NJ Emergency Medical Services (EMS)/Law Enforcement (LE) Naloxone Incidents Trends and Demographics, 2019-2023

Introduction

- With overdoses claiming over 3,000 lives in New Jersey (NJ) in 2022, innovative strategies and data resources are needed to curb the overdose epidemic.
- Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel and law enforcement (LE) officers are often the first to respond to an opioid overdose incident.
- Records from these encounters provide local data on suspected opioid overdoses in NJ that are essential for overdose surveillance and prevention.




Methodology

- NJDOH analyzed 67,885 EMS and LE naloxone incidents in New Jersey that occurred between January 1, 2019 to December 31, 2023.
- A naloxone incident is defined as a patient who received at least one dose of naloxone in one encounter by EMS or LE. Naloxone incidents were used as a proxy to measure suspected opioid overdoses.



Percentage of EMS/LE Naloxone Incidents by Time of Day, 2019-2023




■ 2019 ■ 2020 ■ 2021 ■ 2022 ■ 2023

Percentage of EMS/LE Naloxone Incidents by Day of the Week, 2019-2023



Percentage of EMS/LE Naloxone Incidents by Seasons in New Jersey, 2019-2023





February); Spring (March, April, May), and Summer (June, July, August).




Percentage of Naloxone Incidents by Sex in New Jersey, 2019-2023


Percentage of EMS/LE Naloxone Incidents by Age Categories in New Jersey, 2019-2023

Percentage of EMS/LE Naloxone Incidents by Race, 2019-2023




Non-Hispanic White Non-Hispanic Black Hispanic


Comparison of EMS/LE Naloxone Incidents by Age and Race, 2019 and 2023



Note: Percentages may not add up to 100% per year since the percentage of the Under 18 was not added to the chart. The group made up less than 1% in both years.




Percentage of EMS/LE Naloxone Incidents by Disposition in New Jersey, 2019-2023






Percentage of EMS/LE Naloxone Incidents by New Jersey Counties, 2019-2023 (pt1)
