#### **OLD BUSINESS**

1. BRIAN QUILTY

Claimant appealed the decision of the Appeal Tribunal holding a disqualification of benefits for leaving work voluntarily, ineligible for benefits under availability for work, ineligible for Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) benefits as the claimant's unemployment was not due to one of the COVID-19 related reasons identified in the CARES Act and liability for non-fraud refund. MARCH 15, 2020 THROUGH MAY 9, 2020 AS THE CLAIMANT'S UNEMPLOYMENY WAS NOT DUE TO ONE OF THE COVID-19 RELATED REASONS IDENTIFIED IN THE C.A.R.E.S. ACT, ELIGIBLE FOR PANDEMIC UNEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE (PUA) BENEFITS FROM MAY 10, 2020 THROUGH JUNE 20, 2020, LIABLE TO REFUND

MAY 10, 2020 THROUGH JUNE 20, 2020, LIABLE TO REFUND THE SUM OF \$3,104.00 RECEIVED AS BENEFITS FOR THE WEEKS ENDING MARCH 21, 2020 THROUGH MAY 9, 2020, AND NOT LIABLE TO REFUND THE SUM OF \$2,328.00 RECEIVED AS BENEFITS FOR THE WEEKS ENDING MAY 16,

2020 THROUGH JUNE 20, 2020.
