


A profile of New Jersey's Asian American, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander Residents

929,000 Asian American, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islanders (AANHPI)¹ live in New Jersey, accounting for 13% of all residents. Middlesex County has the largest share of the state's AANHPI residents (23.3%).



Middlesex has the largest AANHPI population (216,559; 25.2% of county population). The AANHPI population is greater than 10% in 5 other New Jersey counties: Somerset (19.9%), Bergen (17.1%), Hudson (15.9%), Mercer (12.5%), and Morris (10.5%).



AANHPI have a larger portion of typical working age population (age 25 to 64) when compared to the state overall (58.9% AANHPI vs. 53.0% NJ).

Approximately 68 percent of New Jersey's AANHPI residents are foreign-born. The majority are from India or of Indian descent. They are New Jersey's most highly educated racial group; 71% of the AANHPI population over the age of 25 achieved a bachelor's degree or higher compared to 41.5% of all residents 25 and older.
