CUBAN, HAITIAN, NICARAGUAN AND VENEZUELAN (CHNV) SUPPORTER-BASED PAROLE PROCESS

for supporters and beneficiaries in New Jersey

Cubans, Haitians, Nicaraguans, Venezuelan parolees arriving through the supporter-based parole process announced by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security are eligible for the following benefit programs and assistance:

NOTE - While all beneficiaries who enter through this supporter-based process are eligible to apply for work authorizations and social security numbers, Nicaraguan and Venezuelan parolees are not currently eligible for ORR-funded refugee benefits and services.

Eligibility for public benefits (TANF, Medicaid, and SNAP) includes financial and other non-financial factors such as eligible immigration status. Immigration eligibility for those granted humanitarian parole remains while they have parole status and until the end of the parole term unless amended by law or if the individual gains other eligible immigration status. Please check eligibility requirements online.
