Foot Notes:

Occupations that do not normally work 2,080 hours per year will have a "Salary" but the equivalent "Hourly" wage will be blank. Examples include many teaching occupations, musicians, producers/directors, pilots and airline attendants, to name a few.

The mean wage equals the weighted average wage. Wages are not publishable when there is a quality issue or there is an employer-confidentiality issue. In these instances, all hourly and salary columns will be blank.

The 25th percentile is an estimate of the wage that 25% of the employees reported in the occupation made less than while 75% made more. Likewise for the estimates of the 50th percentile (50% made less and 50% made more) and the 75th percentile (75% made less and 25% made more).

* Estimated Employment is not the reported employment for the occupation, but rather represents an estimate of the number of employees in that occupation in the defined geographic area and industry. Rounded to the nearest 10, this column will be blank in instances where (a) the employment's relative standard error is greater than 50%, or (b) when there are an insufficient number of employers / employment to guarantee employer confidentiality.
