NEW LSRPS NEEDED HELP SHAPE THE FUTURE OF SITE REMEDIATION

For several years, the number of Licensed Site Remediation Professionals has remained steady at around 700. However, as many experienced LSRPs approach retirement and prepare to enjoy their well-earned rest, it is essential that we begin to cultivate the next generation of professionals.

You can make a meaningful impact by mentoring early-career site remediation professionals—sharing your knowledge, enthusiasm, and the many rewards of this vital field. By guiding them toward licensure, you help ensure the continued strength and integrity of our profession.

Mentorship is not only a way to give back, but also an investment in the future of environmental stewardship.

TIMEFRAME NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENT COMPLIANCE REMINDER

The Board has identified, through recent audits, that many LSRPs are not fulfilling their obligation to notify clients—and, where applicable, the NJDEP—when regulatory or mandatory timeframes are at risk of being missed. This requirement is clearly outlined in N.J.A.C. 7:26I-6.8(b) and (c):

- Subsection (b): LSRPs must notify the person responsible for conducting the remediation in writing when, in their professional judgment, any applicable regulatory timeframe is unlikely to be met.
- Subsection (c): LSRPs must notify both the person responsible for conducting remediation and the NJDEP in writing when, in their professional judgement, any mandatory or expedited site-specific timeframe is unlikely to be met.

No Exceptions!

The Board reminds all LSRPs that this is a mandatory professional obligation. Claims that sites are exempt from timeframes due to Spill Act Exemptions are not valid unless the [Spill Act Exemption Form](#) is filed.

Similarly, claims that clients have requested these notifications not be made are not acceptable and do not relieve the LSRP of their legal responsibilities. LSRPs are required to act in accordance with Board rules and exercise independent professional judgment, regardless of client preferences.

IMPORTANT REMINDER: LSRP ANNUAL LICENSE FEES ARE DUE FRIDAY, JANUARY 16, 2026

By the time you receive this newsletter you should have been notified that your 2026 annual license fee is now due. If you haven't already done so, please ensure your payment is submitted no later than January 16, 2026.

Important Notes:

- **All payments must be made online.** If you are unable to pay online, please contact the Board for alternative payment instructions.
- License renewal fees will not be generated until the annual license fee is paid.
- License renewal applications will not be processed until the renewal fee is submitted.

If your license is up for renewal, it is essential that you pay the annual license fee by Friday, January 16, 2026 to avoid delays in processing and to ensure your license remains active.
