### DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS MAY 2021

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

### WFNJ/TANF

- At of the end of May, the TANF caseload had decreased by 2,139 cases, from 11,902 in May 2020 to 9,763 in May 2021; a decrease of -18%.
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since May 2020 were Sussex (-45%), Salem (-35.5%), and Gloucester (-33.3%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 3,209 or 32.9% were child-only in May 2021.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (535), Essex (403), and Hudson (374).
- Essex (4,178), Hudson (3,483), and Camden (3,191) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in May 2021.

### NJ SNAP (Formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In May 2021, there were 438,332 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 72,821 or 19.9%, since May 2020.
- There were 849,978 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of May 2021; an increase of 132,061 or 18.4% since May 2020.
- The counties having the highest caseload increase since May 2020 were Union (38.3%), Essex (38%), and Hudson (29%).

### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 1,356 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in May 2021; a decrease of 88 or -6.1% since May 2020.
- In May 2021, EA payments were made for 654 SSI recipients.

### DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS MAY 2021

- There were 1,310 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in May 2021; a decrease of 528 or -28.7% since May 2020.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Monmouth (437.5%), Essex (67.3%), and Union (50.4%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Cumberland (-86.4%), Salem (-71.4%), and Gloucester (-70.6%).

#### **GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has increased from 12,719 to 14,051 since May 2020; an increase of 10.5%.
- There were 9,630 Employable GA and 4,421 Unemployable GA cases in May 2021.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Hudson (53%), Atlantic (30.9%), and Camden (24.5%) since May 2020.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since May 2020 were Gloucester (-30%), Hunterdon (-28.3%), and Sussex (-25.7%).
- In May 2021, GA cases showed a 1.9% increase since April 2021.

### CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (QUARTERLY REPORT)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$294 million from January 2021 to March 2021; a decrease of -4.7% over the same period from FFY 2020.
- Total distributions decreased -3.4% from May 2020.

### **WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of May 2021, there were 233 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 62 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Cumberland (51), Gloucester (29), and Hunterdon (21).
- There were 290 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.















### **ACRONYMS**

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as NJ SNAP (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**NJKiDS:** New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE:** The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime
