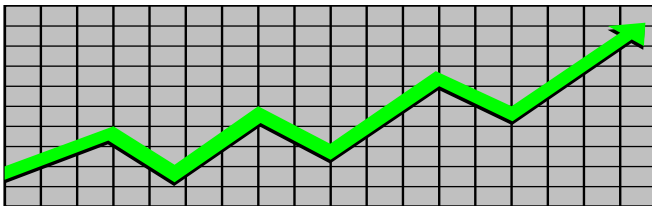

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DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS

JUNE 2026

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of June, the TANF caseload had decreased by 1183 cases, from 9,845 in June 2025 to 8,662 in June 2026; a decrease of -12%.
- The counties with caseloads that increased the most since June 2025 were Atlantic (13.3%), Burlington (7.3%), and Warren (7%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since June 2025 were Essex (-30.8%), Morris (-29.7%), and Union (-21.9%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 1,832 or 21.1% were child-only in June 2026.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (326), Hudson (248), and Mercer (156).
- Hudson (4,072), Camden (2,954), and Essex (2,144) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in June 2026.

NJ SNAP (Formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In June 2026, there were 402,893 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 32,458 or -7.5%, since June 2025.
- There were 739,593 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of June 2026; a decrease of 71,346 or -8.8% since June 2025.
- The county caseloads did not increase since June 2025
- The counties having the highest SNAP caseload decrease since June 2025 were Essex (-11.7%), Atlantic (-10.5%), and Hudson (-10.4%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 1,759 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in June 2026; an increase of 104 or 6.3% since June 2025.
- In June 2026, EA payments were made for 700 SSI recipients.

DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS JUNE 2026

- There were 3,256 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in June 2026; an increase of 313 or 10.6% since June 2025.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Salem (85.7%), Hudson (56.3%), and Essex (45.6%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Monmouth (-47.7%), Camden (-34.4%), and Middlesex (-18%).

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 18,288 to 17,655 since June 2025; a decrease of -3.5%.
- There were 12,669 Employable GA and 4,559 Unemployable GA cases in June 2026.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Essex (29.1%), Salem (12.7%), and Somerset (10.8%) since June 2025.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since June 2025 were Mercer (-21.1%), Atlantic (-18.1%), and Monmouth (-15.4%).
- In June 2026, GA cases showed a 0.36% increase since May 2026.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (QUARTERLY REPORT)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$266 million from April 2026 to June 2026; a decrease of -0.22% over the same period from FFY 2025.
- Total distributions decreased -0.8% from June 2025.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

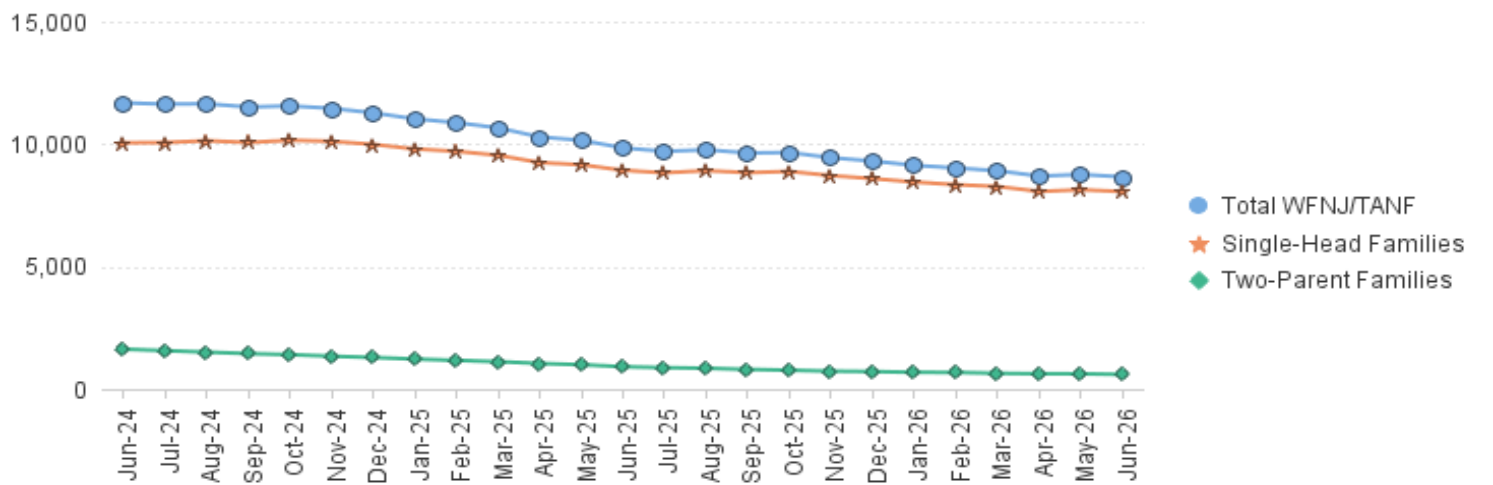
- During the report month of June 2026, there were 386 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 135 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (76), Camden (57), and Hudson (52).
- There were 206 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

JUNE 2024 THROUGH JUNE 2026



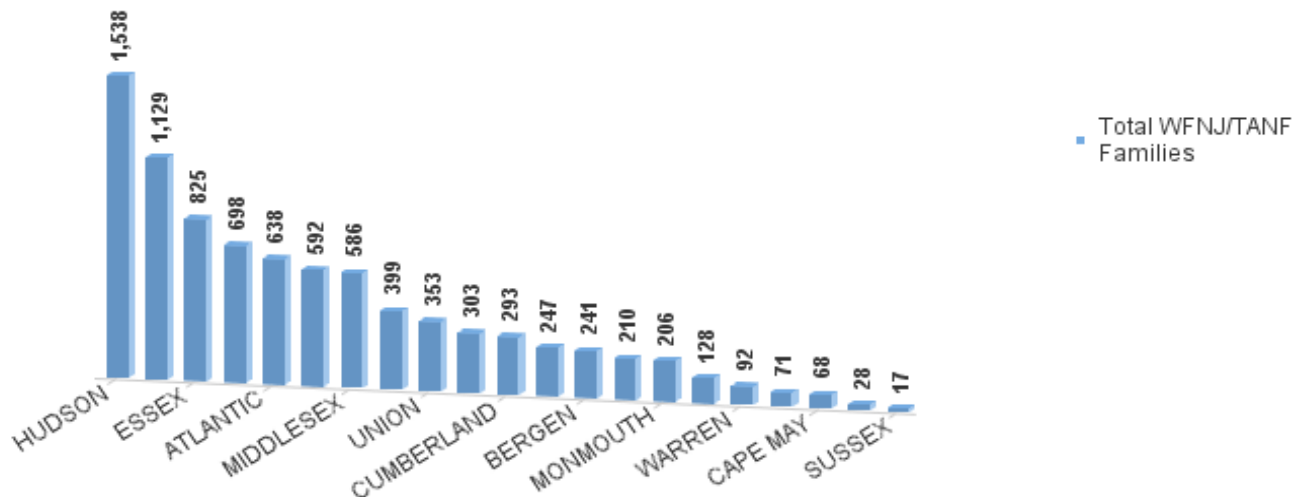

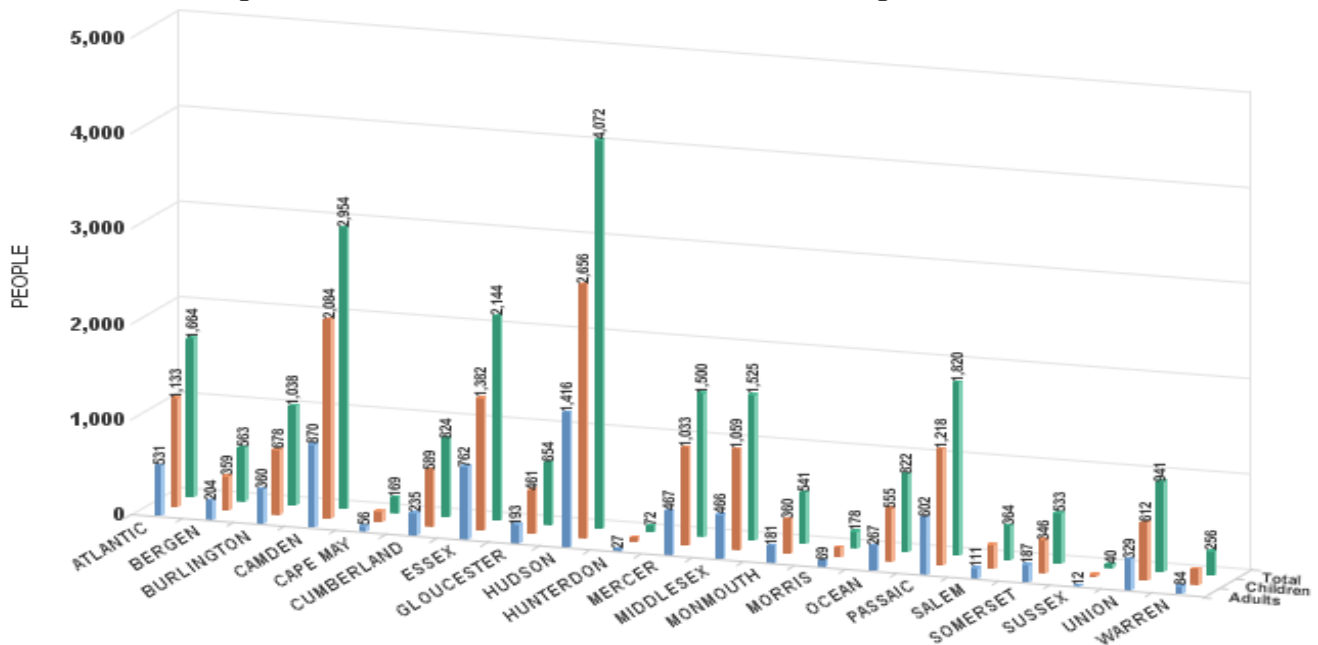

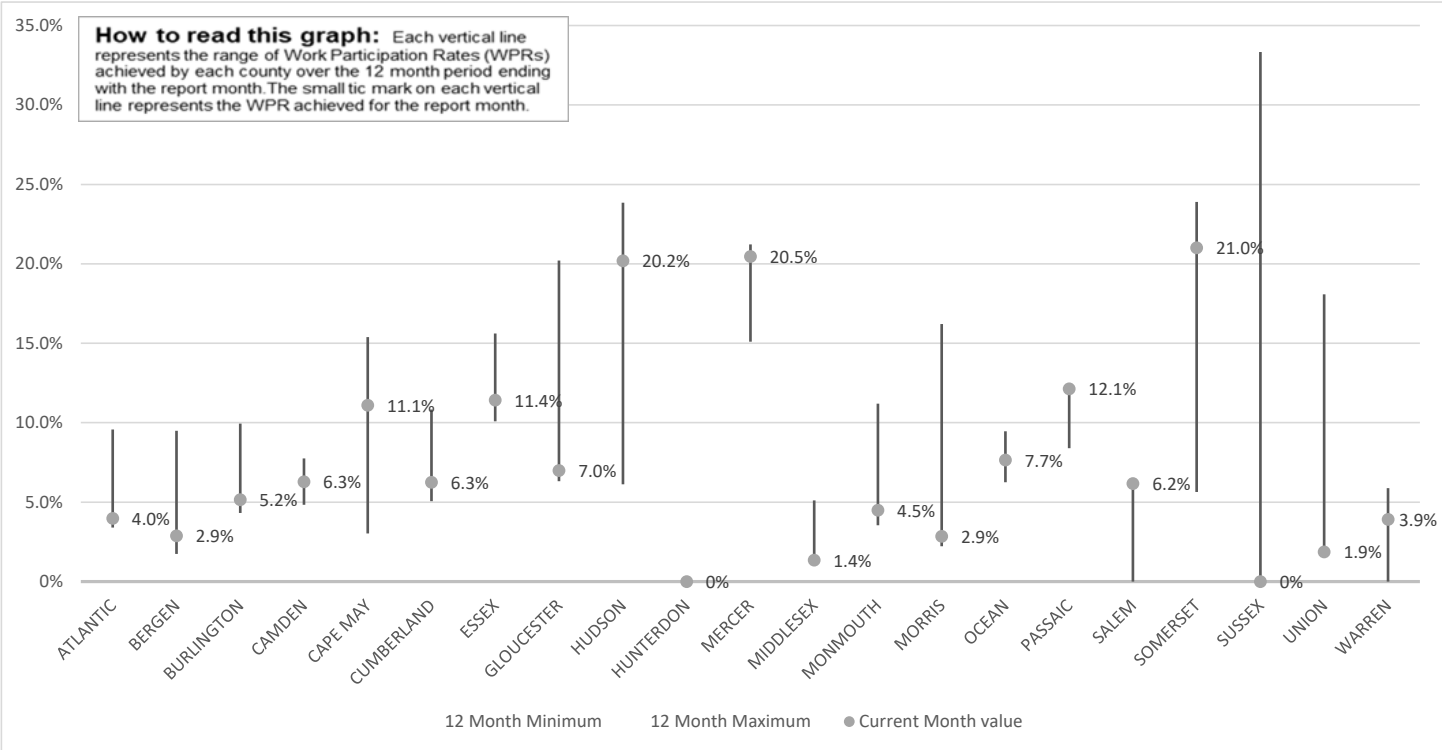

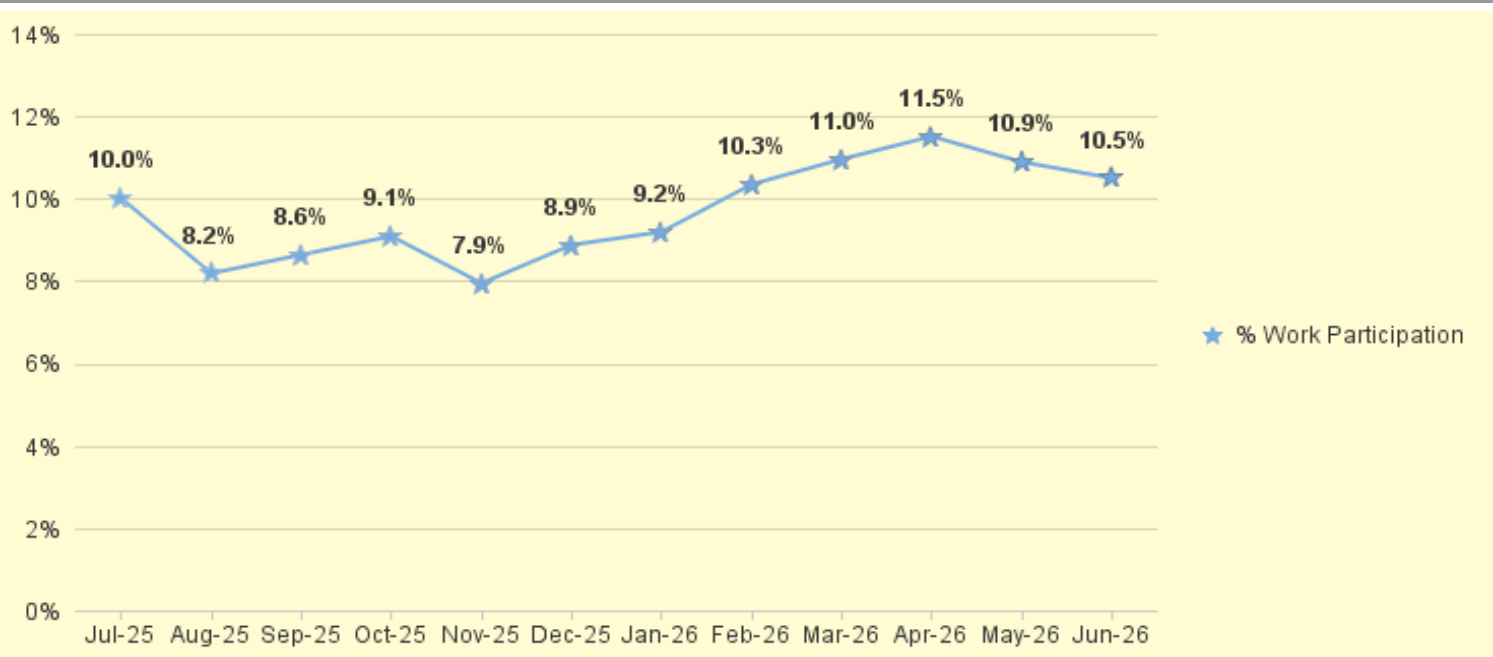
Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period

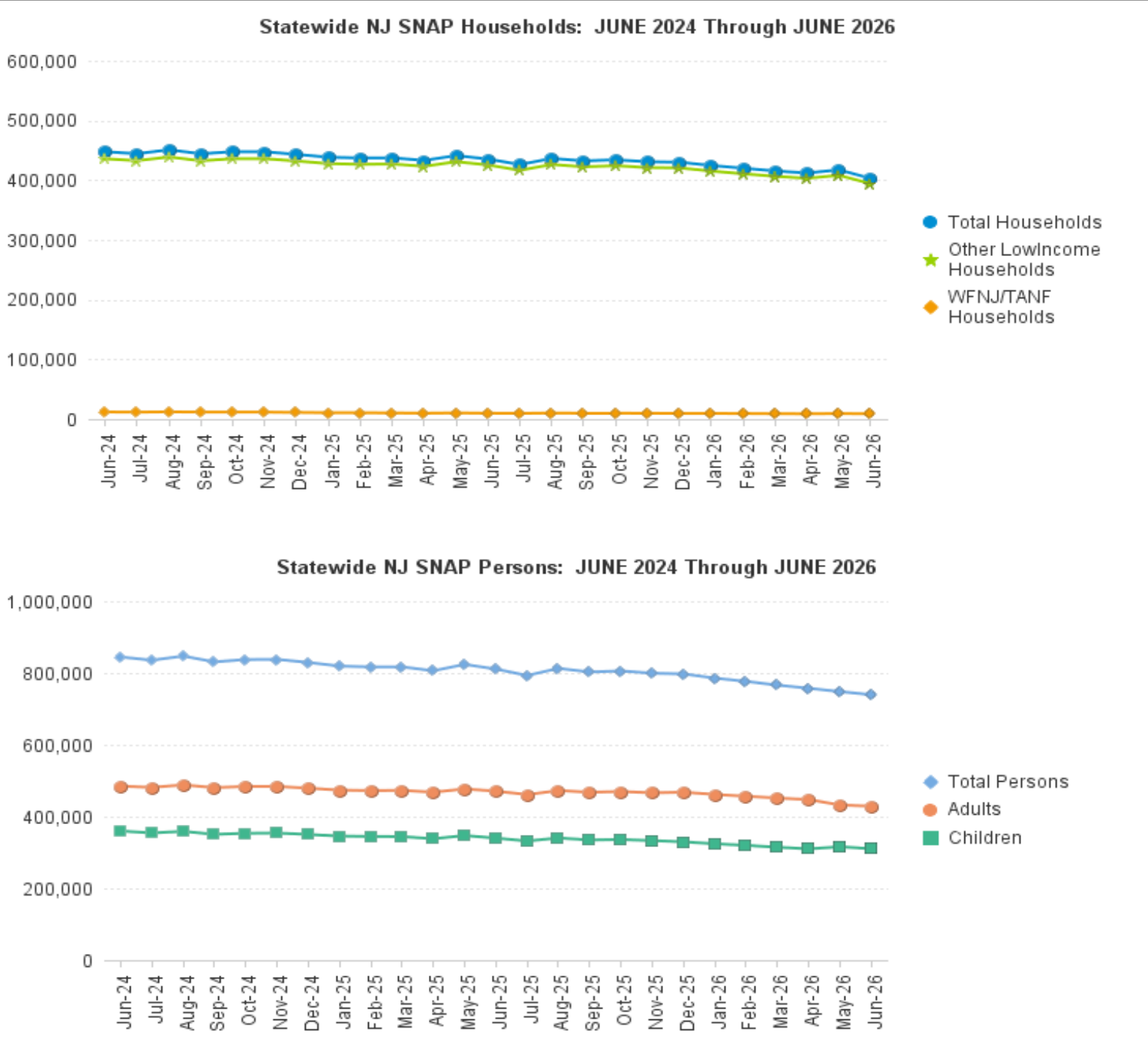

JUNE 2024 THROUGH JUNE 2026 (STATEWIDE)



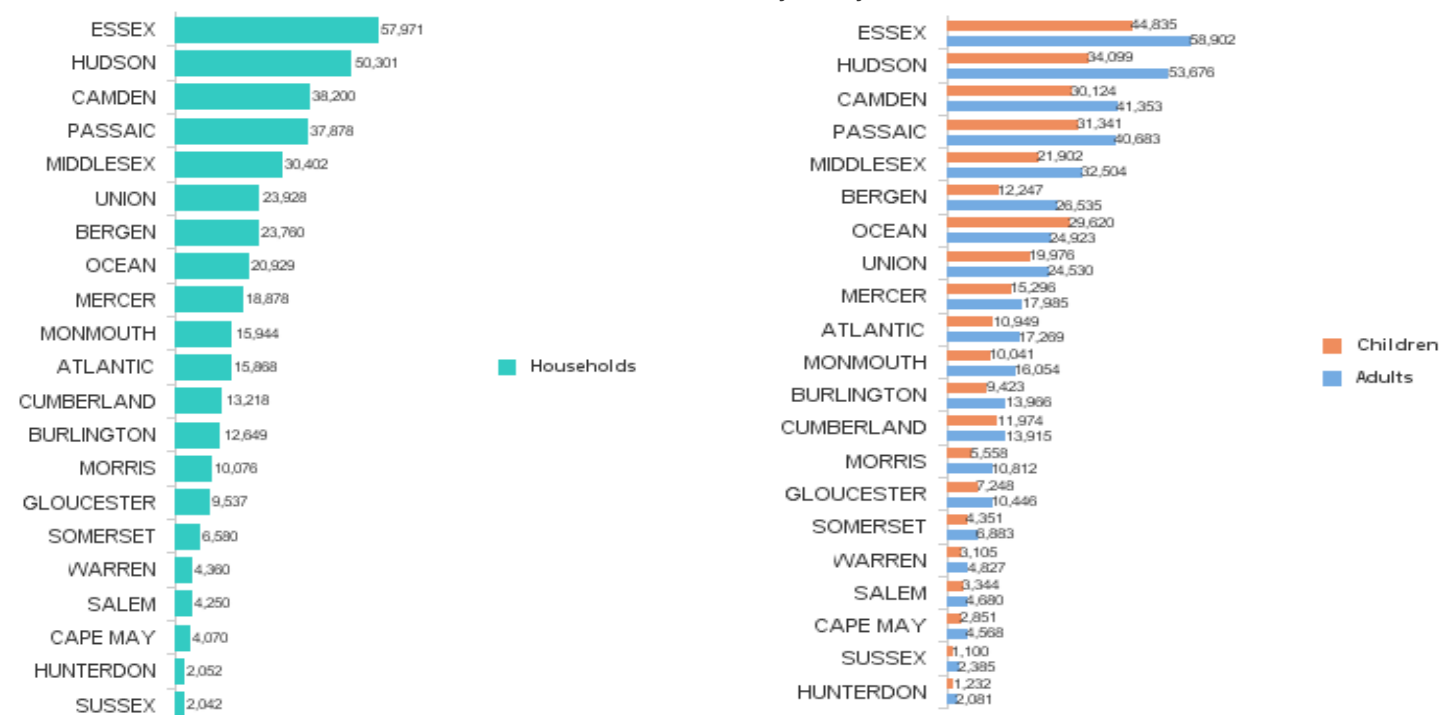

ACRONYMS

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as NJ SNAP (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
