Where do I go for more information about and support with enrolling as a NJ FamilyCare doula?

Medicaid MCO specific information: Each of our <u>NJ FamilyCare managed care plans</u> have designated contact persons for doulas contracting with their MCOs. Ask our Doula Guides to get the up-to-date MCO contacts' information.

Is any practicing doula eligible to become a NJ FamilyCare doula?

No. Doula must pass NJ FamilyCare's provider requirements. One of these requirements is that you must have completed your doula training from an approved program. There are two types of approved doula training programs:

- 1) Programs that are approved as is
- 2) Programs that are approved with additional trainings (approved supplemental community competency training, HIPAA training, and infant/adult CPT training).

How many applications will I need to complete to be a NJ FamilyCare provider?

You will first submit <u>the FFS application</u> to become a FFS "enrolled" doula who can serve our FFS members. We encourage you to join all five MCO networks so that you can serve any pregnant member with NJ FamilyCare.

Medicaid MCO specific information: To serve a specific MCO's members, you must complete that MCO's paperwork to become a "contracted" provider with that MCO. Contracting with each of our five MCOs involves five additional applications. Alternatively, you can become affiliated with a group provider with that MCO (e.g., a doula-only agency that has contracted with that MCO).

Note: A National Provider Identifier (NPI) is required as part of your FFS application. If you do not have this already, getting an NPI involves an additional application process that is run independently from NJ FamilyCare and our state.

Will any of the information that I provide on my application be public?

We encourage doulas to use their doula agency's contact information if they are affiliated with one.

Once enrolled in our FFS program, you will be listed on our <u>FFS Provider Directory</u>, a public directory specific to NJ FamilyCare. The contact information you provide on your FFS application will be listed so that members can contact you for services. For all doula providers, we will remove the street addresses but city, state, zip will remain.

Medicaid MCO specific information: When you become a contracted provider, you are listed in the MCO's NJ FamilyCare Provider Directory for all of that MCO's members. The contact information you provide on your MCO-specific paperwork will be listed. MCOs will remove the street addresses for all doula providers.

Note: A NPI is required as part of your FFS application and involves a separate application process. It is run independently from NJ FamilyCare and our state. Once you get an NPI, you will be listed on the NPPES NPI Registry, a public directory that lists all health providers within the U.S. that have received an NPI. The contact information you provide for your NPI application, and your NPI information (number, taxonomy) will be listed. Important! If you use your home address professionally for this applications, then it will be available to the public. Some doulas have opened professional PO Boxes to use in lieu of their home address, or have used their doula agency's contact information if they are affiliated with one.
