FEBRUARY 2013**

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

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**WFNJ/TANF**

- As of the end of February, the TANF caseload had decreased by 2,064 cases, from 40,629 in February 2012 to 38,565 in February 2013, a decrease of 5.1%.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since February 2012 include Somerset (6.0%), Warren (5.1%), and Ocean (3.2%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased since February 2012 were Burlington (-16.0%), Hunterdon (-27.6%), and Morris (-29.1%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 8,295 or 21.5% were child-only in February 2013.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,288), Camden (1,116), and Hudson (1,029).
- Essex (20,341), Passaic (12,565), and Hudson (11,363) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in February 2013.

**NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In February 2013, there were 422,249 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 27,035, or 6.8%, since February 2012.
- There were 851,711 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of February 2013, an increase of 55,618 or 7.0% since February 2012.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since February 2012 are Ocean (23.9%), Middlesex (14.4%), and Monmouth (9.9%).

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 6,209 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in February 2013, a decrease of 588 or 8.7% since February 2012.
- In February 2013, EA payments were made for 1,281 SSI recipients.

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**GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

**GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 5,951 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in February 2013, a decrease of 836 or 12.3% since February 2012.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Atlantic (23.9%), Morris (21.1), and Hudson (7.5%).

**GA Program**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 44,147 to 39,186 since February 2012, a decrease of 11.2%.
- There were 26,349 Employable GA and 12,837 Unemployable GA cases in February 2013.
- In February 2013, GA cases showed a 1.1 percent decrease since January 2013.

**CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)**


- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$316 million from October 2012 to December 2012, an increase of 2.7 percent over the same period for FFY 2012.
- Total distributions increased over 2.1% from December 2011.

**WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of February 2013, there were 3,850 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 586 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (906), Hudson (467), and Camden (467).
- There were 3,620 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





Ending With FEBRUARY 2013






FEBRUARY 2011 THROUGH FEBRUARY 2013 (STATEWIDE)**







## **ACRONYMS**

**CASS:** Consolidated Assistance and Support System

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**NJKiDS:** New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE:** The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA:** Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
