THE NATIONAL GUARD TRAINING CENTER CRITICAL COMMAND INFORMATION REQUIREMENTS (CCIR)

- 1. **Purpose.** To identify the Superintendent's CCIRs and prescribe responsibilities and process for reporting serious incidents and critical information at the National Guard Training Center.
- 2. **Applicability.** This policy establishes serious incident reporting (SIR) and CCIR procedures for all state and federal leaders assigned to the National Guard Training Center. The Superintendent will ensure that all SIRs/CCIRs are processed in accordance with higher headquarters guidance.
- 3. **Reporting Criteria.** The safety and security of the installation as well as staff, tenants, users, and visitors is top of mind. There will be two categories that drive the timing and method of reporting: wake-up reporting and non-urgent reporting.
- a. Wake-Up Reporting Criteria: These incidents will be reported by phone or in person to me immediately as indicated in Appendix 1.
- b. Non-Urgent Reporting Criteria: These incidents will be reported via email at the time of discovery outside of duty hours or by phone to me or Base Operations during normal duty hours (Monday Friday, 0800 1630) as indicated in Appendix 1.
- 4. **Processing.** In the event of other serious incidents not addressed in this policy, contact me for guidance. Should you believe the incident or issue is time sensitive, contact me directly. When in doubt, call. Submission of a SIR/CCIR will not be delayed due to incomplete information. All information known at the time of SIR/CCIR submission will be included. Additional required information will be provided in a subsequent corrected or add-on report.

a. Incident Reporting

(1) Death or serious injury involving loss of life, limb, or sight to any personnel, tenant, or user residing on or off the installation.

- (2) Any sexual assault reported by any personnel, tenant, user, or visitor.
- (3) Any major crisis resulting in disruption to installation operations, electrical outage, loss of water, sewage, heating, communications, or cooling capabilities that effect quality of life or damage/destruction to installation property.
 - (4) Imminent or forecasted natural or man-made disaster impacting the installation.
- (5) Any incidents occurring within the Youth Challenge Academy program or facility that include: death/injury to a child/youth sustained in the program or facility resulting in admission to a hospital, surgery, or which prevents/precludes the child/youth from participating in the Youth Challenge Academy program for more than three (3) days. Any child abuse or neglect allegation of any person working or volunteering with the Youth Challenge Academy, even if the allegation did not involve a minor enrolled in the program. If the allegation is substantiated/founded, an updated CCIR is required. Revocation or deferment of accreditation. Actual or alleged incident of child abuse or neglect that takes place on the installation or through an installation-sponsored activity.
- (6) Environmental incidents or actions that shut down operations or training due to spills, range fires, legal suits, or administrative order. Any environmental incident requiring immediate notification of the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs Environmental Management Bureau.
- (7) Incidents involving Unmanned Aircraft (UA) and Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) operating in the vicinity of the installation.
- (8) Confirmed or suspected exposure of classified information. The compromise, suspected compromise, loss, or theft of Personally Identifiable Information (PII).
- (9) Incident or alleged incident of misconduct by installation personnel to include fraud, waste, abuse, and corruption.
- (10) Emerging public affairs issues on or off the installation that effects operations and the ability of the National Guard Training Center to execute its mission.
- (11) Theft, suspected theft, attempted theft, loss, or unaccounted arms, ammunition, and/or explosives.
- (12) Failure of an installation utility or service that creates a life threatening condition or negatively impacts mission critical operations.
- (13) Any military unit activation/deployment/re-deployment activity on the installation that requires assets, resources or support.
