SUBJECT: Uniform Code for Medical Security Officers Employed by  
the Forensic Psychiatric Hospital.

Applicability: H

I. Purpose

To establish a standardized code for the wearing of uniforms by  
Medical Security Officers at the Forensic Psychiatric Hospital.

II. Uniform Code

The following listing of clothing items shall represent the uniform  
to be worn by Medical Security Officers while on duty at the Forensic  
Psychiatric Hospital:


- Dark navy trouser 100% texturized (texturized) poly uniform  
pants/skirt, pants ladies.
- White uniform shirt (long or short sleeve) with M.S.O. emblem.
- Navy tie, hook-on for men; cross-cross for ladies (October 15  
through April 15).
- Black leather belt.
- Black shoes for men; black/navy for ladies.
- Black socks.
- Black and white name pin.
- Silver badge, chain, whistle, bar and N.J. initials.
- Key guards.
- Dark navy texturized (texturized) poly cardigan sweater button front.
- Navy regulation uniform jacket-winter.
- Navy light-weight jacket-summer.
- Navy wide brim felt hat for men.

III. Purchase of Required Clothing Items

The clothing listed under Section II of this Administrative Bulletin  
shall be purchased by Medical Security Officers with funds received  
in the form of annual clothing allowances.

IV. Changes to the Uniform Code

Medical Security Officers may petition the Division of Mental Health  
and Hospitals for changes in the Uniform Code as changes are  
deemed necessary.
