

The purpose of this report is to highlight the key demographic and economic trends in the county



Bergen County is the most populous county in New Jersey. Known for its diverse population, the county is one of the most densely populated in the state, with a mix of urban, suburban, and rural areas that contribute to varying population densities across its municipalities.



Bergen County has a diverse economy with strong sectors in healthcare, retail, manufacturing, and services. The presence of numerous corporate headquarters and businesses contributes significantly to the local economy. Its location provides economic advantages.




Bergen County has a diverse occupational landscape driven by a strong healthcare sector supporting major medical centers, along with significant retail employment needed for its prominent shopping centers. Other sectors further enhance the economy, offering varied occupational opportunities.






The QCEW program produces quarterly and annual data on the number of establishments, total employment, and wages for workers covered by New Jersey unemployment insurance (UI) laws, as well as federal employees under the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE) program. This data is published at various geographical and industry levels.


Unemployment Trend

The Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program produces monthly and annual employment, unemployment, and labor force data for Census regions and divisions, States, counties, metropolitan areas, and many cities, by place of residence.

Unemployment in Bergen County followed state trends however has been consistently lower than New Jersey's average.


The Current Employment Statistics (CES) program produces detailed industry estimates of nonfarm employment, hours, and earnings of workers on payrolls. CES National Estimates produces data for the nation, and CES State and Metro Area produces estimates for all 50 States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, and about 450 metropolitan areas and divisions.

In Bergen County, Health Care and Social Assistance has a higher employment share compared to state averages.



Between 2018 and 2024, Real Estate and Rental and Leasing saw the largest employment growth in Bergen County, increasing by 17.9%.



Transportation and Warehousing saw strong growth in New Jersey, expanding by 21.9% from 2018 to 2024.

The Occupational Employment and Wage Statistics (OEWS) program produces employment, and wage estimates annually for approximately 830 occupations. These estimates are available for the nation, for individual states, and for metropolitan and nonmetropolitan areas; national occupational estimates for specific industries are also available.

20.8% of Bergen County's total employment is concentrated in the top 10 occupations.



Lightcast collects raw data on postings from more than 160,000 online sources, then synthesizes and interprets those findings to provide meaningful insight in near real time. Job posting analytics can identify supply and demand for workers, skills, and jobs all over the world, as well as important contextual details like compensation trends.







To identify AI-related job postings, ORI-EDR compiled a curated list of 130 specific terms. A job listing is deemed AI-related if any of these terms appear in the skills section. A job listing is classified as AI-related if any of these terms are present in the skills section. This includes, but is not limited to, terms such as "AI/ML Inference," "Conversational AI," "Machine Learning Algorithms," "Supervised Learning," and "Deep Learning."

Limitations: One job posting does not necessarily equal one actual job opening. Some companies may post jobs to signal growth to investors or advertise positions in multiple states. Additionally, a decline in job postings doesn't always indicate reduced demand; it could simply mean that companies have already filled their positions and are no longer actively recruiting. 


