As of May 2017, there were 76,509 treatment admissions and 74,291 discharges in 2016 reported to the New Jersey Department of Human Services, Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services by substance abuse treatment providers. 



#### 2016 Burlington Substance Abuse Admissions by Municipality of Residence




