STATEMENT OF THE CASE

Respondent denied petitioner's Medicaid Only application for failure to provide the following evidence of eligibility under N.J.A.C. 10:71-2.2(e):

Applicant failed to disclose he was married at the time of the application

and in fact claimed to be single

The County's Asset Verification System disclosed M.A and his spouse were co-owners of two Bank of America accounts, ending with numbers 0433 and 3508

On March 1, 2024, M.A.'s former representative from M.A.'s nursing home produced

a letter indicating the accounts did not belong to M.A. On April 9, respondent denied

M.A.'s application having deemed M.A. did not provide sufficient verification of assets

within a reasonable time. M.A.'s 2nd application from October 29, 2024 is pending

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

I.

- ☒ I **FIND** that petitioner or petitioner's representative is **AUTHORIZED** to pursue this appeal; therefore, I **CONCLUDE** that standing is established.
- ☐ I **FIND** that petitioner or petitioner's representative is **NOT AUTHORIZED** to pursue this appeal; therefore, I **CONCLUDE** that standing is not been established.

- ☒ I **FIND** that petitioner did not timely provide all the required documentation under N.J.A.C. 10:71-2.2(e) and -2.3(a), and that no exceptional circumstances exist under N.J.A.C. 10:71-2.3(c); therefore, I **CONCLUDE** that the Medicaid Only application must be **DENIED** under N.J.A.C. 10:71-2.2(e).
- ☐ I **FIND** that petitioner did not timely provide all the required documentation under N.J.A.C. 10:71-2.2(e) and -2.3(a), but that exceptional circumstances exist under N.J.A.C. 10:71-2.3(c); therefore, I **CONCLUDE** that the time limit for verification must be **EXTENDED** under N.J.A.C. 10:71-2.3(c).

ADDITIONAL FINDINGS OF FACT/CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Even if at the time M.A.'s representative attempted to decline ownership of the two accounts, it was admitted at the hearing that divorce proceedings were ongoing between M.A. and his spouse and I **FIND** M.A. could have easily used his marital rights to compel disclosure of the disputed accounts so that the respondent could complete its duty of making a five year look back of M.A. assets.

I **CONCLUDE** that the combined nondisclosure of M.A.'s marital status and M.A.'s lack of cooperation to make even a minimum effort to provide a history of ownership of the accounts was a voluntary lack of cooperation perhaps motivated by transfer of his marital assets in contemplation of a divorce.

ORDER

I **ORDER** that:

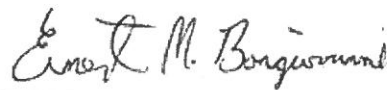
- ☐ Petitioner's appeal is **DISMISSED** because petitioner has no standing.

- ☐ The case be **RETURNED** to respondent for respondent to **PROCESS** the application to determine eligibility under N.J.A.C. 10:71.
