

The New Jersey Department of Health (DOH) Certificate of Need & Licensing (CN&L) issues licenses for **Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Fee for Service (FFS)** Treatment Facilities/Provider Agencies. The DHS/DMHAS operates a **SUD FFS Initiatives Network** of licensed SUD Provider Agencies contracted to provide SUD treatment through FFS reimbursement in various funding Initiatives. Access to network participation is through open enrollment as announced by DMHAS to eligible licensed providers.

Fee for Service is a method of reimbursement based on payment of published rates for specific services rendered to a client and their family. The contracted Provider Agencies in the Initiatives Network must secure Authorizations for American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) Levels of Care (LOC) and Enhancement Services, then submit claims for services rendered according to business rules and billing parameters.

Each Initiative offers a unique array of ASAM LOC and Enhancement Services to meet the program's goals and serve the target client population. The DMHAS SUD FFS Initiatives Network funds the following programs: Driving Under the Influence Initiative (DUII), Interim Services Initiative (ISI), Medication-Assisted Treatment Initiative (MATI), Mutual Agreement Program with State Parole Board (MAP/SPB), New Jersey Statewide Initiative (NJSI), Recovery Court Programs, State Hospital Access to Rehabilitation and Education (SHARE), South Jersey Initiative (SJI), and Substance Abuse Prevention & Treatment Initiative (SAPTI)
