JANUARY 2014**

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

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**WFNJ/TANF**

- As of the end of January, the TANF caseload had decreased by 5,788 cases, from 39,143 in January 2013 to 33,355 in January 2014, a decrease of 14.8%.
- The county where the family caseload percentage increased since January 2013 was Cumberland (7.5%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since January 2013 were Sussex (-24.3%), Passaic (-25.3%), and Hunterdon (-32.3%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 7,833 or 23.5% were child-only in January 2014.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,214), Camden (1,031), and Hudson (949).
- Essex (18,370), Passaic (9,512), Hudson (9,338), Camden (8,767) and Atlantic (5,405) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in January 2014.

**NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In January 2014, there were 426,623 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 5,155, or 1.2%, since January 2013.
- There were 853,425 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of January 2014, an increase of 3,831 or 0.5% since January 2013.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since January 2013 are Salem (7.7%), Ocean (5.4%), and Middlesex (5.4%).

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 6,120 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in January 2014, a decrease of 350 or 5.4% since January 2013.
- In January 2014, EA payments were made for 1,439 SSI recipients.

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**GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

**GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 5,036 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in January 2014, a decrease of 1,226 or 19.6% since January 2013.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Middlesex (15.6%), Atlantic (15.3%), and Burlington (9.7%).

**GA Program**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 39,625 to 32,582 since January 2013, a decrease of 17.8%.
- There were 20,271 Employable GA and 12,311 Unemployable GA cases in January 2014.
- Warren (12.8%) and Middlesex (5.3%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA cases since January 2013.
- In January 2014, GA cases showed a 1.8 percent decrease since December 2013.

**CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)**


- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$316 million from October 2013 to December 2013, an increase of 0.1 percent over the same period for FFY 2013.
- Total distributions increased 2.2% from December 2012.

**WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of January 2014, there were 3,721 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 515 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (904), Hudson (445), and Camden (408).
- There were 3,478 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





Ending With JANUARY 2014






JANUARY 2012 THROUGH JANUARY 2014 (STATEWIDE)**







## **ACRONYMS**

**CASS:** Consolidated Assistance and Support System

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**NJKiDS:** New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE:** The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA:** Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
