

A Profile of New Jersey's Hispanic Residents

New Jersey - with a diverse population of 9.2 million residents - boasts 2 million Hispanics, 21.5% of the state's population. 


New Jersey's Hispanic population is diverse in its origins. Many of the state's Hispanic residents descend from Puerto Rico, Dominican Republic and Mexico; 40.2% of the population is foreign-born.

Among Hispanic residents, 1 in 5 (20%) holds a bachelor's degree or higher. This compares with 41.5% of all New Jersey residents aged 25 and older.
