The Department of Labor and Workforce Development (Department or respondent) issued a Notice of Intent to post the name of InvaTech Pharma Solutions, LLC (InvaTech or petitioner) on the Workplace Accountability in Labor List (WALL), pursuant to N.J.S.A. 34:1A-1.16(b) and N.J.A.C. 12:8-3.1. Under the afore-cited statute and rule, the Department is empowered to post to a list on its website of persons prohibited from contracting with any public body, the name of any person, company corporate officer or principal, firm, association, corporation, contractor, subcontractor or other entity engaged in contracting, found to be in violation of any State wage, benefit, or tax laws and against whom a final order has been issued by the Commissioner of the Department, or any other appropriate agency officer, for a violation of any State wage, benefit, or tax law. Petitioner appealed the Notice of Intent to post its name on the WALL. The Department transmitted the matter to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL), where it was scheduled for a hearing before Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Mamta Patel. The record before the OAL reflects that petitioner failed to appear at two scheduled conferences on April 20, 2026 and May 12, 2026, and did not offer a good cause explanation for its non-appearance. Thus, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 1:1-14.4(c)(2), the ALJ refused to schedule the matter for a hearing and issued an initial decision pursuant to N.J.A.C. 1:1-3.3(b), returning the matter to the Department for appropriate disposition. Petitioner filed no exceptions to the initial decision of the ALJ and, to date, has failed to offer a good

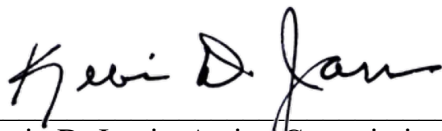
cause explanation for its failure to appear at the scheduled pre-hearing conferences. As a result, I find that the appeal of this matter should be dismissed.

ORDER

Therefore, it is hereby ordered that the appeal of InvaTech be dismissed and that InvaTech's name be placed on the WALL pursuant to N.J.S.A. 34:1A-1.16(b).

This is the final administrative determination in this matter. Any further review should be pursued in a judicial forum
