**JUNE 2023**

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

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**WFNJ/TANF**

- As of the end of June, the TANF caseload had increased by 431 cases, from 10,671 in June 2022 to 11,102 in June 2023; an increase of 4%.
- The counties with caseloads that increased the most since June 2022 were Bergen (47.3%), Essex (24.2%), and Sussex (15.4%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since June 2022 were Passaic (-14.9%), Atlantic (-14.1%), and Middlesex (-6.2%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 2,500 or 22.5% were child-only in June 2023.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (434), Hudson (325), and Essex (255).
- Hudson (4,843), Essex (4,426), and Camden (4,044) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in June 2023.

**NJ SNAP (Formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In June 2023, there were 410,859 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 12,157 or -2.9%, since June 2022.
- There were 792,088 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of June 2023; a decrease of 22,047 or -2.7% since June 2022.
- The counties having the highest SNAP caseload increase since June 2022 were Hunterdon (9.2%), Warren (7.5%), and Somerset (7.4%).
- The counties having the highest SNAP caseload decrease since June 2022 were Hudson (-10.7%), Passaic (-9.8%), and Atlantic (-9%).

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 1,475 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in June 2023; an increase of 88 or 6.3% since June 2022.
- In June 2023, EA payments were made for 615 SSI recipients.

**DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS  
JUNE 2023**

- There were 1,788 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in June 2023; a decrease of 244 or -12% since June 2022.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Cumberland (200%), Union (108.9%), and Atlantic (27%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Warren (-58.7%), Sussex (-55.6%), and Passaic (-46.8%).

**GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 16,164 to 10,411 since June 2022; a decrease of -35.6%.
- There were 6,629 Employable GA and 3,782 Unemployable GA cases in June 2023.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases was Somerset (0.4%) since June 2022.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since June 2022 were Passaic (-57.6%), Hudson (-51.5%), and Salem (-45.7%).
- In June 2023, GA cases showed a 1.54% increase since May 2023.

**CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (QUARTERLY REPORT)**

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$272 million from April 2023 to June 2023; a decrease of -2.62% over the same period from FFY 2022.
- Total distributions decreased -3.1% from June 2022.


**WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of June 2023, there were 532 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 149 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Hudson (95), Essex (82), and Mercer (59).
- There were 226 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.








Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period



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

**Statewide NJ SNAP Persons: JUNE 2021 Through JUNE 2023**





JUNE 2023 by County**









## **ACRONYMS**

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as NJ SNAP (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**NJKiDS:** New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE:** The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA:** Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
