Federal Standards Statement

The Department of Human Services, in accordance with 42 CFR 431.10 and Section 1902(a)(5) of the Social Security Act, is the single State agency designated for the administration of the New Jersey Medicaid and NJ FamilyCare program.

Title XXI of the Social Security Act allows states to establish a State Children's Health Insurance Program (SCHIP) for targeted low-income children. New Jersey elected this option through implementation of the NJ FamilyCare program. Section 2103, 42 U.S.C. § 1937(c) provides broad coverage requirements for this program.

Under authority of N.J.S.A. 30:4D-1 et seq., the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services (DMAHS) is authorized to administer the Medicaid program. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 30:4J-8 et seq., DMAHS is also authorized to administer the NJ FamilyCare program.

The Department has determined that the readopted rules do not exceed Federal standards. Therefore, a Federal standards analysis is not required.
