SUBJECT: RESCISSION OF JANUARY 24, 2000 DIRECTIVE
(EXPIRED INSPECTION STICKERS)

On January 24, 2000, in response to difficulties experienced by New Jersey car owners in complying with State law regarding the inspection of their motor vehicles, and at the request of Governor Christine Todd Whitman, I issued a Directive that all State, county and municipal law enforcement agencies implement procedures to accommodate the motoring public during the implementation of the State's new automobile inspection system.

In the intervening period, the State's new automobile inspection system has made improvements such that the continuation of the January 24, 2000 Directive is no longer required. Moreover, the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles is no longer issuing inspection extensions to registered owners of vehicles. Those extensions which were issued will continue to be valid through their expiration date, which will be no later than December 31, 2000.

Accordingly, and effective this date, I hereby RESCIND the January 24, 2000, Directive, entitled "Expired Inspection Stickers." Henceforth, all State, county and municipal law enforcement officers shall resume enforcement of the applicable statutes and regulations pertaining to the registration and inspection of motor vehicles.
