PREFACE

New Jersey Trends In Employment & Wages is an annual publication, which reports comprehensive employment and wage data for those employers covered under the New Jersey unemployment insurance program. The publication provides employment and wage data by major industry and industry sector for the state and the counties.

This is the first Trends In Employment & Wages publication based on the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). NAICS is replacing the Standard Industry Classification (SIC) system as the industrial classification system for the United States. The origins of NAICS trace back to the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) between the United States, Canada, and Mexico. NAICS provides a common and consistent classification system between the three countries. NAICS also provides improved measurement of new and emerging industries.

NAICS uses a production-oriented approach to categorize economic units. Units with similar production processes are classified in the same industry. NAICS focuses on how products and services are created, as opposed to the SIC focus on what is produced. This approach yields significantly different industry groupings than those produced by the SIC approach.

NAICS provides data users with new industrial groupings that better reflect the workings of the US and New Jersey economies and will allow for the improved measurement of new industries. For example, a new industry sector called Information brings together units that turn information into a commodity with units that distribute the commodity and units that provide information services. Information's major components are publishing, broadcasting, telecommunications, information services, and data processing. Under the SIC system, these units were spread across the Manufacturing, Communications, Business Services, and Amusement Services groups. Another new sector of interest is Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services. This sector is comprised of establishments engaged in activities where human capital is the major input.

Some industry sectors such as Construction will show little employment difference under NAICS than under the SIC system. However, an industry such as Manufacturing is likely to show a dramatic change. For example, companies in the pharmaceutical industry have been classified in Manufacturing under SIC, whether or not the locations were engaged in

actual manufacturing production. Under NAICS, employment at pharmaceutical corporate headquarters will now become part of a new service-providing sector Management of Companies and Enterprises, while employment at pharmaceutical research and development facilities will become part of the Professional, Scientific and Technical Services sector. While the shift of employment to these new sectors will result in lower manufacturing employment numbers under NAICS, the level of total industry employment will remain the same.

The 2001 publication presents statewide private sector annual average employment and wages at the two, three and four digit NAICS industry level. County data is presented at the two and three digit level. Data for federal, state and local government appear on separate tables.

Before using this data to make historical comparisons or in time series analysis, the reader should refer to the technical notes at the end of this publication for appropriate data limitations. Due to major differences in NAICS and SIC structures, data for 2001 is not comparable to the SIC-based data for earlier years. Additionally, for data prior to 2001, changes in unemployment insurance coverage make some data noncomparable over time.

EMPLOYMENT AND WAGE HIGHLIGHTS, 2001

Due to the national recession, New Jersey employment covered by state and federal unemployment insurance programs fell slightly (-1,800) from 2000 to 2001, reaching an annual average level of 3,875,600. This was the first over-the-year loss after eight consecutive years of employment growth, which began following the end of the 1990-91 national recession. Despite the loss, New Jersey employers have expanded payrolls by more than 506,000 jobs since 1992. In 2001, about 13,200 additions to public sector payrolls were more than offset by the contraction of approximately 15,000 jobs in the private sector. Most of the job gains in the public sector came from increases at the local level.

This is the first Trends In Employment & Wages publication based on the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). NAICS is replacing the Standard Industry Classification (SIC) system as the industrial classification system for the United States. Due to major differences in NAICS and SIC structures, industry data for 2001 is not comparable to the SIC-based data for earlier years, except for total and private sector covered employment. See the preface of this report for a further explanation.

In 2001, on an annual average basis, the most private sector jobs were in the retail trade sector (+455,400); followed by health care and social assistance (+400,500), manufacturing (+393,400), professional and technical services (+273,600), accommodation and food services (+255,700), administrative and waste services (+245,700) and wholesale trade (+237,300).

On an annual average basis, 15 of the state's 21 counties showed private sector job gains between 2000 and 2001. The largest of these occurred in Monmouth (+6,600), Burlington (+6,600), Middlesex (+6,500), Ocean (+4,100) and Mercer (+3,500) counties. Declines were posted by Passaic (-3,200), Essex (-3,000), Hudson (-1,900), Union (-1,000) and Sussex (-300) counties, while Salem County was virtually unchanged over the 2000-2001 period. Bergen County (408,997) was home to more private sector jobs than any other New Jersey county while mainly rural Salem County had the fewest number of private sector jobs (17,434).

Annual average wages for all workers covered by state and federal unemployment insurance programs in 2001 rose to \$44,322 — a 1.5 percent increase over the 2000 average.

TECHNICAL NOTES AND DEFINITIONS

Covered Employment is a monthly count of full and part-time employees, who earned wages during the pay period, which includes the 12th of the month, as reported quarterly by employers covered by the New Jersey Unemployment Compensation Law. Basically, any employer paying at least \$1,000 in wages in the current or preceding calendar year is covered. Jobs not covered by the law fall mainly into the categories of self-employed and unpaid family workers or certain agricultural and in-home domestic workers.

For a more detailed description of the exclusions to covered employment, refer to the appendix.

Since the data represent the aggregate number of jobs reported by individual employers at the workplace, the total job count does not necessarily correspond with the number of actual persons holding jobs.

In the case of workers employed by more than one covered employer during the reference period, a slight overcount in workers will exist. Conversely, during the course of a year, there may be more workers than jobs due to turnover.

Companies, Establishments and Units

The data in this publication are tabulated on an establishment or unit, as opposed to a company, basis. The terms "establishment" and "unit," for purposes of this publication, should be considered synonymous. An establishment, as defined in the 2002 NAICS Manual, is generally a single physical location, where business is conducted or where services or industrial operations are performed. Although an establishment may be identical with the enterprise (company), the two terms should not be confused. An enterprise may consist of more than one establishment, which may be in different locations. Such multiunit enterprises may have establishments in more than one industry in NAICS. If such enterprises have a separate establishment primarily engaged in providing headquarters services, these establishments are classified in NAICS Sector 55, Management of Companies and Enterprises.

To the extent possible, the data are collected and tabulated on an establishment basis for those companies having more than one establishment or unit operating in New Jersey. Reporting and data collection difficulties sometimes present problems in adequately distributing the data for the individual establishments of multi-location companies.

Undistributed Data

Employer data that could not be assigned to a specific area of the state are labeled "undistributed" in the area tables. Included in this category are statewide sales jobs and promotional agents; service and route persons; short-term contractual workers; and all other covered workers whose place of work could not be precisely determined. The table following employment at the county level shows the industry breakdown of those undistributed jobs.

Inconsistencies in Historical Series

Before undertaking any analysis of covered employment data, users should consider the impact that legal and definitional changes, industry classification system changes (conversion from SIC to NAICS), imperfect employer input and confidentiality provisions have on the data. Moreover, since covered employment data are collected primarily for unemployment tax administration purposes, no attempt are made to revise previously released data.

The New Jersey laws defining covered employment have been amended on several occasions. A significant change occurred in 1969 when coverage was expanded to include employers with one or more employees rather than four or more employees. This change increased the number of covered reporting units by approximately 64 percent and added approximately 6.5 percent to covered employment totals. In 1972, non-profit organizations meeting similar requirements were extended coverage and in 1978, virtually all state and local government workers and certain domestic and agricultural workers were added to covered employment. In May 1981, all employees of elementary and secondary schools operating under a church charter were dropped from UI coverage. This change resulted in a loss of approximately 10,000 jobs and 500 units in educational service between September 1980 and September 1981.

Another inconsistency is introduced by periodic changes in industry codes and classification systems for data previous to 2001. The Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual used to code business activities has been revised on five occasions since 1941. Beginning with 1988, covered employment statistics are classified under definitions established with the 1987 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual, and may not be strictly comparable to data for prior periods.

Beginning with 2001, covered employment statistics are classified using the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS), which are not directly comparable with SIC classifications (see preface for an explanation of NAICS).

Confidentiality Provisions

Because the release of data identifiable to individual employers or employing establishments is generally prohibited, data are not published for industries with few units or where one employer is a significant percentage of employment or wages of the industry, regardless of the total number of units. The impact of the confidentiality provision is normally felt only at the municipality level, although entire industries may be affected.

APPENDIX

Explanation of "Covered Employment"

The covered employment data illustrated in this report refer to the workers of employers subject to the New Jersey Unemployment Compensation Law. Basically, this includes employing units which in either the current or the preceding calendar year paid remuneration for employment in the amount of \$1,000.00 or more.

The term "employment" does not include the following:

- 1. Agricultural labor performed prior to January 1, 1978 or agricultural labor performed after December 31, 1977 in employing units not meeting specific remunerative or employment level requirements;
- 2. Domestic service performed in a private home prior to January 1,1978 or domestic service performed in a private home after December 31, 1977 where an employing unit paid cash remuneration of less than \$1,000.00 for such service in every quarter in the current or preceding calendar year;
- 3. Service performed by an individual in the employ of his/her son or daughter, or his/her father or mother;
- 4. Service performed in the employ of state hospitals or state institutions of higher learning prior to January 1, 1978;
- 5. Service performed in the employ of this State or any of its political divisions prior to January 1, 1978;
- 6. Service performed in the employ of any other states or their political subdivisions exempt from the Federal Unemploy ment Tax Act;
- 7. Service performed in the employ of the United States Government or of an instrumentality of the United States, unless the Congress of the United States permits coverage;

- 8. Services performed in the employ of fraternal beneficiary societies, orders or associations operating under the lodge system or for the exclusive benefit of the members of a fraternity itself operating under the lodge system and providing for the payment of life, sick, accident, or other benefits to the members of such society, order or association, or their dependents;
- 9. Services performed as a member of the board of directors, board of trustees, a board of managers, or a committee of any bank, building and loan, or savings and loan association, incorporated or organized under the laws of this State or the United States where such services do not constitute the principal employment of the individual;
- 10. Service with respect to which unemployment compensation is payable under an unemployment insurance program established by an act of Congress;
- 11. Service performed by agents of mutual fund brokers or dealers in the sale of mutual funds or other securities, by agents of insurance companies, exclusive of industrial insurance agents, or by agents of investment companies, if the compensation to such agents for such services is wholly on a commission basis;
- 12. Services performed by real estate salespersons or brokers who are compensated wholly on a commission basis;
- 13. Services performed in the employ of a veterans' organization chartered by an act of Congress or of any auxiliary thereof, no part of the net earnings of which organization, or auxiliary thereof, insures to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual:
- 14. Service performed for or in behalf of the owner or operator of any theater, ballroom, amusement hall or other place of entertainment, not in excess of 10 weeks in any calendar year for the same owner or operator, by any leader or musi cian of a band or orchestra, commonly called a "name band", entertainer, vaudeville artist, actor, actress, singer or other entertainers;
- 15. Services performed after January 1, 1973 by an individual for a labor union organization, known and recognized as a union local, as a member of a committee or committees reimbursed by the union local for time lost from regular em ployment, or as a part-time officer of a union local and the remuneration for such services is less than \$1,000.00 in a calendar year;

- 16. Services performed in a sale or distribution of merchandise by home-to-home salespersons or in-the-home demonstra tors whose remuneration consists wholly of commissions or commissions and bonuses;
- 17. Service performed in the employ of a foreign government, including service as a consular, nondiplomatic representative, or other officer or employee;
- 18. Service performed in the employ of an instrumentality wholly owned by a foreign government if a reciprocal exemption is granted by that government;
- 19. Service in the employ of an international organization entitled to enjoy the privileges, exemptions and immunities under the International Organization Immunities Act;
- 20. Service covered by an election duly approved by an agency charged with the administration of any other state or Federal Unemployment Compensation or Employment Security Law;
- 21. Service in a school, college, or university by a student or by the spouse of a student, if the spouse is advised that the employment is part of a program of financial aid for the student;
- 22. Service performed by an individual under the age of 22 enrolled at a nonprofit or public educational institution as part of a work-study program, if the institution certified the employee as a participant in the program;
- 23. Service performed in the employ of a hospital as a student nurse, or intern, or by a patient of the hospital;
- 24. Services performed in the employ of a church or convention of association of churches, or an organization operated primarily for religious purposes;
- 25. Services performed by a duly ordained, commissioned, or a licensed minister of a church in the exercise of his/her ministry or by a member of a religious order in the exercise of duties required by such order;
- 26. Service performed by an individual in the exercise of duties as an elected official, member of a legislative body, or a member of the Judiciary, of a state or political subdivision;

- 27. Service performed by an individual in the exercise of duties as a member of the State National Guard or Air National Guard, or as an employee serving on a temporary basis in case of fire, storm, snow, earthquake, flood or similar emer gency;
- 28. Service performed by an individual in the exercise of duties in a position which, under or pursuant to the laws of New Jersey, is designated as a major nontenure policymaking position;
- 29. Services performed by an individual receiving rehabilitation or remunerative work in a facility conducted for the pur pose of carrying out a program of rehabilitation;
- 30. Services performed by an individual receiving work-relief or work-training as part of an unemployment work-relief or work-training program;
- 31. Service performed by an inmate of a custodial or penal institution;
- 32. Service performed in the employ of a elementary or secondary school operating under a church charter.
