DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS
JUNE 2014

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of June, the TANF caseload had decreased by 3,276 cases, from 37,354 in June 2013 to 34,078 in June 2014, a decrease of 8.8%.
- The counties where the family caseload percentage increased since June 2013 were Sussex (9.1%), Atlantic (7.3%), and Burlington (5.5%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since June 2013 were Camden (-16.0%), Monmouth (-18.2%), and Passaic (-24.5%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 7,743 or 22.7% were child-only in June 2014.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,142), Camden (1,034), and Hudson (924).
- Essex (18,365), Hudson (9,934), Passaic (9,148), Camden (8,818), and Atlantic (5,675) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in June 2014.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In June 2014, there were 443,138 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 11,367, or 2.6%, since June 2013.
- There were 882,410 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of June 2014, an increase of 11,453 or 1.3% since June 2013.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since June 2013 are Monmouth (9.4%), Salem (9.0%), and Middlesex (7.9%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 6,540 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in June 2014, a decrease of 158 or 2.4% since June 2013.
- In June 2014, EA payments were made for 1,748 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 5,612 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in June 2014, a decrease of 400 or 6.7% since June 2013.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Cumberland (111.6%), Atlantic (81.8%), and Burlington (61.1%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 38,441 to 32,231 since June 2013, a decrease of 16.2%.
- There were 20,038 Employable GA and 12,193 Unemployable GA cases in June 2014.
- Warren (15.2%), Middlesex (8.9%) and Bergen (4.6%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA cases since June 2013.
- In June 2014, GA cases showed a 0.9 percent decrease since May 2014.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)


- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$332 million from April 2014 to June 2014, an increase of 0.8 percent over the same period for FFY 2013.
- Total distributions increased 0.3% from June 2013.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of June 2014, there were 3,895 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 501 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (971), Hudson (414), and Camden (403).
- There were 3,267 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





Ending With JUNE 2014






JUNE 2012 THROUGH JUNE 2014 (STATEWIDE)**





JUNE 2014 By County






ACRONYMS

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
