

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DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS SEPTEMBER 2009

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, Food Stamps, Emergency Assistance, General Assis ance (GA) and Child Support and Paternity. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider.

WFNJ/TANF

- At the end of September, the TANF caseload decreased by 110 cases, from 37,213 in September 2008 to 37,103 in September 2009, a 0.3% decline.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since September 2008 include Ocean (27.7%), Sussex (22.7%), and Middlesex (17.2%).
- The counties that decreased the most since September 2008 were Passaic (-5.2 %), Essex (-7.6%) and Union (-11.5 %)
- Of the WFNI/TANF families, 9,744 or 26.3% were child-only cases in September 2009
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,674), Hudson (1,383), and Camdon (1,140).
- Essex (20,409), Hudson (12,003), and Camden (9,817) counties have the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in September 2009.

FOOD STAMP PROGRAM

- September 2009 there are 262,373 households receiving food stamps. Food Stamp households increased by 43,676, or 20.0%, since September 2008.
- There were 533,842 persons receiving food stamps as of September 2009, an increase of 84,743 or 18.9 % since September 2008.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since Ser tember 2008 are Hunterdon (40.9%), Ocean (29.6%), and Sussex (28.9%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 5,462 families receiving emergency assistance (EA) in September 2009, an increase of 516 or 10.4% since September 2008.
- In September 2009, EA payments were made for 1,565 SSI recipients

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 8,232 emergency assistance payments made to GA recipients in September 2009, an increase of 966 or 13.3% since September 2008.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Salem (130.8%), Cumberland (74.5%), and Hunterdon (66.2%).

GA Program

The total numbers of persons for GA has increased from 42,619 to 48,647 since September 2008, an increase of 14.1%.

There were 31,485 Employable GA and 17,162 Unemployable GA recipients in September 2009.

• Hunterdon (57.2%), Essex (43.9%), and Cape May (38.6%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA persons since September 2008.

CHILD SUPPORT AND PATERNITY (Quarterly Report)


- The total collection for the Child Support and Paternity Program was about 290 million dollars from October 2007 to September 2008, an increase of 7.7 percent over the same period for FFY 2007.
- Total distributions increased over 13 percent from September 2007.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of September 2009, there were 3,284 families where at least one
 member is employed and an additional 449 families where WFNI assistance cases were closed
 due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active recipients were: Essex (689), Hudson (395), and Camden (294).
 - There were 3,838 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.






WFNJ/TANF Work Participation Rates for 12-Month Period Ending with SEPTEMBER 2009 Statewide








Total Food Stamp Recipients SEPTEMBER 2009 By County




ACRONYMS

ACSES: Automated Child Support Enforcement System

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if the eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

FOOD STAMP PROGRAM (FS) - Authorized by Congress as a mutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA establishes Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. The emphasis is on achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.
