Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, Food Stamps, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance (GA) and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider.

WFNJ/TANF

- At the end of March, the TANF caseload increased by 1,601 cases, from 37,034 in March 2009 to 38,635 in March 2010, a 4.3% increase.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since March 2009 in Burlington (27.3%), Ocean (22.7%), and Gloucester (18.2%).
- The counties that decreased the most since March 2009 were Hunterdon (-4.3%), Cumberland (-6.1%) and Salem (-8.7 %)
- Of the WFNJ/TANF families, 10,505 or 27.2% were child-only cases in March 2010
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,723), Hudson (1,401), and Camden (1,185).
- Essex (21,239), Hudson (12,057), and Camden (10,307) counties have the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in March 2010.

FOOD STAMP PROGRAM

- March 2010 there are 293,874 households receiving food stamps. Food Stamp households increased by 54,427, or 22.7%, since March 2009.
- There were 595,987 persons receiving food stamps as of March 2010, an increase of 100,000 or 21.7 % since March 2009.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since March 2009 are Ocean (30.9%), Middlesex (30.9%), and Hunterdon (26.9%)

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 6,162 families receiving emergency assistance (EA) in March 2010, an increase of 992 or 19.2% since March 2009.
- In March 2010, EA payments were made for 1,650 SSI recipients

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 9,125 emergency assistance payments made to GA recipients in March 2010, an increase of 1,121 or 14.0% since March 2009.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Hunterdon (80.0%), Burlington (50.8%), and Gloucester (45.6%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of persons for GA has increased from 46,374 to 53,071 since March 2009, an increase of 14.4%.
- There were 35,534 Employable GA and 17,537 Unemployable GA recipients in March 2010.
- Ocean (43.9%), Middlesex (41.4%), and Hunterdon (30.1%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA persons since March 2009.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about 315 million dollars from January 2009 to March 2010, an increase of 5.5 percent over the same period for FFY 2009.
- Total distributions increased over 3 percent from March 2009.


WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of March 2010, there were 3,651 families where at least one member is employed and an additional 474 families where WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment – related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active recipients were: Essex (854), Hudson (432), and Camden (341).
- There were 3,648 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





Ending With MARCH 2010**



Statewide**




Total Food Stamp Recipients

Number WFNJ Families Receiving EA by County MARCH 2010




ACRONYMS

ACSES: Automated Child Support Enforcement System

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if the eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

FOOD STAMP PROGRAM (FS) - Authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA establishes Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. The emphasis is on achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The Department of Human Services Division of Family Development provides basic income and an opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency for individuals and families served by the Division's programs. The Division provides leadership, direction and supervision to those public agencies responsible for administering those programs and plans for and develops policies to promote self-sufficiency.
