



reject, or modify the Initial Decision within 45 days of the agency's receipt. The Initial Decision in this case was received on November 10, 2014.

At issue is a one-month and eight day penalty imposed due to Petitioner's transfers totaling \$10,000. Petitioner bears the burden of proof to demonstrate that she received fair market value for the assets transferred. N.J.A.C.10:71-4.10(j). Petitioner offered no corroborating evidence with regard to the nature of the transfers at issue. Petitioner was unable to rebut the presumption that the transfers were for less than fair market value. Accordingly, the ALJ found that the Camden County Board of Social Services properly considered the \$10,000 transfer of assets and affirmed the transfer penalty.

After reviewing the record, I concur with the ALJ's finding and ADOPT the Initial Decision in its entirety.

THEREFORE, it is on this 4<sup>th</sup> day of DECEMBER, 2014,

ORDERED:

That the Initial Decision affirming the transfer penalty is hereby ADOPTED.
