### **PUBLIC EMPLOYEE SAFETY ALERT #9**

### **ADOPTION OF REVISED OSHA STANDARDS**

### **RESPIRATORY PROTECTION**

August 1998

This alert is to notify all public employers that the New Jersey Department of Labor, by authority of the Public Employees' Occupational Safety and Health Act, specifically 34:6A-30 (Adoption of Standards) requires that the Commissioner of Labor adopt all applicable federal occupational health and safety standards, amendments or changes adopted or recognized by the Secretary of Labor (federal) under the authority of the "Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970".

In accordance with this requirement, the New Jersey Department of Labor is planning to adopt by reference the revised federal Occupational Safety and Health Standard on respiratory protection 29 CFR 1910.134.

The revised standard requires that interior fire fighting procedures provide for at least two firefighters inside the structure. The two firefighters inside the structure must have direct visual or voice contact between each other and direct, voice or radio contact with the firefighters outside the structure. A minimum of two firefighters must be on standby outside the structure to provide assistance or perform rescue. This section is referred to as the "two in/two out" regulation.

Public employers are also required to provide a medical evaluation to determine the employees' ability to use a respirator, before the employee is fit tested or required to use a respirator in the workplace.

Please note that when adopting federal standards by reference the standard must be published in the New Jersey Register and will be duly adopted upon publication. In addition, the adopted federal standards are not subject to the formal rulemaking of N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5. This means that the standards are adopted without formal comment or public hearing.

We are, however, interested in hearing from you on how adoption of the standard will impact your organization. Your response will assist us in developing our enforcement procedures.
