

5 STEP GUIDE TO GET YOUR 1099-G



YOU WILL NEED A COPY OF YOUR FORM 1099-G TO FILE YOUR FEDERAL INCOME TAXES

Although the state of New Jersey does not tax Unemployment Insurance benefits, they are considered income and are subject to federal income taxes. The amount of benefits you receive in a given calendar year is reported to you on a Form 1099-G.

PREPARE

- Your **email address** and the **password** you created when applying for benefits
 - » *If you do not know your email address and/or password, see step 2 for instructions.*

1. VISIT THE WEBSITE

Go to myunemployment.nj.gov and click “Existing users log in here.”

3. CLICK "MY ACCOUNT & 1099," THEN "TAX FORMS"

This will bring you to the homepage to apply for unemployment benefits. Select the "My account & 1099" tab located on the top right of the screen and then click on "Tax forms" from the drop-down menu to access your 1099-G.

5. VIEW YOUR TAX FORMS

You will only see records for years you have a 1099-G tax form available for the current tax year and previous 4 years.

You can click on the record to display as a PDF. You can choose to print, download or email a PDF copy of the form selected using your internet browser's PDF viewing tool.

Tax forms

The 1099-G (Statement for Recipients of Certain Government Payments) reports the total taxable unemployment payments you received in a tax year starting with the first payment.

You don't need to send these forms to the IRS, they're submitted by NJ UI each tax season. Tax forms for the most recent year will be available by Jan 31.
