7:45-1.3 Definitions

As used in this chapter, the following words and terms shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

...
“Review Zone” means that region designated by the Commission appertaining to, and including, the Park in which proposed projects may cause an adverse drainage, aesthetic, or other ecological impact on the Park. The Review Zone includes subzones designated as Zone A and Zone B as follows:

1. Zone A is the area within 1,000 feet on either side of the center line of the Canal except in the **Municipality of Princeton** [Township] where the west bank of Carnegie Lake shall be the boundary of Zone A, and where the Raritan River is within 1,000 feet, its furthest bank being the boundary. If any part of a project site is within Zone A, then the entire project shall be considered to be in Zone A; and
2. Zone B is the balance of the Review Zone.

The Review Zone is delineated on maps available for review at the Commission’s office in Stockton, New Jersey. It can also be viewed on the Department’s digital map at www.state.nj.us/dep <https://www.nj.gov/dep/gis/geoweb splash.htm>. All or parts of the following counties and municipalities are included in the Review Zone:

In Hunterdon County: Delaware, East Amwell, Franklin, Kingwood, Lambertville, Raritan, Stockton, West Amwell.

In Mercer County: East Windsor, Ewing, Hamilton, Hightstown, Hopewell Borough, Hopewell Township, Lawrence, Pennington, **Municipality of Princeton** [Borough, Princeton Township], Trenton, [Washington,] **Robbinsville Township**, West Windsor.

In Middlesex County: Cranbury, Monroe, New Brunswick, North Brunswick, Plainsboro, South Brunswick.

In Monmouth County: Millstone.

In Somerset County: Franklin, Hillsborough, Manville, Millstone, Montgomery, Rocky Hill, South Bound Brook.

SUBCHAPTER 5. GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR GENERAL PERMITS

7:45-5.2 Using a general permit to authorize specific projects

(a) To apply for authorization under a general permit, an applicant shall submit the following:

1. An application form. The application form requires basic information regarding the applicant and the proposed project, such as the name and address of the applicant and any designated agents, the specific location of the project, other types of governmental permits that may be required of the applicant for the project, and a brief description of the proposed project. TSS reduction shall be calculated based on the removal rates for the BMPs in Table 2 below. N.J.A.C. 10:46D-3.2

Effective Date: January 1, 2023.

Take notice that, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 10:46D-3.2, the Department of Human Services (Department) announces that the following family maintenance standard (N.J.A.C. 10:46D-3.2(a)), medical cost standard (N.J.A.C. 10:46D-3.2(a)), tuition deduction standard (N.J.A.C. 10:46D-3.2(a) and (f)), and the cost of care and maintenance rates shall be utilized in the determination of eligibility and the contribution to care and maintenance of individuals residentially placed by the Division of Developmental Disabilities and their legally responsible relatives for the period beginning January 1, 2023. The approved calendar year 2023 patient payment per diem rate for State developmental centers is \$1,376. The approved calendar year 2023 patient payment per diem rate for residential functional services is \$390.00. These changes are effective January 1, 2023. This notice of administrative changes is published pursuant to N.J.A.C. 1:30-2.7.

SUBCHAPTER 3. TREASURY FORMULA-DDD

10:46D-3.2 DDD Formula B-DDD(B) for individuals under age 18

(a) This section shall apply to the individual under age 18 being served, LRR(s) or any other person responsible for the estate of such individual and/or LRR(s). The family maintenance standard for a family of four, for calendar year [2022] **2023**, is \$[35,639]**38,627**, the medical cost standard for a family of four is \$[9,287]**10,287**, and the tuition deduction shall be

revised annually, using the Consumer Price Index figures then applicable and the cost for in-State tuition at Rutgers, the State University (\$[12,536]**12,900** for school year [2021-22] **2022-23**). These revisions shall be published annually by the Department as public notices in the New Jersey Register. Additionally, the Department shall publish in the New Jersey Register, the cost of care and maintenance rates as established by the Commissioner.

(f) The deduction for college tuition shall be the actual college tuition cost paid, but shall not exceed the maximum of the annual in-State tuition expenses for Rutgers University. The deduction shall be the net of any scholarships, awards, or grants, and shall cover tuition paid, but shall not cover such items as room, board, books, and lab fees. The maximum college tuition deduction for school year [2021-2022] **2022-2023** is \$[12,536]**12,900**. This shall be revised annually as required at (a) above.

Take notice that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1, the rules at N.J.A.C. 11:24C were scheduled to expire on April 15, 2023.

The rules at N.J.A.C. 11:24C govern managed care plans regulated by the Department of Banking and Insurance (Department). The rules provide a universal application and renewal form for physicians seeking to participate in a carrier’s provider network; establish standards for carriers offering managed care plans for hemophilia treatment and for all persons desiring to contract with carriers for the provision of home treatment services for bleeding episodes associated with hemophilia; require that carriers’ managed care plans provide certain benefits or services for hemophilia treatment; set forth the fines and penalties that may be imposed upon a carrier pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:2S-16 for violations of the rules; and set forth requirements for provider networks and establish standards relating to any agreements entered into between carriers and health care providers, including provider reimbursement.

The Department has reviewed these rules and has determined that the rules continue to be necessary, reasonable, and proper for the purpose for which they were originally promulgated. Therefore, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1.c(1), these rules are readopted without change and shall continue in effect for a seven-year period.
