(a) – (b) (No change.)

(c) A winning progressive payout wager shall be paid irrespective of the outcome of the player’s pai gow poker wager, and shall be paid in accordance with one of the following pay tables pre-selected by the casino licensee:

(d) **Alternatively to [T]the progressive payout[s for pay table D in (c) above shall be governed by three separate progressive meters (“mega progressive meter,” “major progressive meter” and “minor progressive meter”), each of which corresponds to the payout for a specific hand type. The rate of progression for the progressive meters combined or, if applicable, the reset meters and progressive meters combined, shall be no less than 28 percent. In addition, the minimum rates of progression for each of the meters shall be as follows] wagers with payouts prescribed in the Paytables A, B, and C in N.J.A.C. 13:69F-11.14A(c), a casino licensee may elect to offer a progressive payout wager, the outcome of which is based on the best five-card hand dealt to the player or the best seven-card hand for a Mega Progressive Meter payout:**

- i. [16 percent for the mega progressive meter,]**The payouts for the progressive wager authorized by this subsection are set forth in payable D in N.J.A.C. 13:69F-11.14A(c).**
- ii. [8 percent for the major progressive meter, and] **The progressive payouts for the progressive wager authorized by this subsection shall be governed by three separate progressive meters (“mega progressive meter,” “major progressive meter,” and “minor progressive meter”), each of which corresponds to the payout for a specific hand type.**

iii. [4 percent for the minor progressive meter] **The rate of progression for the progressive meters combined, or, if applicable, the reset meters and progressive combined, shall be no less than 28 percent.**

(e) The following rules shall govern the implementation of the progressive payout wager:

6. The initial and reset amount shall be established by each casino licensee and approved pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:69D-1.39B.
