NOVEMBER 2013**

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

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**WFNJ/TANF**

- As of the end of November, the TANF caseload had decreased by 4,466 cases, from 39,735 in November 2012 to 35,269 in November 2013, a decrease of 11.2%.
- The county where the family caseload percentage increased since November 2012 was Cumberland (0.3%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased since November 2012 were Monmouth (-20.7%), Hunterdon (-22.7%), and Sussex (-23.9%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 7,833 or 22.2% were child-only in November 2013.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,256), Camden (1,059), and Hudson (980).
- Essex (19,288), Passaic (10,679), Hudson (10,466), Camden (9,361) and Mercer (5,307) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in November 2013.

**NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In November 2013, there were 433,754 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 14,507, or 3.5%, since November 2012.
- There were 870,590 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of November 2013, an increase of 28,206 or 3.3% since November 2012.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since November 2012 are Ocean (18.0%), Somerset (8.0%), and Salem (7.2%).

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 6,356 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in November 2013, an increase of 86 or 1.4% since November 2012.
- In November 2013, EA payments were made for 1,572 SSI recipients.

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**GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

**GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 5,025 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in November 2013, a decrease of 793 or 13.6% since November 2012.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Monmouth (72.7%), Burlington (67.8%), and Atlantic (15.4%).

**GA Program**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 40,259 to 33,523 since November 2012, a decrease of 16.7%.
- There were 21,070 Employable GA and 12,453 Unemployable GA cases in November 2013.
- Warren (12.2%) and Mercer (1.2%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA cases since November 2012.
- In November 2013, GA cases showed a 3.7 percent decrease since October 2013.

**CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)**


- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$318 million from July 2013 to September 2013, an increase of 4.1 percent over the same period for FFY 2012.
- Total distributions increased 3.7% from September 2012.

**WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of November 2013, there were 4,181 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 594 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (1,014), Hudson (466), and Camden (432).
- There were 3,399 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.








Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period




NOVEMBER 2011 THROUGH NOVEMBER 2013 (STATEWIDE)**






Total NJ SNAP Recipients




## **ACRONYMS**

**CASS:** Consolidated Assistance and Support System

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**NJKiDS:** New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE:** The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA:** Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
