## SUBJECT: ATTORNEY GENERAL LAW ENFORCEMENT DIRECTIVE NO. 2006-3: Notice to Replace Body Armor Vests Containing Zylon®

Attached is the Attorney General Law Enforcement Directive No. 2006-3 dated March 7, 2006, directing that all law enforcement agencies in New Jersey must replace all officer ballistic body armor containing the fiber Zylon®, effective immediately, and no later than December 31, 2006.

SUBJECT: Notice to Replace Body Armor Vests Containing Zylon®

As chief law enforcement officer in the State of New Jersey, the Attorney General is promulgating the following directive to all law enforcement agencies whose officers wear Zylon® based ballistic body armor.

Effective immediately, and no later than December 31, 2006, all law enforcement agencies in New Jersey must replace all officer ballistic body armor containing the fiber Zylon®.

Any body armor models that have been tested by the National Institute of Justice (NIJ) National Law Enforcement and Corrections Technology Center (NLECTC) and found to comply with the NIJ 2005 Interim Requirements for Bullet - Resistant Body Armor or NIJ standard 0115.00 Stab Resistance of Personal Body Armor may be used to replace Zylon® based body armor.
