NJPMP



- Established pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-45 et. seq.
- Overseen by the NJ Division of Consumer Affairs
- Statewide electronic database for collecting data from outpatient pharmacies on:
 - **Controlled Dangerous Substances (CDS)**
 - Schedules II, III, IV and V
 - **Human Growth Hormone Products**
 - **Gabapentin (May 7, 2018)**
- Operational since September 1, 2011

CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE ACT (CSA) SCHEDULING



Schedule	Definition	Examples
I	no currently accepted medical use and a high potential for abuse	heroin, marijuana
II	high potential for abuse, with use potentially leading to severe psychological or physical dependence	oxycodone, fentanyl, amphetamine
III	moderate to low potential for physical and psychological dependence	codeine*, ketamine, testosterone
IV	low potential for abuse and low risk of dependence	alprazolam, tramadol
V	lower potential for abuse than Schedule IV and consist of preparations containing limited quantities of certain narcotics	codeine*, pregabalin, diphenoxylate

NJPMP: PRESCRIBERS' REQUIREMENTS

- Prescribers are **encouraged** to access the NJPMP prior to prescribing any controlled dangerous substance (CDS) to review a patient's prescription history and risk alerts.
- Prescribers are **required** to access the NJPMP for a patient:
 - The **first time** that they prescribe: any Schedule II medication or opioid for acute or chronic pain or a Schedule III or IV benzodiazepine; and
 - Every **3 months** thereafter, if continuing to prescribe one of the above; and
 - **Any time** the patient appears to be seeking CDS for any purpose other than the treatment of an existing medical condition (misuse, abuse, or diversion).

NJPMP: PHARMACISTS' REQUIREMENTS

- Pharmacists are **encouraged** to access the NJPMP prior to every dispensation for a controlled dangerous substance (CDS) to review a patient's prescription history and risk alerts.
- Pharmacists are **required** to access the NJPMP if they have a reasonable belief that the patient may be seeking a controlled dangerous substance, in whole or in part, for any purpose other than the treatment of an existing medical condition, such as for purposes of misuse, abuse, or diversion.



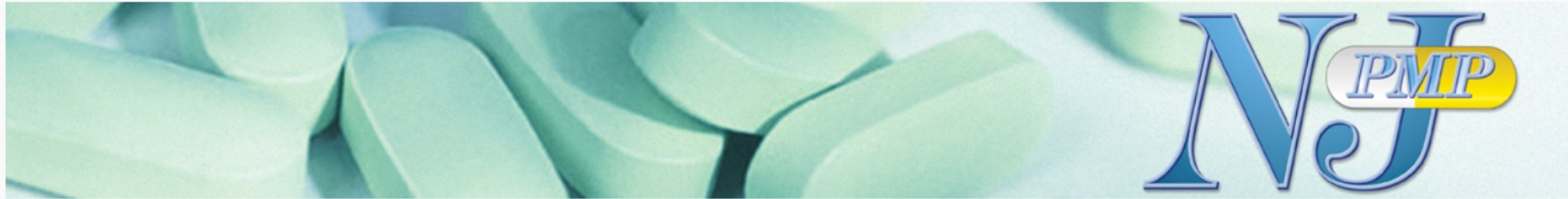

MENTAL HEALTH PRACTITIONERS & THE NJPMP



- The Division of Consumer Affairs shall now provide access to the New Jersey Prescription Monitoring Program to licensed mental health practitioners providing treatment for substance abuse to patients at a residential or outpatient substance abuse treatment center licensed by the Department of Health provided that the licensed mental health practitioner:
 1. Certifies that the request is for the purpose of providing health care to a current patient at a residential or outpatient substance abuse treatment center licensed by the Department of Health, or verifying information with respect to a patient or practitioner; and
 2. Provides the Division with the written consent of the patient for the mental health practitioner to obtain prescription monitoring information about the patient.
 - a. Patient consent shall be valid for the period of treatment by the mental health practitioner at the residential or outpatient substance abuse treatment center or for one year, whichever is less. After one year, the mental health practitioner shall re-obtain, and re-submit to the Division, the written consent of the patient.
- ***“Mental health practitioner” is defined as: a clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist, clinical alcohol and drug counselor, professional counselor, psychologist, or psychoanalyst***

NJ Prescription Monitoring Program

For Too Many New Jerseyans, Addiction Begins in the Medicine Cabinet

The New Jersey Prescription Monitoring Program (*NJPMP*) is an important component of the New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs' initiative to halt the abuse and diversion of prescription drugs.

Established pursuant to **N.J.S.A. 45:1-45 et. seq.**, the NJPMP is a statewide database that collects prescription data on Controlled Dangerous Substances (*CDS*), Human Growth Hormone (*HGH*), and gabapentin dispensed in outpatient settings in New Jersey, and by out-of-State pharmacies dispensing into New Jersey.

Pharmacies are required to report information to the NJPMP on a daily basis to the PMP Clearinghouse using the ASAP 4.2 format. Prescriptions must be reported to the database no more than one (1) business day after the date the prescription was dispensed.

The Division of Consumer Affairs and the NJPMP Administrator keep patient information strictly confidential, in compliance with the **Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) Privacy and Security Rules.**

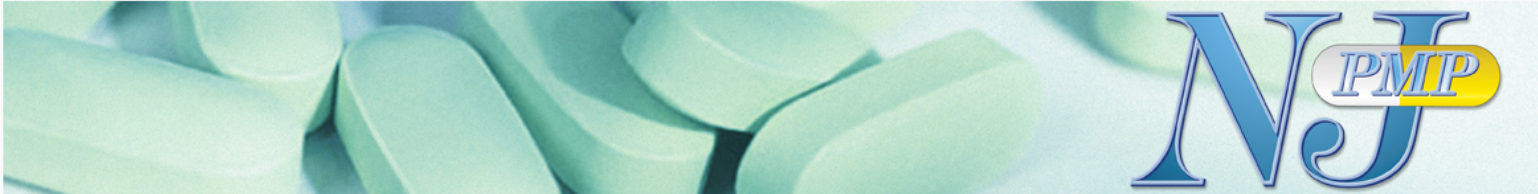

Mental Health Practitioners

The Division of Consumer Affairs (Division) shall provide access to the New Jersey Prescription Monitoring Program (NJPMP) to a **licensed mental health practitioner providing treatment for substance abuse to patients at a residential or outpatient substance abuse treatment center licensed by the Department of Health** provided that the licensed mental health practitioner:

- Certifies that the request is for the purpose of providing health care to a current patient at a residential or outpatient substance abuse treatment center licensed by the Department of Health, or verifying information with respect to a patient or practitioner; and
- Provides the Division with the written consent of the patient for the mental health practitioner to obtain prescription monitoring information about the patient.
 - Patient consent shall be valid for the period of treatment by the mental health practitioner at the residential or outpatient substance abuse treatment center or for one year, whichever is less. After one year, the mental health practitioner shall re-obtain, and re-submit to the Division, the written consent of the patient.

“Mental Health Practitioner” is defined as:

- Clinical Social Worker
- Marriage and Family Therapist
- Clinical Alcohol and Drug Counselor
- Professional Counselor
- Psychologist
- Psychoanalyst.

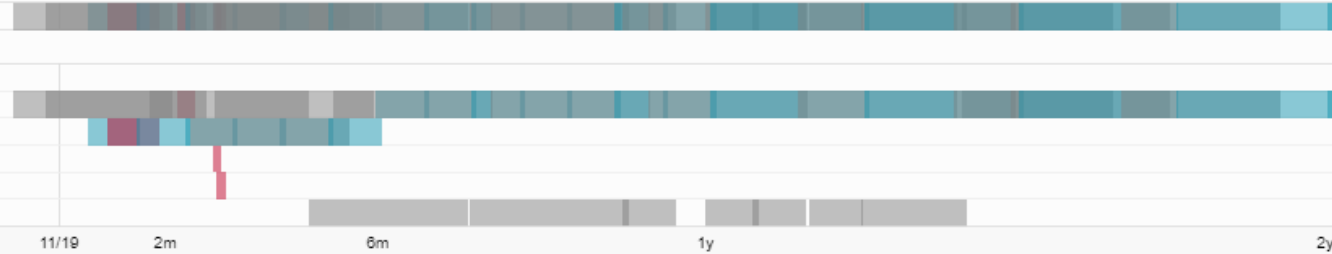

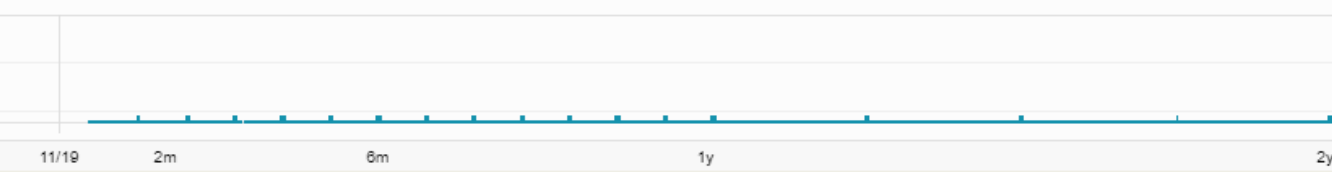
Buprenorphine mg



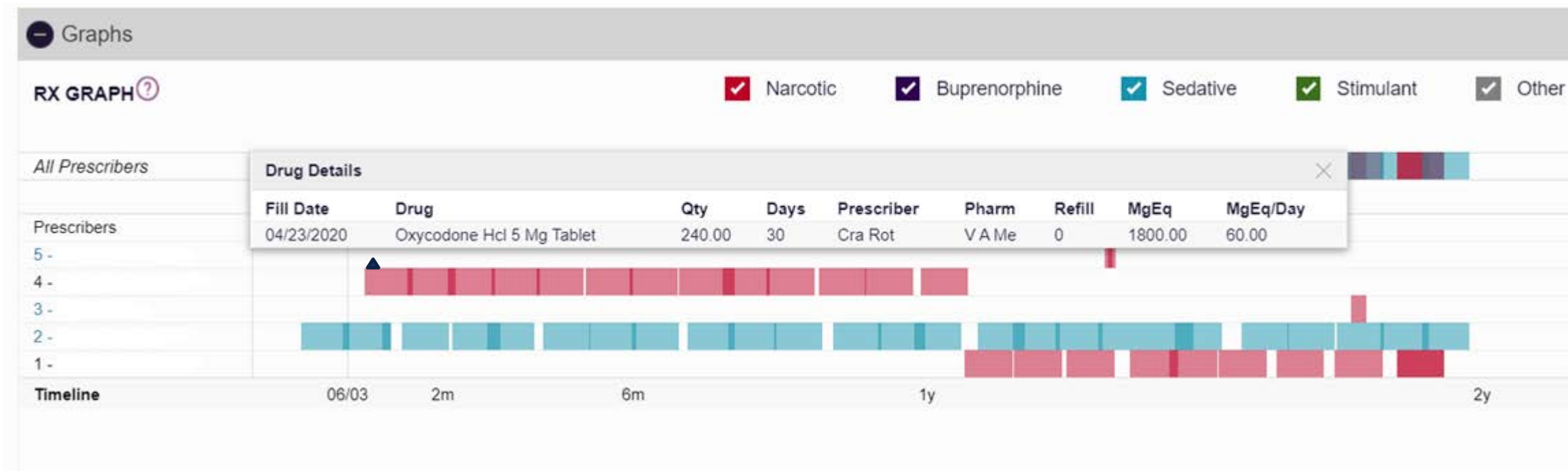
Morphine MgEq (MME)



Lorazepam MgEq (LME)

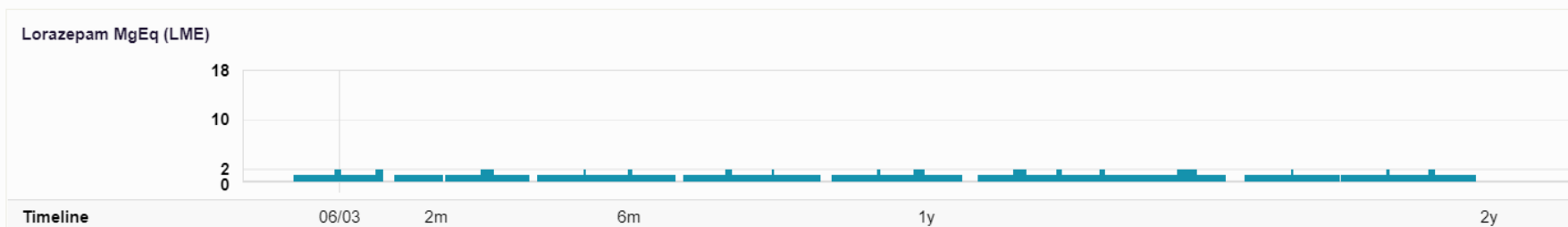
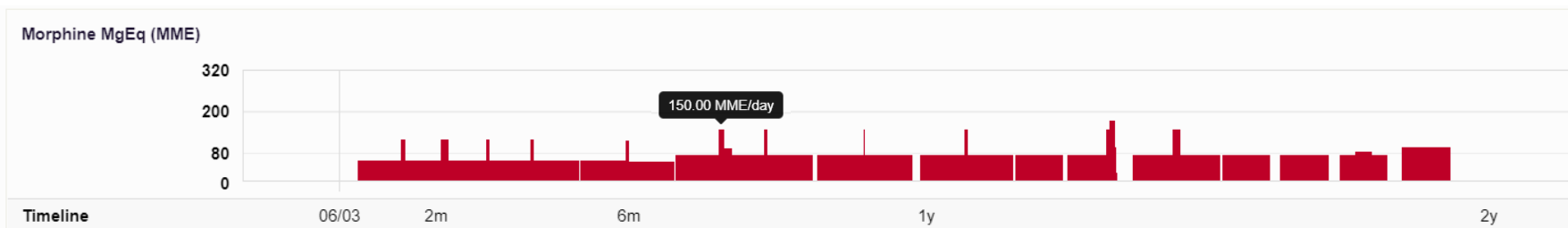


NJPMP: INTERACTIVE RX GRAPH

Buprenorphine products have no agreed upon morphine equivalency, and as partial opioid agonists, are not expected to be associated with overdose risk in the same dose-dependent manner as doses for full agonist opioids. MME = morphine milligram equivalents. LME = Lorazepam milligram equivalents. mg = dose in milligrams.

Prescription opioids carry serious risks of addiction and overdose, especially with prolonged use. An opioid overdose often results in slowed breathing, loss of consciousness, and death. The use of prescription opioids can have a number of side effects as well, such as what is shown on the right.

- Drowsiness—feeling too light-headed to drive or operate machinery
