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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

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**WFNJ/TANF**

- As of the end of May, the TANF caseload had increased by 1,105 cases, from 10,797 in May 2019 to 11,902 in May 2020, an increase of 10.2%.
  
- The counties with caseloads that increased the most since May 2019 were Hudson (33.7%), Somerset (40.8%) and Hunterdon (66.7%).
  
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since May 2019 were Passaic (-4.4%), and Essex (-7.6%).
  
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 3,695 or 31.0% were child-only in May 2020.
  
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (586), Essex (422) and Hudson (421).
  
- Hudson (4,741), Essex (4,405), Camden (3,838), Passaic (2,911) and Atlantic (1,969) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in May 2020.

**NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In May 2020, there were 365,511 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 17,906 or 5.2%, since May 2019.
  
- There were 717,917 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of May 2020, an increase of 30,293 or 4.4% since May 2019.
  
- The counties having the highest caseload increase since May 2019 are Somerset (13.1%), Warren (13.1%) and Mercer (13.7%).
  
- The counties having the highest caseload decrease since May 2019 are Essex (-2.3%) and (-2.9%).

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 1,444 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in May 2020, a decrease of 144 or -9.1% since May 2019.
  
- In May 2020, EA payments were made for 416 SSI recipients.

**DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS  
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- There were 1,838 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in May 2020, a decrease of 1,007 or -35.4% since May 2019.
  - The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Cumberland (46.7%), Warren (50.0%) and Gloucester (123.7%).
  - The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Essex (-46.7%), Morris (-63.3%) and Monmouth (-77.8%).

**GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has increased from 10,368 to 12,719 since May 2019, an increase of 22.7%.
- There were 6,936 Employable GA and 5,783 Unemployable GA cases in May 2020.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Hudson (48.8%), Sussex (58.1%) and Salem (76.4%) since May 2019.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since May 2019 were Bergen (-3.7%) and Morris (-7.0%).
- In May 2020, GA cases showed a 11.1% increase since April 2020.

**CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)**

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$308 million from January 2020 to March 2020, a decrease of -1.1 percent over the same period for FFY 2019.
- Total distributions decreased -1.5% from March 2019.

**WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of May 2020, there were 509 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 37 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Camden (84), Essex (66) and Hudson (60).
- There were 783 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.



MAY 2018 THROUGH MAY 2020**










Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period









## **ACRONYMS**

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**NJKiDS:** New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE:** The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA:** Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
