SEPTEMBER 2019**

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of September, the TANF caseload had decreased by 1,870 cases, from 12,609 in September 2018 to 10,739 in September 2019, a decrease of 14.8%.

- The county with caseloads that increased the most since September 2018 was Warren (0.7%).

- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since September 2018 were Atlantic (-20.6%), Cumberland (-22.2%) and Sussex (-34.7%).

- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 3,679 or 34.3% were child-only in September 2019.

- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (603), Essex (464) and Passaic (385).

- Essex (4,604), Camden (3,490), Hudson (3,428), Passaic (2,872) and Atlantic (1,706) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in September 2019.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In September 2019, there were 341,481 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 25,520 or 7.0%, since September 2018.

- There were 673,966 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of September 2019, a decrease of 56,882 or 7.8% since September 2018.

- The counties having the highest caseload decrease since September 2018 are Burlington (-9.8%), Atlantic (11.0%) and Somerset (-11.9%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 1,641 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in September 2019, an increase of 105 or 6.8% since September 2018.

- In September 2019, EA payments were made for 578 SSI recipients.

SEPTEMBER 2019**

- There were 2,159 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in September 2019, an increase of 201 or 10.3% since September 2018.
 - The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Monmouth (121.1%), Cumberland (137.5%) and Salem (400.0%).
 - The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Burlington (-16.0%), Hudson (-27.3%) and Cape May (-37.1%).

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 11,310 to 10,421 since September 2018, a decrease of 7.9%.
- There were 4,228 Employable GA and 6,193 Unemployable GA cases in September 2019.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Sussex (35.1%), Warren (36.8%) and Hunterdon (43.8%) since September 2018.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since September 2018 were Bergen (-20.7%), Morris (-22.0%) and Atlantic (-22.9%).
- In September 2019, GA cases showed a 1.8% decrease since August 2019.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$304 million from July 2019 to September 2019, an increase of 2.0 percent over the same period for FFY 2018.
- Total distributions increased 1.1% from September 2018.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of September 2019, there were 1,091 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 135 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (299), Camden (129) and Hudson (118).
- There were 886 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.



SEPTEMBER 2017 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 2019**









Ending with SEPTEMBER 2019







SEPTEMBER 2019 by County**





Number WFNJ Families Receiving EA by County SEPTEMBER 2019




ACRONYMS

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
