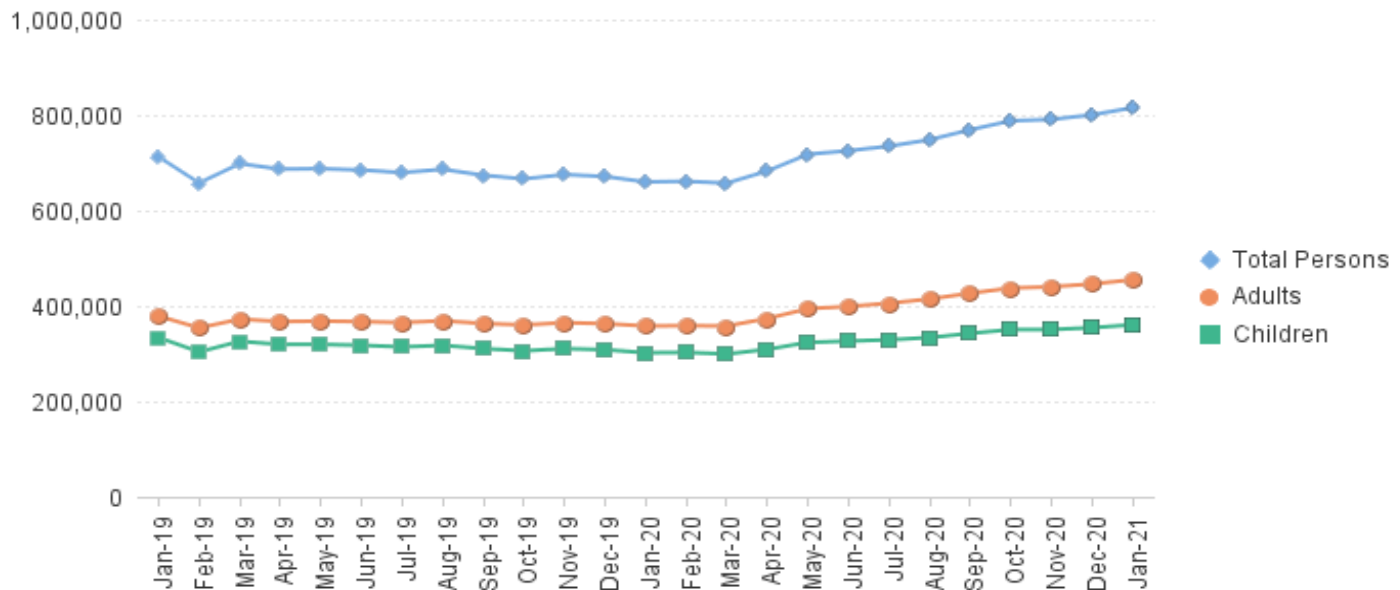

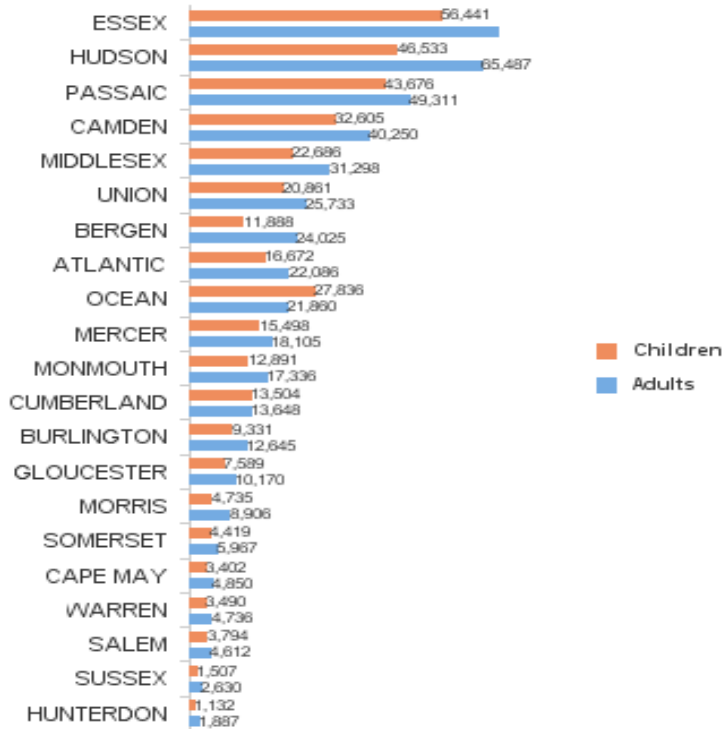
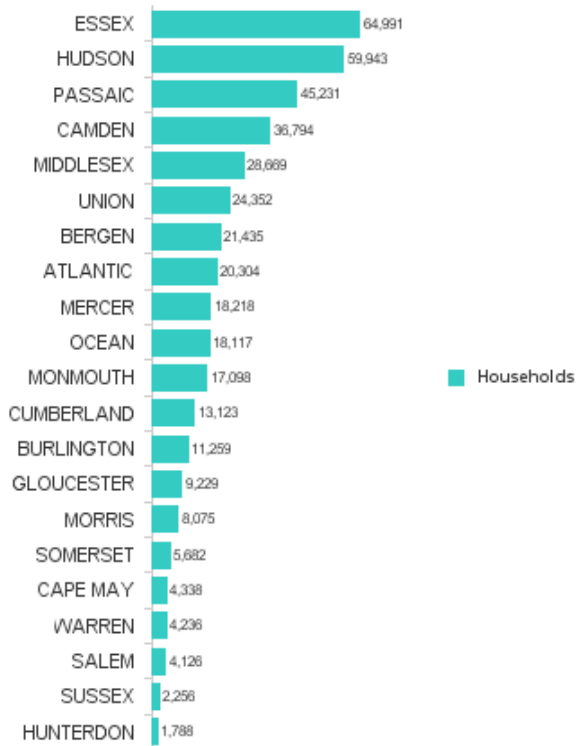

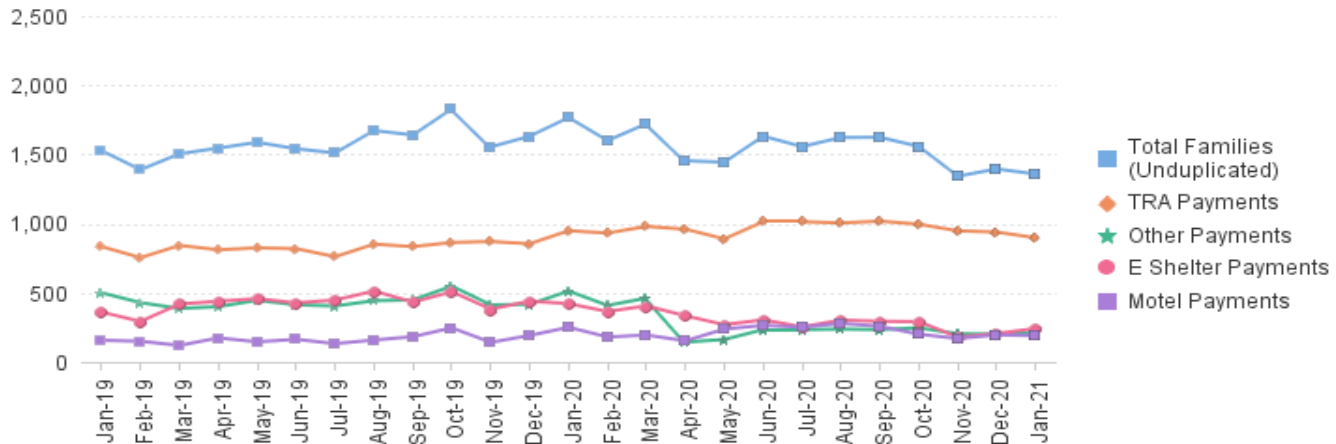

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as NJ SNAP (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKIDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime
