#### **Policy Overview**

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Sec. 3(36) defines the term "low-income individual" for the purposes of eligibility; this definition includes the following: An individual who is in a family with total family income that does not exceed the higher of the poverty line, or 70 percent of the lower living standard income level. The Poverty Guideline for a single person is higher than the Lower Living Standard Income Level for a single person; in all other cases, the Lower Living Standard Income Level is the higher figure.

To facilitate the determination of low-income status for Adults and Youth under WIOA, we are forwarding the 2025 Poverty Guidelines and the 2025 Health and Human Services (HHS) Lower Living Standard Income Levels (LLSILs).
