
Labor Market Spotlight

Halloween may be a spooky time of year, but its role in New Jersey's economy isn't scary at all. The state is home to 65 candy manufacturers that contributed \$77.8 million in total wages. In addition, cocoa beans are a major import commodity according to the South Jersey Port Corporation. In 2020, New Jersey's farmers harvested 1,300 acres of pumpkins, a seasonal favorite.

Halloween is a holiday for the young and young at heart; 21.5% of New Jersey's residents are under 18 making for a large pool of potential trick or treaters. Trick or treaters have plenty of places to stop with New Jersey's 3.5 million occupied housing units. Visiting multi-family housing units like apartments can maximize the efficiency of candy collection; 16.9% of the state's occupied housing units are in structures with 10 or more apartments. Of the counties, Hudson County has the largest share of multi-unit structures (42.1%). Depending on personal preference older homes can be charming or spooky; 17% of occupied housing units were built in 1939 or earlier.
